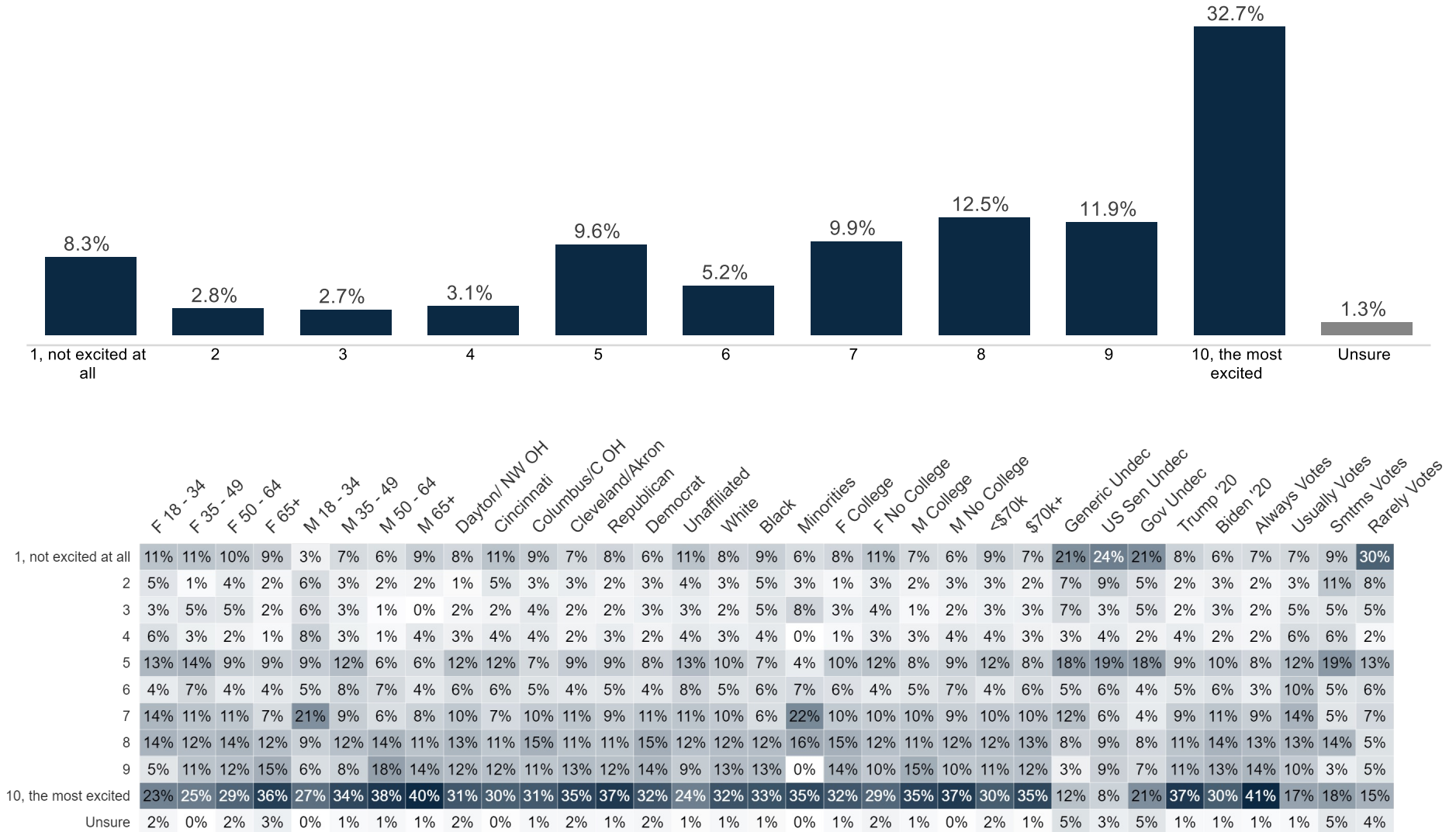

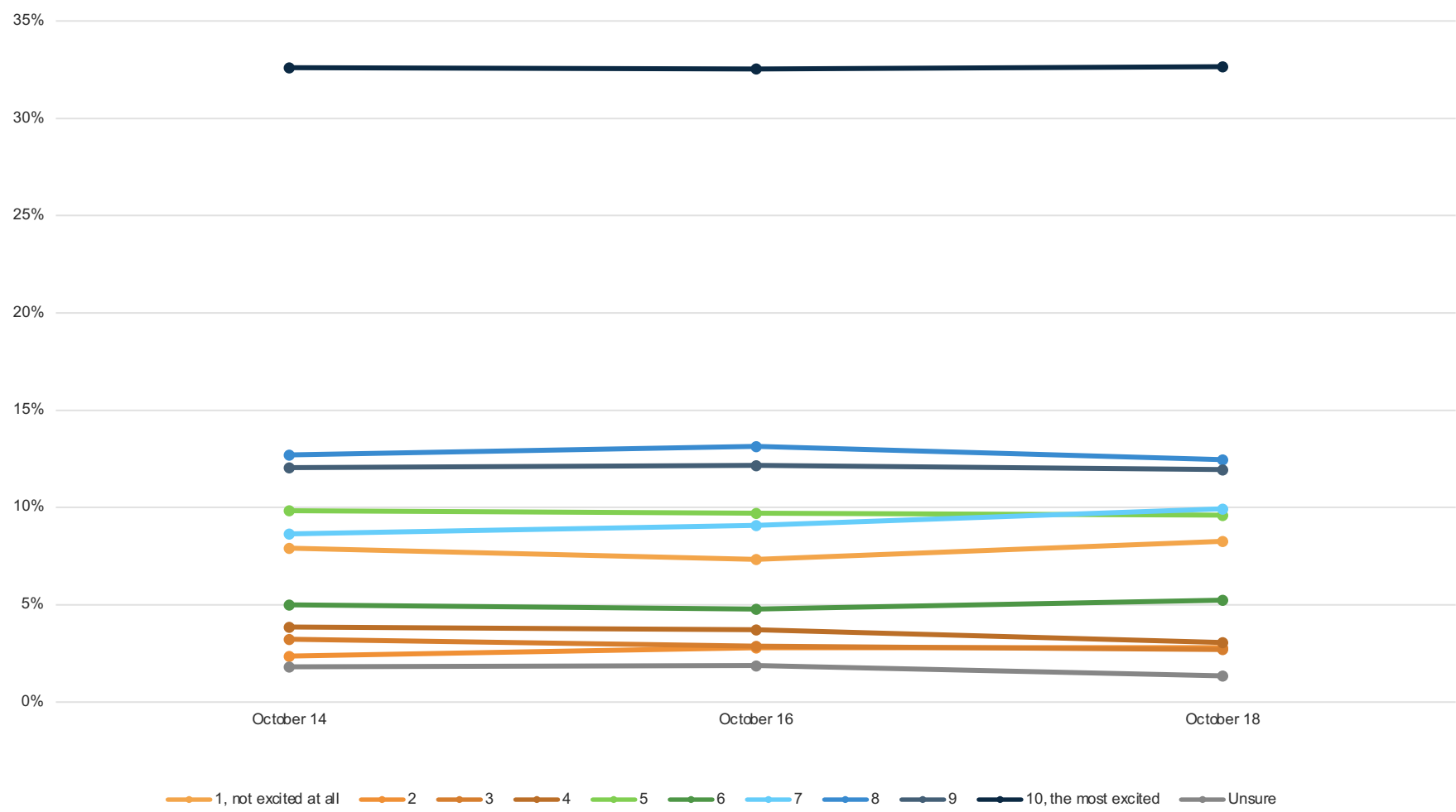

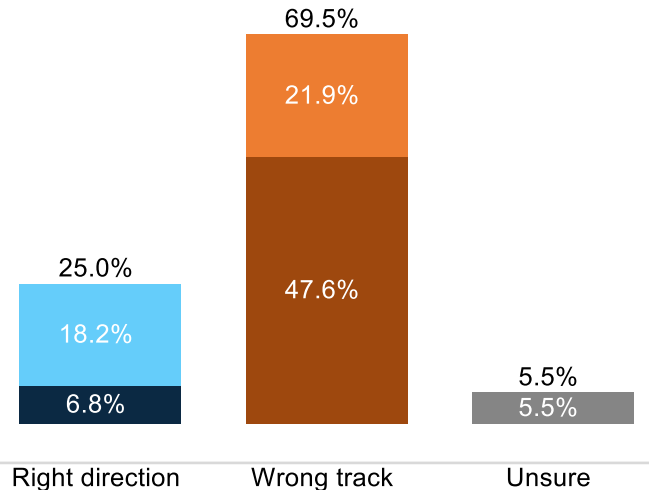
How excited are you to vote in the November general election for Governor, Congress, and state legislature on a scale of 1 to 10, with 1 being not excited at all and 10 being very excited?

