

## Missouri Statewide

Survey of Likely General Election Voters

#### Methodology

This probabilistic live telephone survey was conducted October 26 - 27, 2018, with 501 likely general election voters. It has a margin of error of  $\pm 4.38\%$ . Interviews were conducted by live professional agents calling landline and cell phones. Landline phone interviews constitute 60.2% of the sample, while 39.8% were conducted by cell phone, each based on the voter file for the state. This survey was weighted to a likely general election voter universe.













#### Conclusions

- 1. Voter enthusiasm is high. Nearly three-fourths of those surveyed (73%) rated their interest in the election as either a 9 or a 10.
- 2. Republicans lead the generic ballot 51%-45% (net R+6), outperforming the national average (D+8) by 14 points.
- Both McCaskill (net +4 fav) and Hawley (net +2 fav) have embattled favorability among likely general election voters.
- 4. Hawley has a net -33 favorability with Independents while McCaskill has a net +22.
- 5. Hawley leads McCaskill (49%-46%) on the US Senate Ballot, but his advantage is within the margin of error.
- 6. Though his favorability is evenly split, Trump does not appear to have an overly harmful effect on local Republican candidates, as 58% said they would vote for Republicans either because of or despite their dislike of the president. Only 30% of the vote is an anger or protest vote.



#### Conclusions (cont.)

- 1. Hawley's low net favorability is weighing him down on the ballot test. He may hold a lead over McCaskill, but he's underperforming the generic ballot. This is a difficult challenge to overcome a week before the election.
- 2. Trump is a polarizing figure on the ballot test, yet he's well-liked among Hawley's base. Hawley needs to take advantage of Trump's positive influence moving down the stretch by reaching out directly to Trump supporters to ensure they turn out to vote.
- Both parties are retaining their supporters, though Independents are breaking for McCaskill.
- 4. With so few undecideds left (3%), this race could largely be determined on which side does a better job of getting their core supporters to the polls. As of now, 80% of both Hawley's and McCaskill's supporters say they are definitely voting. They are also evenly split with supporters who are probably voting (Hawley 12%, McCaskill 13%).
- 5. A higher turnout is favorable to Hawley.
