Survey of Likely 204 GOP Primary Voters **Republican Nomination for President**

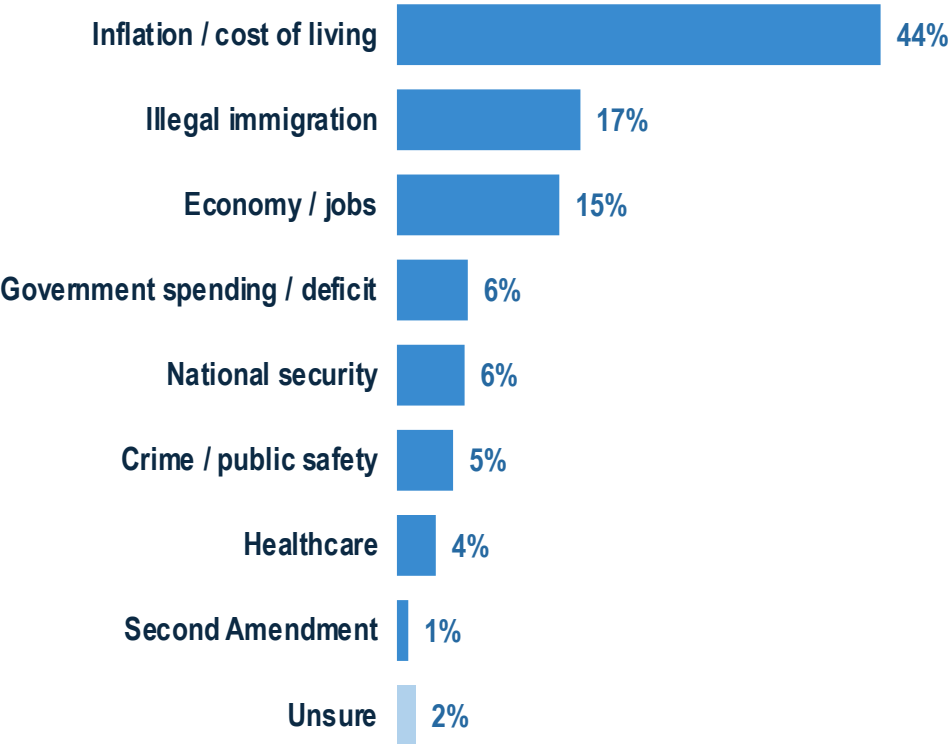

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TOP PRIORITY

Republican primary voters for the next presidential nomination in 2024 are overwhelmingly concerned with inflation. When combined with economy / jobs, **59% of Republicans are focused on pocketbook issues**. Immigration peaks with voters age 65+ but still falls far short of inflation.