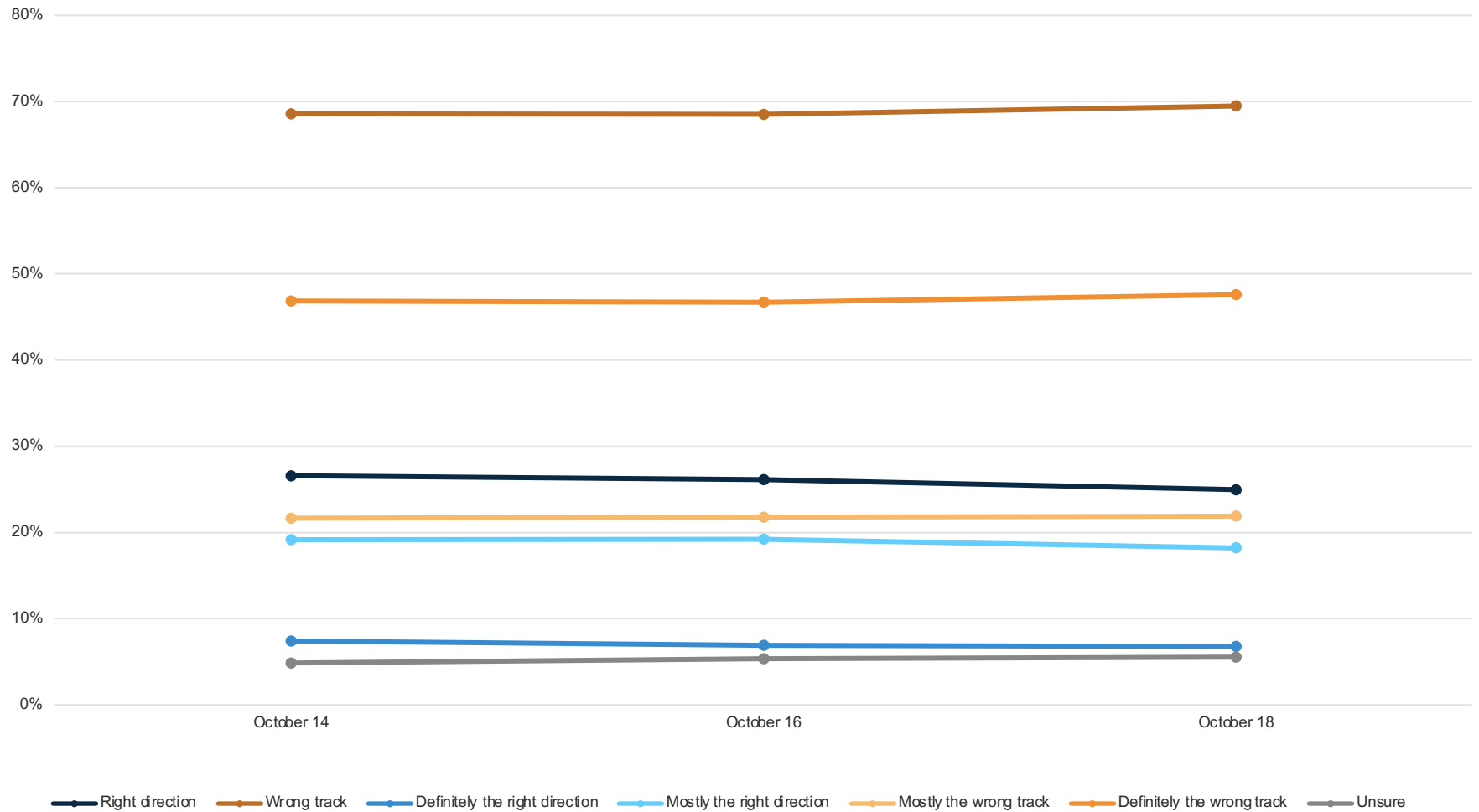

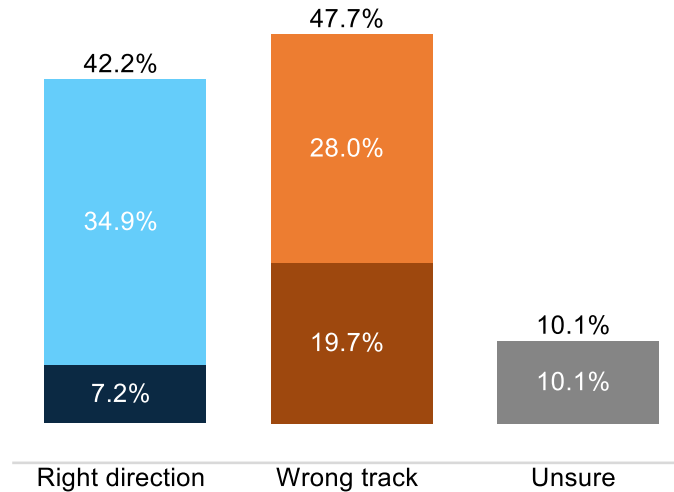
Generally speaking, would you say things in the United States are headed in the right direction or off on the wrong track?

