Indiana Statewide Survey of Likely General Election Voters

Methodology

This probabilistic live telephone survey was conducted October 26-27, 2018, with 505 likely general election voters. It has a margin of error of $\pm 4.36\%$. Interviews were conducted by live professional agents calling landline and cell phones. Landline phone interviews constitute 63% of the sample, while 37% were conducted by cell phone, each based on the voter file for the state. This survey was weighted to a likely general election voter universe.




Geo Groupings – Based on Congressional District







Conclusions

1. Voter intensity is strong, with 19% of voters having already voted and another 71% saying they will definitely vote.
2. Republicans hold a roughly 7-point advantage on the generic ballot (52%-45%), outperforming the national generic ballot (D+7.6) by over 14 points.
3. Voters in Congressional Districts 1 & 4 favor Democrats, while all other districts favor Republicans.
4. Braun leads (49%-46%), but his advantage is within the margin of error.
5. Braun's image is positive, but under 50% Fav (47%). His name ID is high (92%), and his net favorability stands at a net +7.5. His unfavorability is 39%. When drilling down to intensity, his fav/unfav ratio is only +3 (28% very fav / 25% very unfav).
6. Donnelly's image is stronger, with name ID reaching 99% and a net favorability of +11. When drilling down to intensity, however, his net favorability is upside down (26% very fav / 27% very unfav).



Conclusions (cont.)

1. Braun's lower net favorability is weighing him down on the ballot test. He may hold a lead over Donnelly, but he's underperforming the generic ballot.
2. Because Trump supporters are more likely to vote for Republican candidates than those who do not support the president are to vote for Democratic candidates, Braun needs to reach out directly to Trump supporters to ensure they turn out to vote.
3. Both parties are retaining their supporters, though Independents are breaking for Donnelly by 7 points.
4. Congressional Districts 3 and 7 could be key, as voters there favor generic Republicans but are currently breaking for Donnelly, underperforming by 6 and 20 points, respectively.
5. With only 2% undecided, this race could largely be determined on which side does a better job of turn outing core supporters.
6. A higher turnout is favorable to Donnelly.