ISSUES – NATIONAL SECURITY

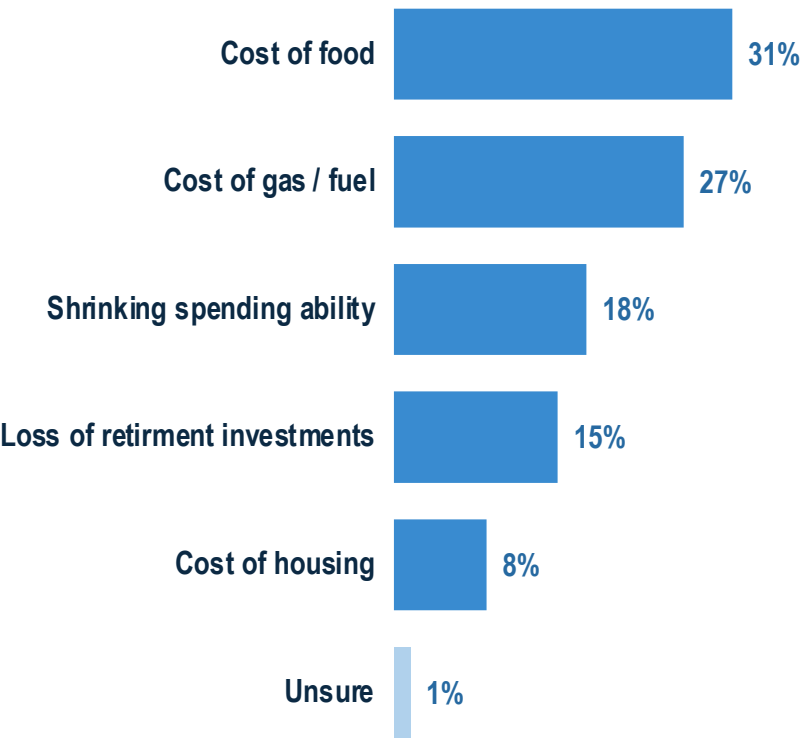

ISSUES – INFLATION / COST OF LIVING

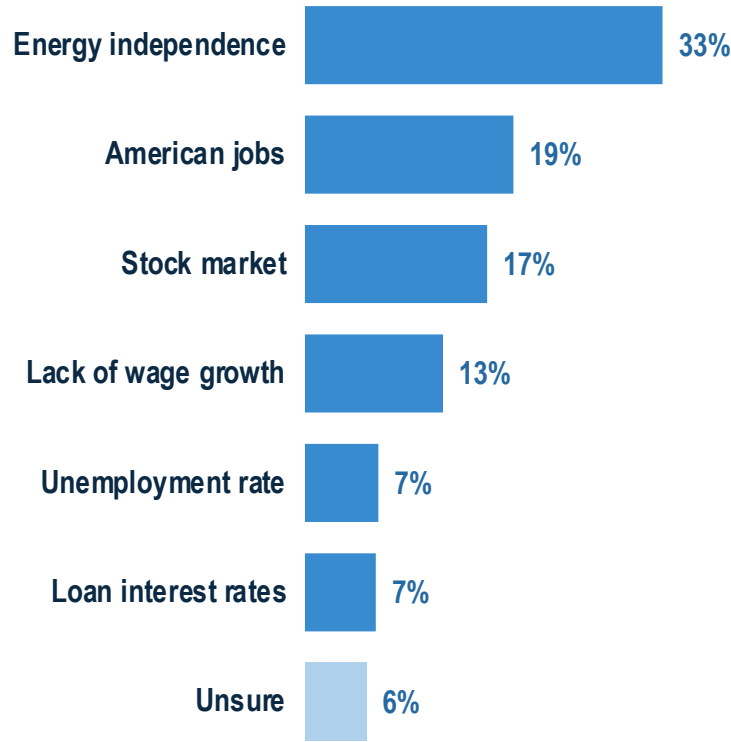
Cost of **food** matters more to **female** Republican primary voters while **male** Republican primary voters are more concerned with the cost of **gas / fuel**. The cost of food is a much larger concern to those making less than \$75k/yr than those making more.

ISSUES – ECONOMY / JOB

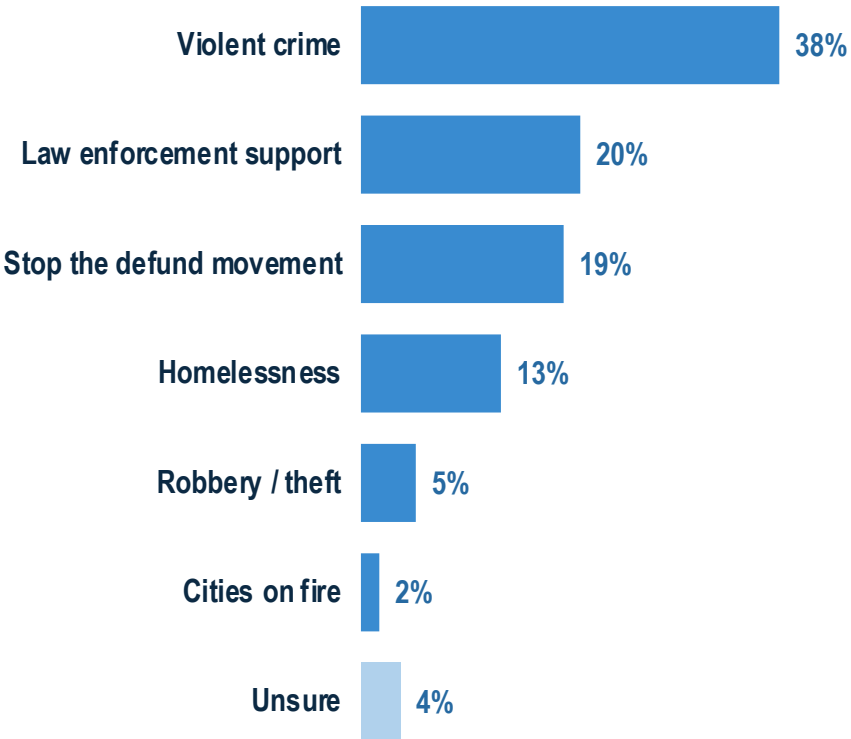

ISSUES – CRIME / PUBLIC SAFETY

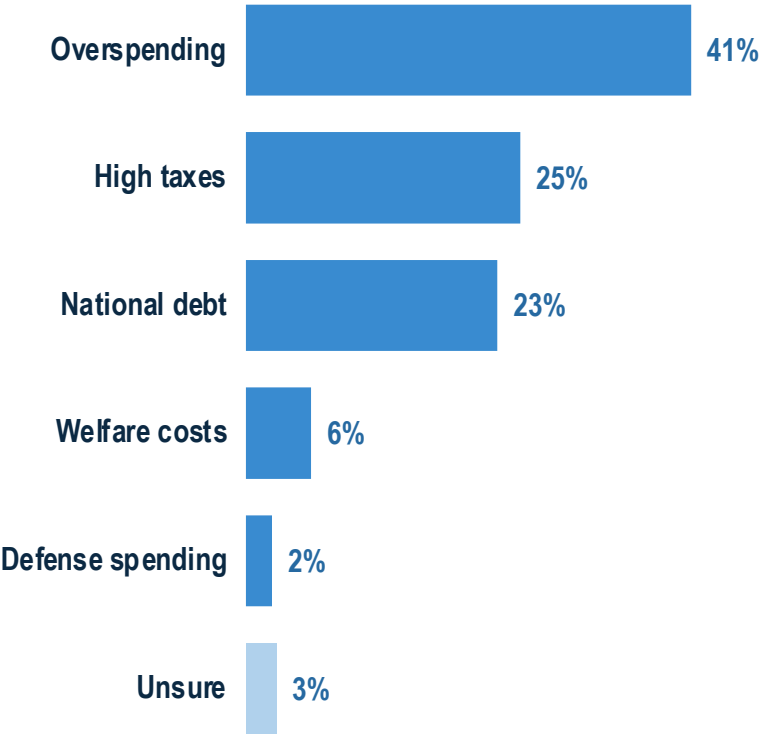
As Republican prioritize crime as a general election message for the second cycle in a row, violent crime is the top crime / public safety issue for Republican primary voters. It reaches the **highest concern with women, especially senior women**. Defund comes in third and is more an issue with men than women.