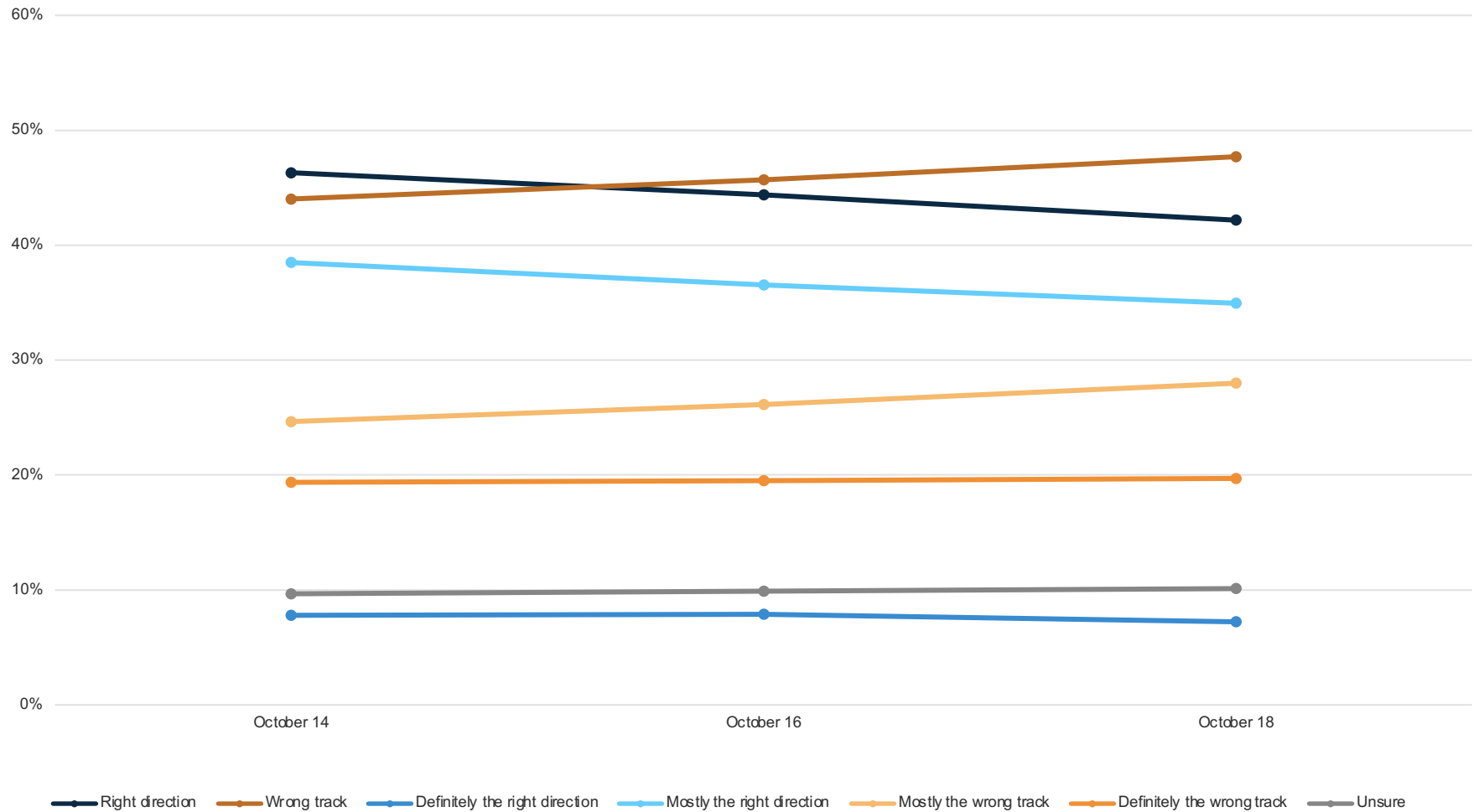

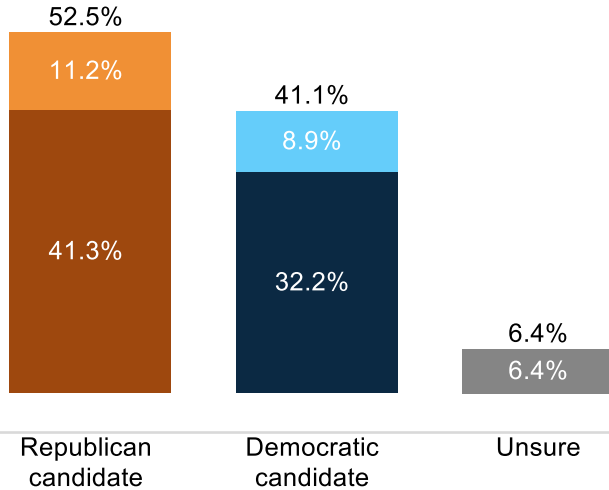
Generally speaking, would you say things in Ohio are headed in the right direction or off on the wrong track?

