


2. Generally speaking, would you say things in Michigan are headed in the right direction or off on the wrong track?







Generic Congressional Ballot

3. If the elections were held today, and you had to make a choice, would you vote for the Republican or Democratic candidate for U.S. Congress?




4 – 7. Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of?









METHODOLOGY

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Statewide training data collection was conducted October 23 - 27, 2022, with 1822 likely general election voters. Known registered voters were interviewed via online panel, IVR, and SMS. These estimates were created by applying multilevel regression with poststratification for modeling.