ISSUES – GOVERNMENT SPENDING / DEBT

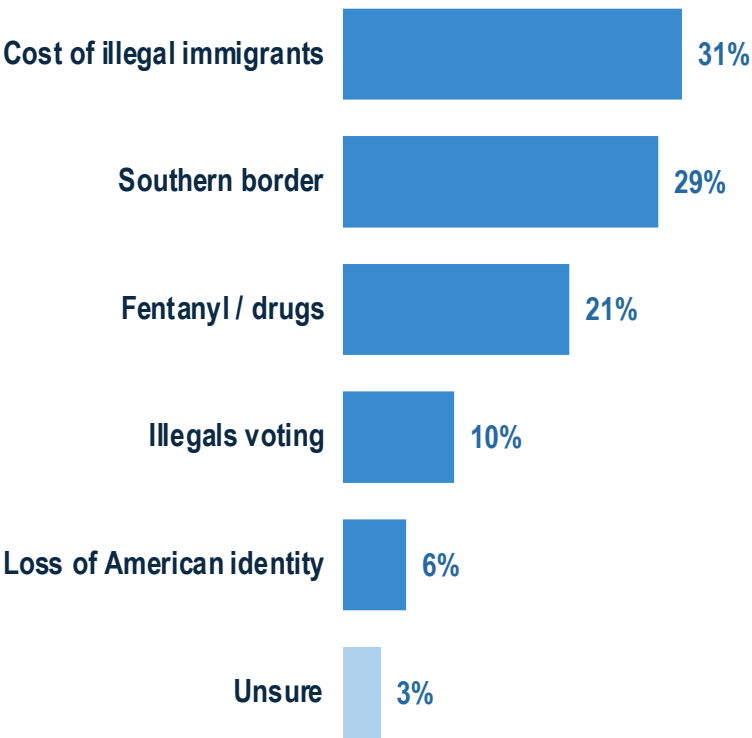
Most Republican primary voters are concerned with government overspending, especially older primary voters. **Younger voters** see more an issue with **high taxes**.

ISSUES – ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION

While the Southern border and the wall gets all the attention, Republican primary voters are much more nuanced on the issue and effects of illegal immigration. **Younger** primary voters are concerned about **fentanyl / drugs** while **older** voters are more focused on the **cost** of illegal immigrants, especially **women**. **College-educated** voters are more worried about the Southern **border**.