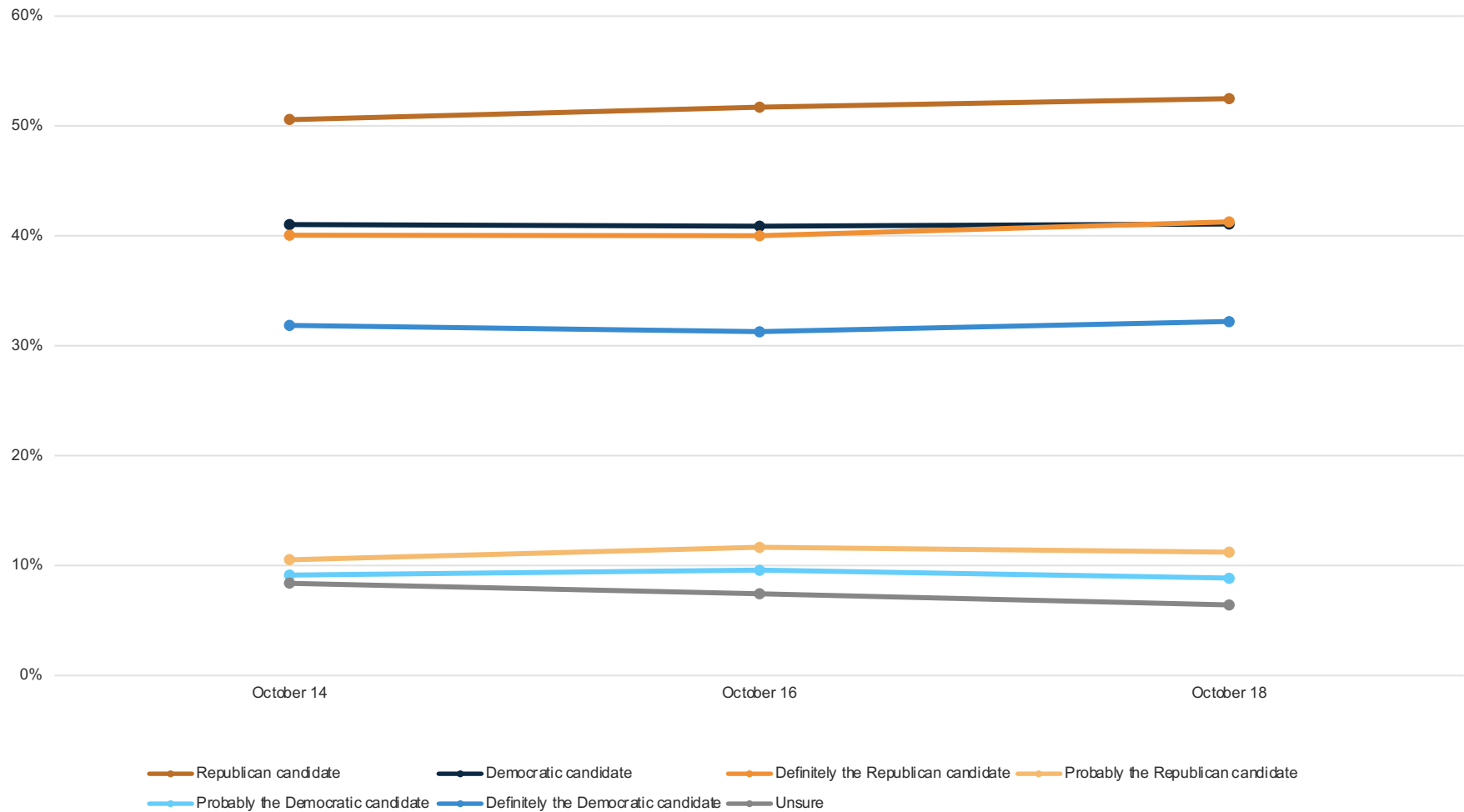

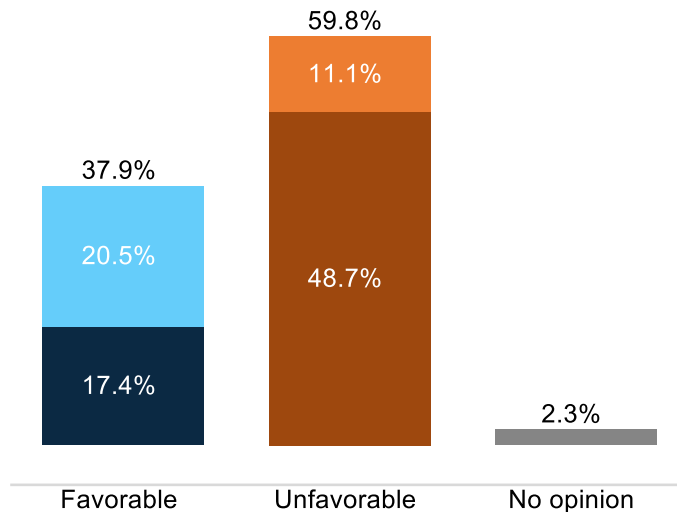
If the election was held today, and you had to make a choice, would you vote for the Republican or Democratic candidate for Congress?

