### METHODOLOGY

This probabilistic survey was conducted June 16 – 17, 2022, with 535 likely general election voters. It has a margin of error of  $\pm 4.18\%$ . Known registered voters were interviewed via live calls, and SMS. This survey was weighted to a likely general election voter universe.