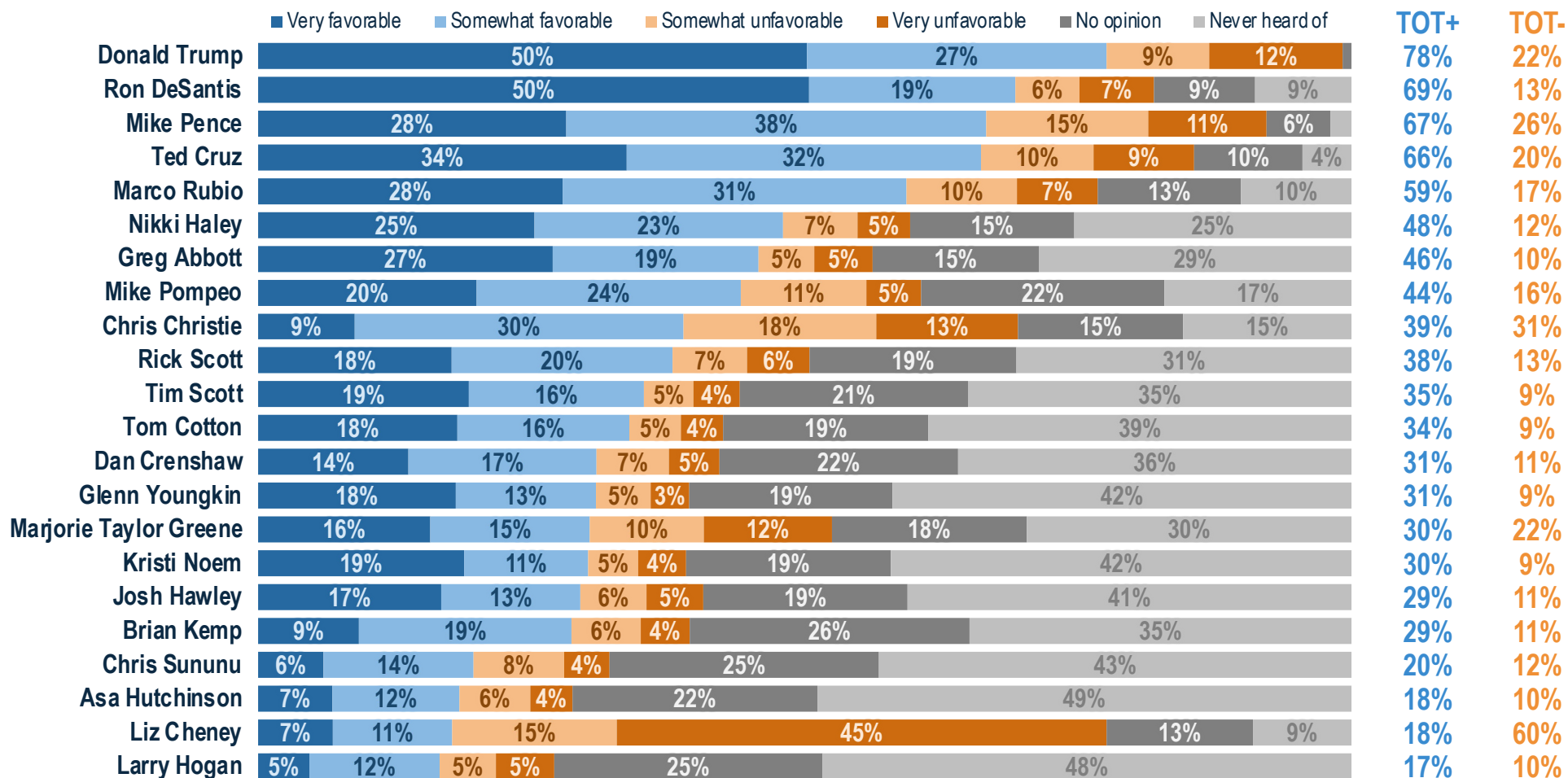

CANDIDATES POPULARITY

Former President Donald **Trump** has the **highest favorables** with Republican primary voters. DeSantis, Pence, and Cruz are close behind in image. **Republican governors** are scattered among U.S. Senators for total name ID. Liz **Cheney** has the **highest unfavorables** by far at 60% with Chris **Christie** having the **second worst** favorables (31%).



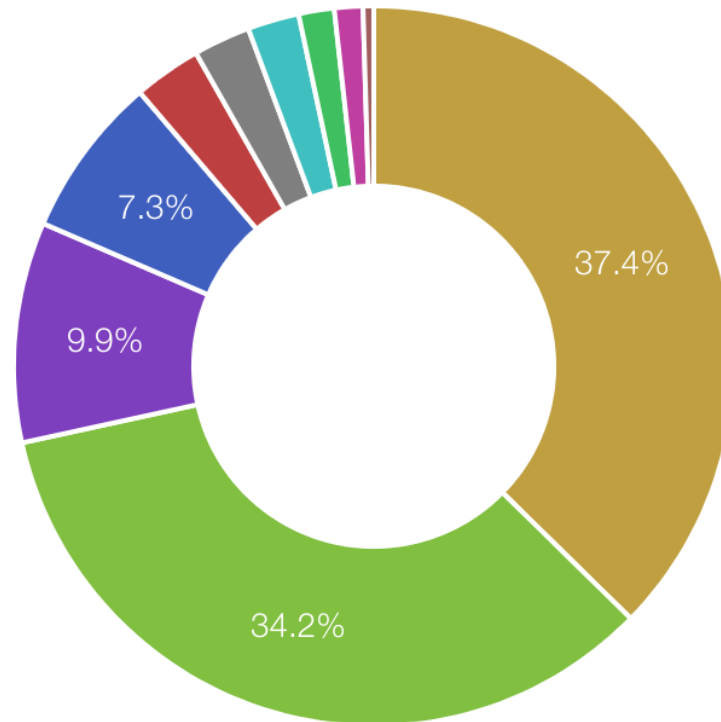

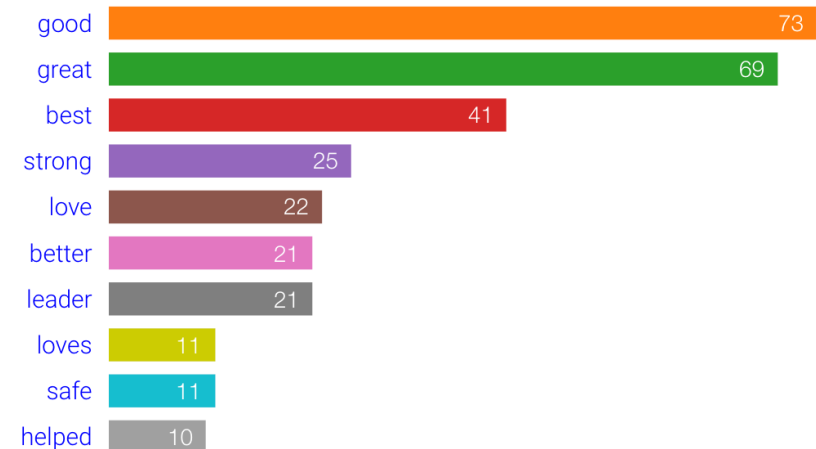

Voters who selected Trump on the ballot do so because he engenders feelings of **trust and joy**, the two **most important emotions for determining support** of an individual candidate. Trump voters feel understood by Trump in a way that most GOP Candidates are incapable of doing. Those who **didn't vote for Trump in 2020 feel a bit more anger** towards the former president, but their overall sentiment is positive

"He's sincere about helping the people."