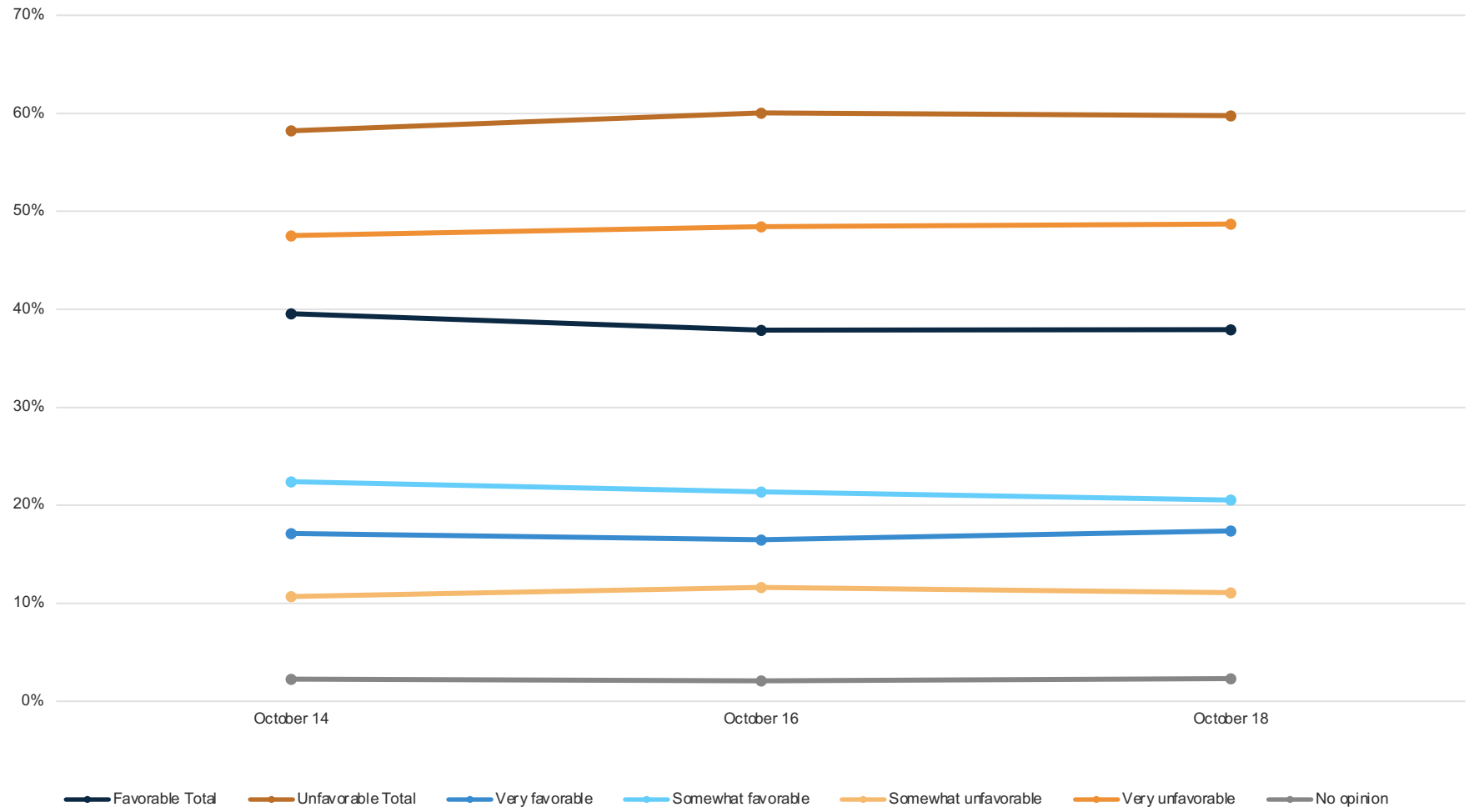

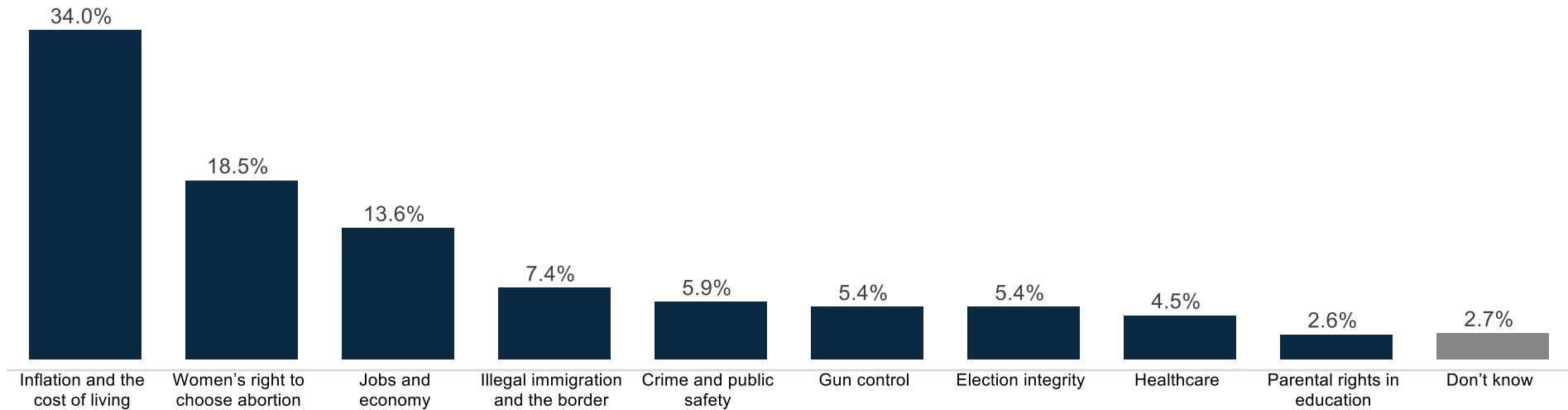
Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Joe Biden?

