

Ohio StatewideSurvey of Likely General Election Voters

Methodology

This probabilistic live telephone survey was conducted October 30 – October 31, 2018, with 503 likely general election voters. It has a margin of error of ±4.37%. Interviews were conducted by live professional agents calling landline and cell phones. Landline phone interviews constitute 58% of the sample, while 42% were conducted by cell phone, each based on the voter file for the state. This survey was weighted to a likely general election voter universe.







Conclusions

- Of those surveyed 65% rated their interest in the election as either a 9 or a 10. This is considerably lower than other states surveyed recently. 69% of those over 50 and 58% of those under 50 fell into the high interest range.
- 45% of Ohio voters have a favorable opinion of President Trump, versus 51% with an unfavorable opinion (net -6). This is still better than the national average of net -11.
- Men have a net +5 favorable opinion of the president. Women have a net unfavorable opinion of him of -15.
- Republican senate candidate Renacci has a net -7 unfavorability (35%-28%). 37% have either no opinion of or have never heard of him.
- Democratic senate candidate Brown has a net favorability of +22 (53%-31%). 17% have either no opinion of or have never heard of Brown
- Republican gubernatorial candidate DeWine has a net -4 unfavorability (41%-45%).
- Democratic gubernatorial candidate Cordray has a net favorability of +14 (45%-31%)



Conclusions (cont.)

- The race for governor is extremely tight, with DeWine at 43.4% and Cordray at 43.2%. 5% of voters prefer a third-party candidate and 9% are undecided.
- DeWine retains 91% of Republican voters, while Cordray retains 88% of Democratic voters.
- Independents break for Cordray 44%-32%.
- Men prefer DeWine 46%-43%. Women prefer Cordray 44%-42%.
- Voters under 50 break for DeWine 43%-38%, while voters over 50 favor Cordray 46%-44%.
- High-propensity voters break for DeWine by 1 point (46%-45%), medium-propensity voters are effectively tied (41.4% DeWine, 41.3% Cordray), and low-propensity voters prefer DeWine by 7 points (44%-37%).



Conclusions (cont.)

- The race for senate is a different story, with Brown at 52% and Renacci at 42%. 6% of voters are undecided.
- Brown retains 97% of Democratic voters versus Renacci retaining 88% of Republican voters. Independents break for Brown 56%-34%.
- 84% of voters with a favorable opinion of President Trump support Renacci, while 90% of voters with an unfavorable opinion of President Trump support Brown.
- Republican Yost leads in the Attorney General's race 46%-43%.
- Of those voters who have already voted, 51% support Dettelbach and 41% Yost. Of those Definitely Voting, 49% prefer Yost and 39% prefer Dettelbach.
- Men prefer Yost over Dettelbach 49%-40%. Women are closely split, 45% favoring Dettelbach and 43% favoring Yost.



Conclusions (cont.)

- 43% of moderates and 67% of liberals say they will vote against local Republicans to send a message to the president.
- 85% of Cordray supporters (gubernatorial ballot), 94% of Brown supporters (US Senate ballot), and 88% of Dettelbach supporters (attorney general ballot) say they will vote against local Republicans to send a message to the president.
- 87% of DeWine supporters (gubernatorial ballot), 88% of Renacci supporters (US Senate ballot), and 89% of Yost supporters say they will vote for local Republicans because of their support for the president.