"His record as a leader was unquestionable amid the leftist media onslaught of daily slander and defamation he endured, yet he still accomplished more than all Democrats combined since 2007. All the Democrats did was spend \$20,000,000,000,000 of your and my tax dollars for their pensions."

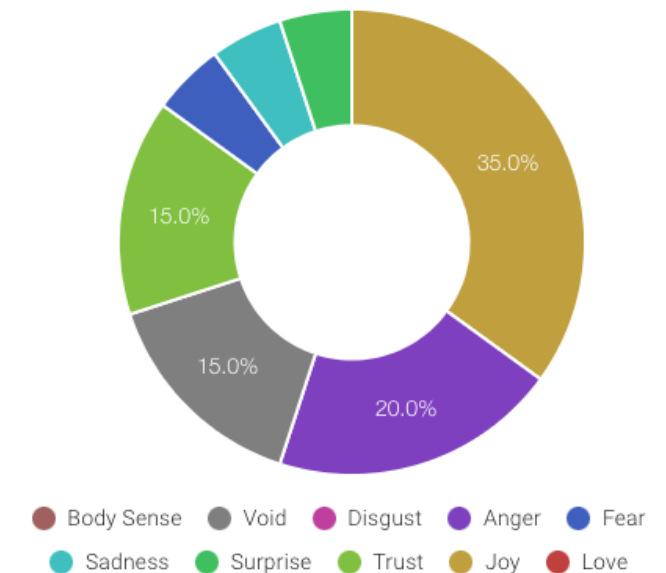
"I like Donald Trump, mainly because he has done for our country. I also love that he is not afraid to stand up for what he believes."

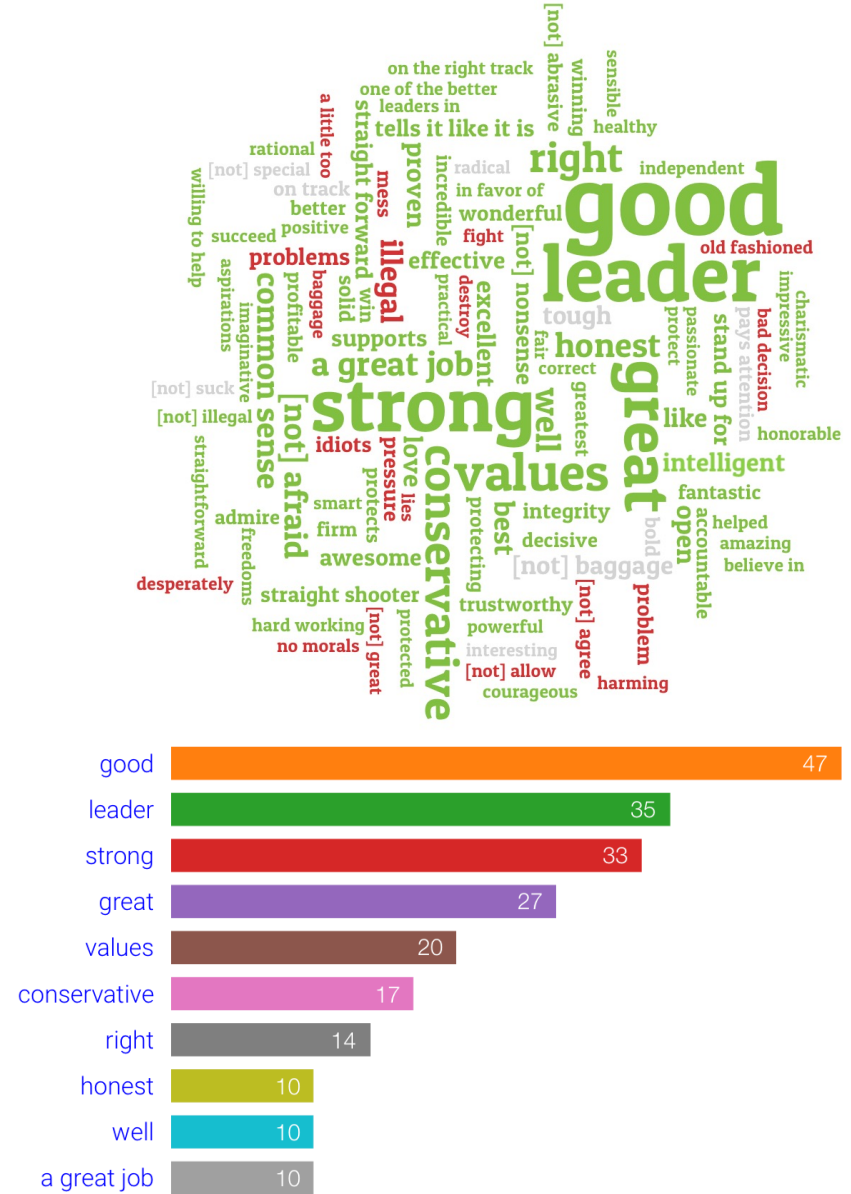
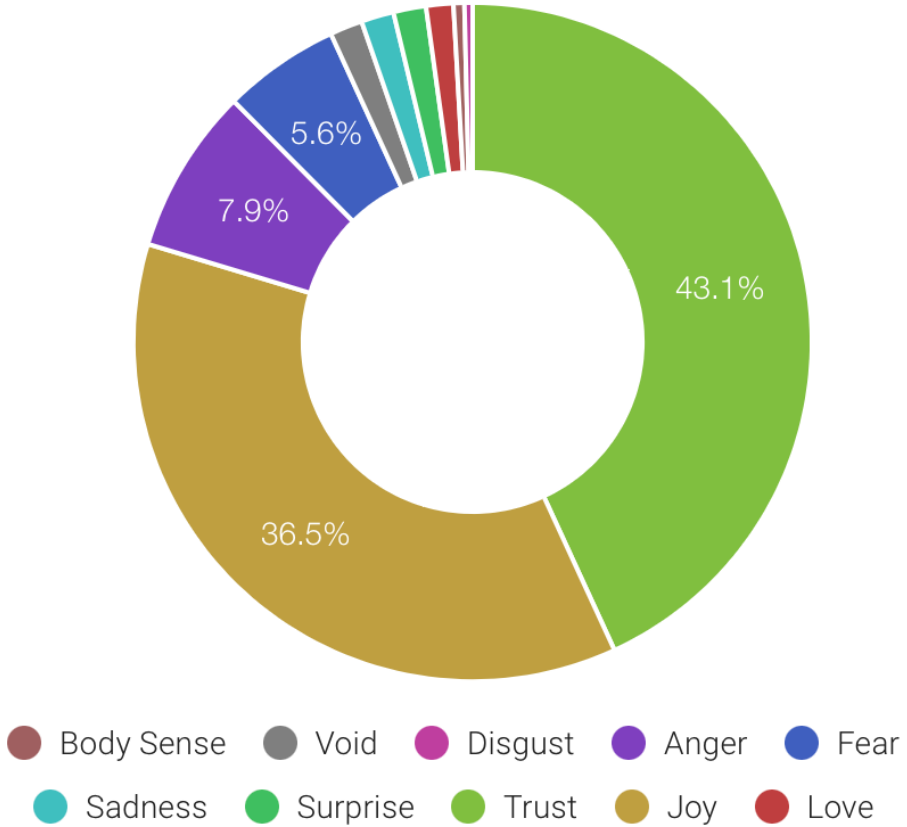
Primary Emotions Breakdown