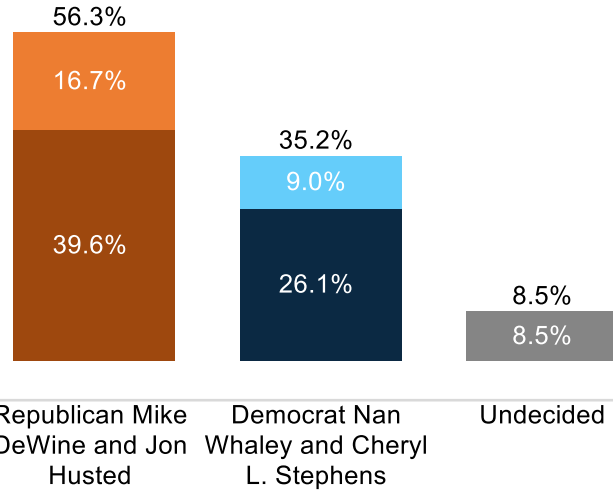

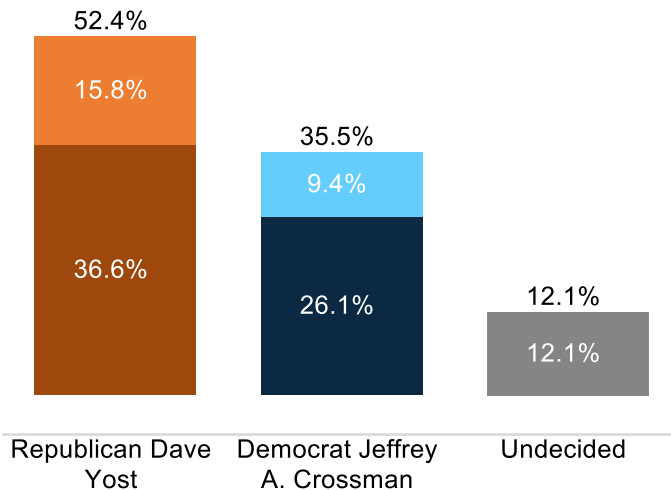
If the general election for Governor was held today, and you had to make a choice, who would you vote for?