Voters who selected DeSantis feel similarly about the Florida Governor as Trump voters feel about the former president, except **DeSantis engenders slightly more trust** than Trump. His supporters see many of the same qualities but see DeSantis as more palatable for moderate voters in the party.

“The man has strong leadership and principles. He seems to be the most electable for moderates and independent voters.”

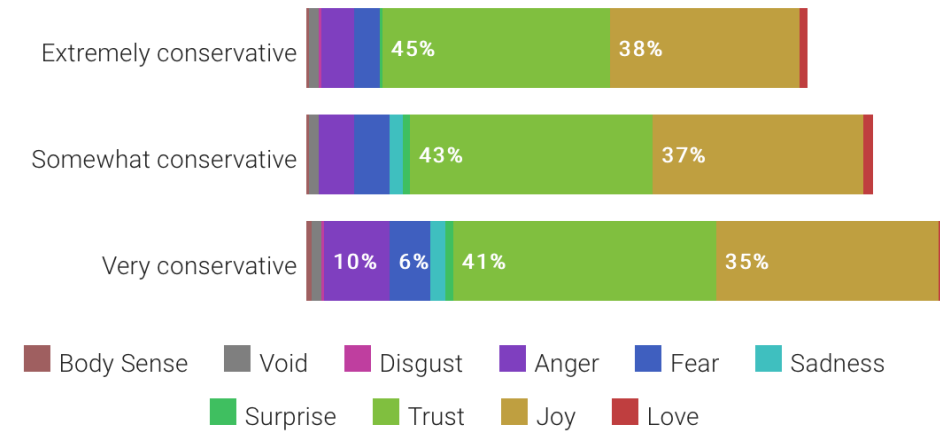

“He’s a rational Republican who can be elected.”

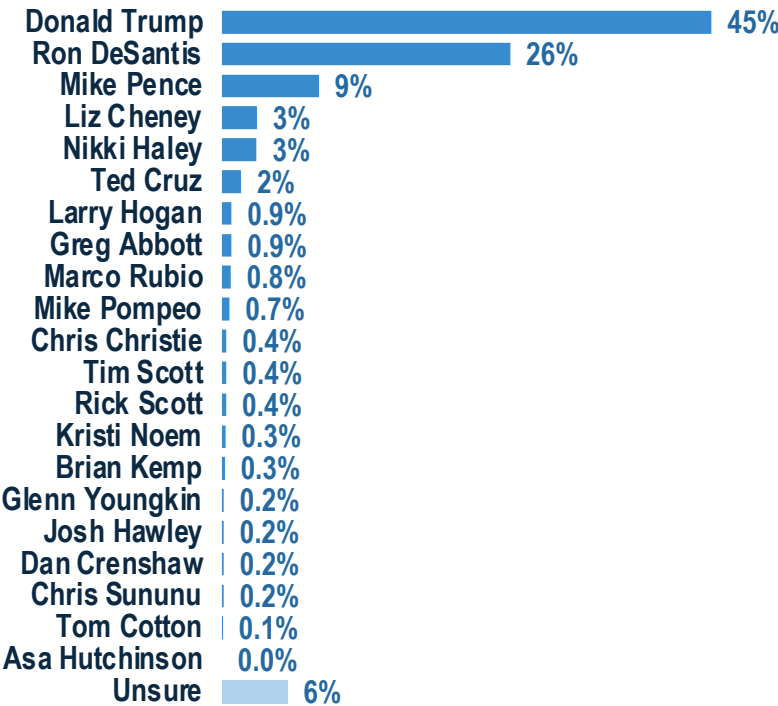

PRIMARY ELECTION – PREFERRED CANDIDATE WITH DONALD TRUMP

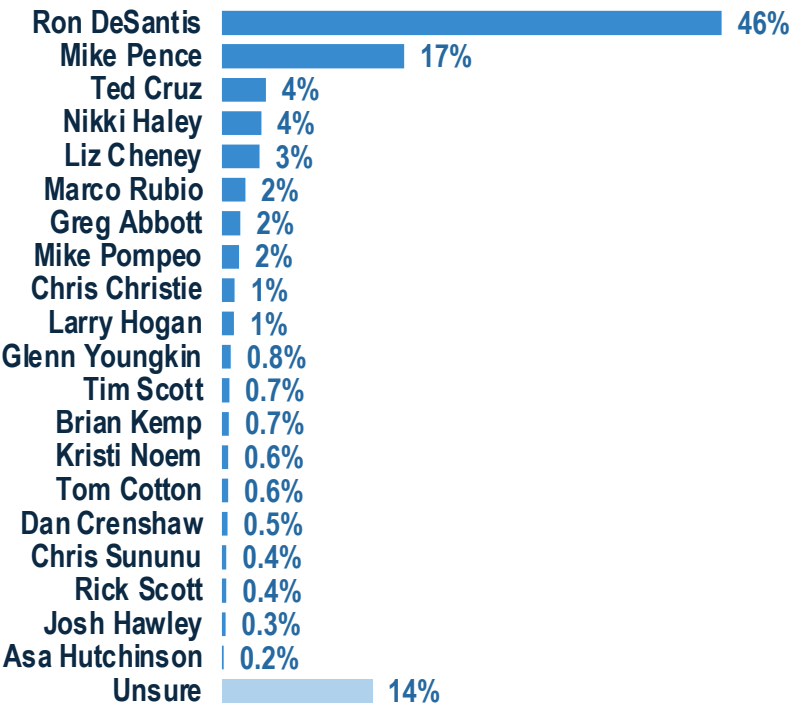

Seniors are closely split between Trump and DeSantis. **Trump** is **strongest** with with the **most conservative** primary voters.

PRIMARY ELECTION – PREFERRED CANDIDATE WITHOUT DONALD TRUMP

If Trump does not run in 2024, DeSantis takes the lead – mostly driven by more educated voters – and Pence nearly doubles his share. The **governors** each receive about **1%** of the vote in this scenario.



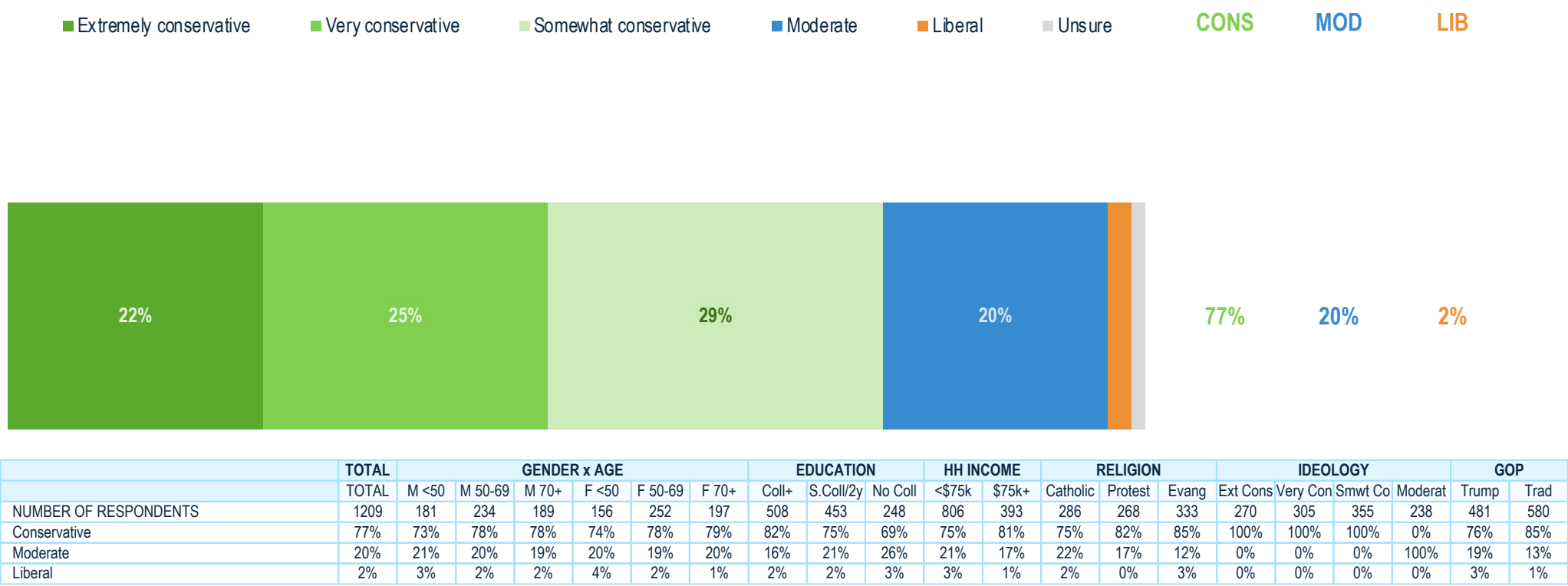

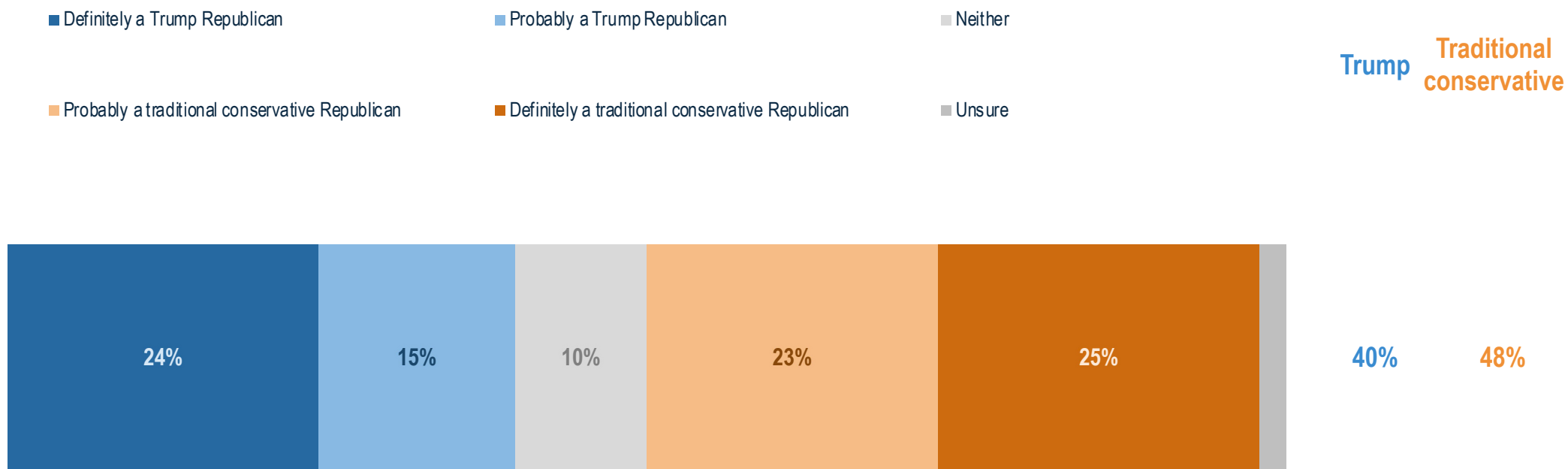
The **older** someone is or the more **educated** they are, the more likely they are to be **conservative**.

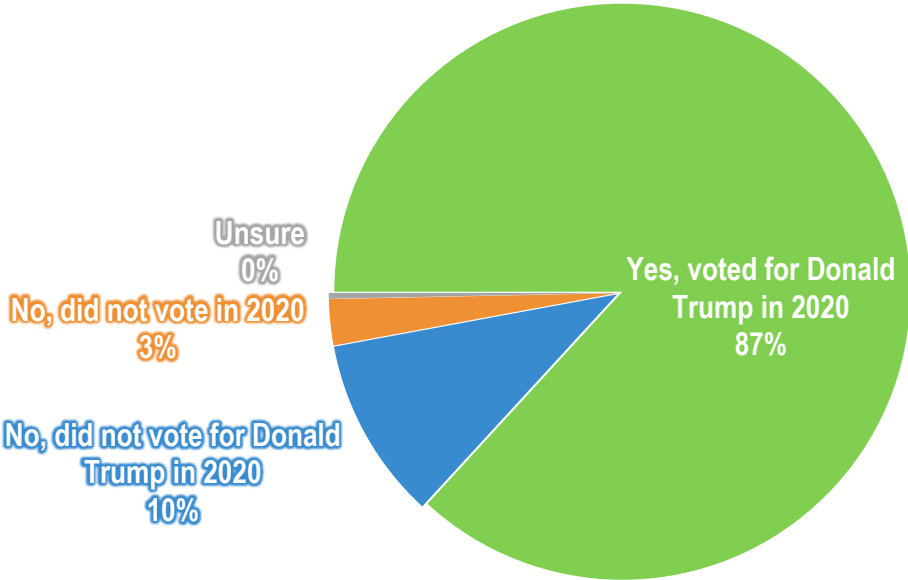