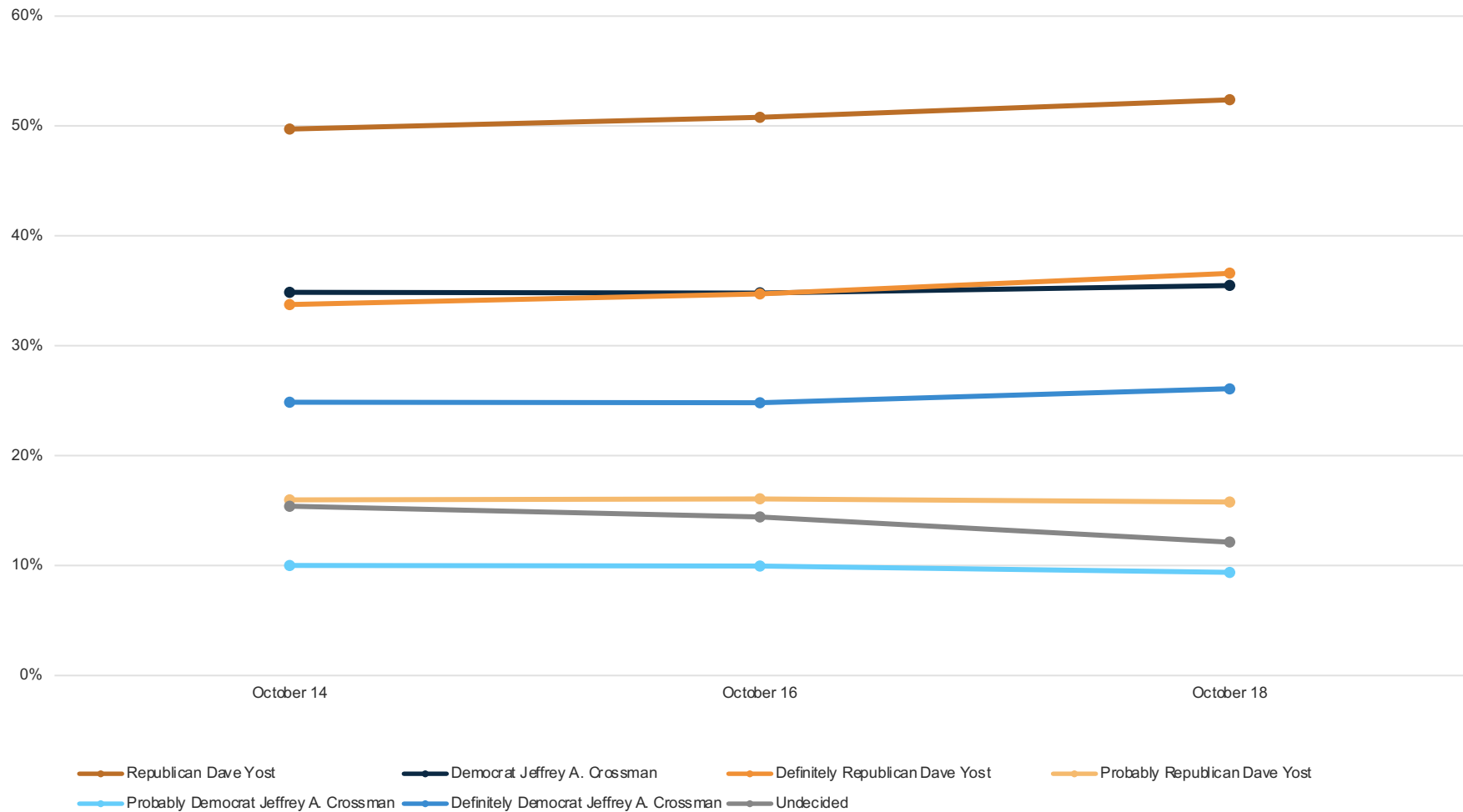

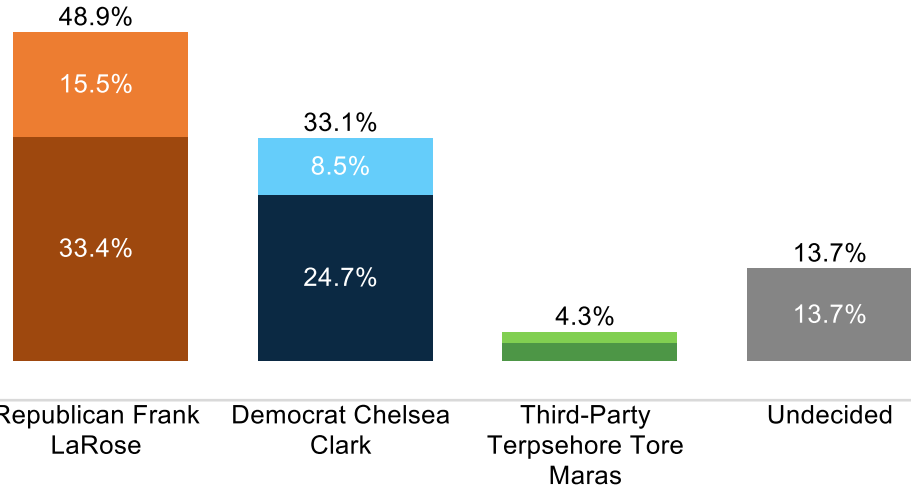
If the general election for Attorney General was held today, and you had to make a choice, who would you vote for?

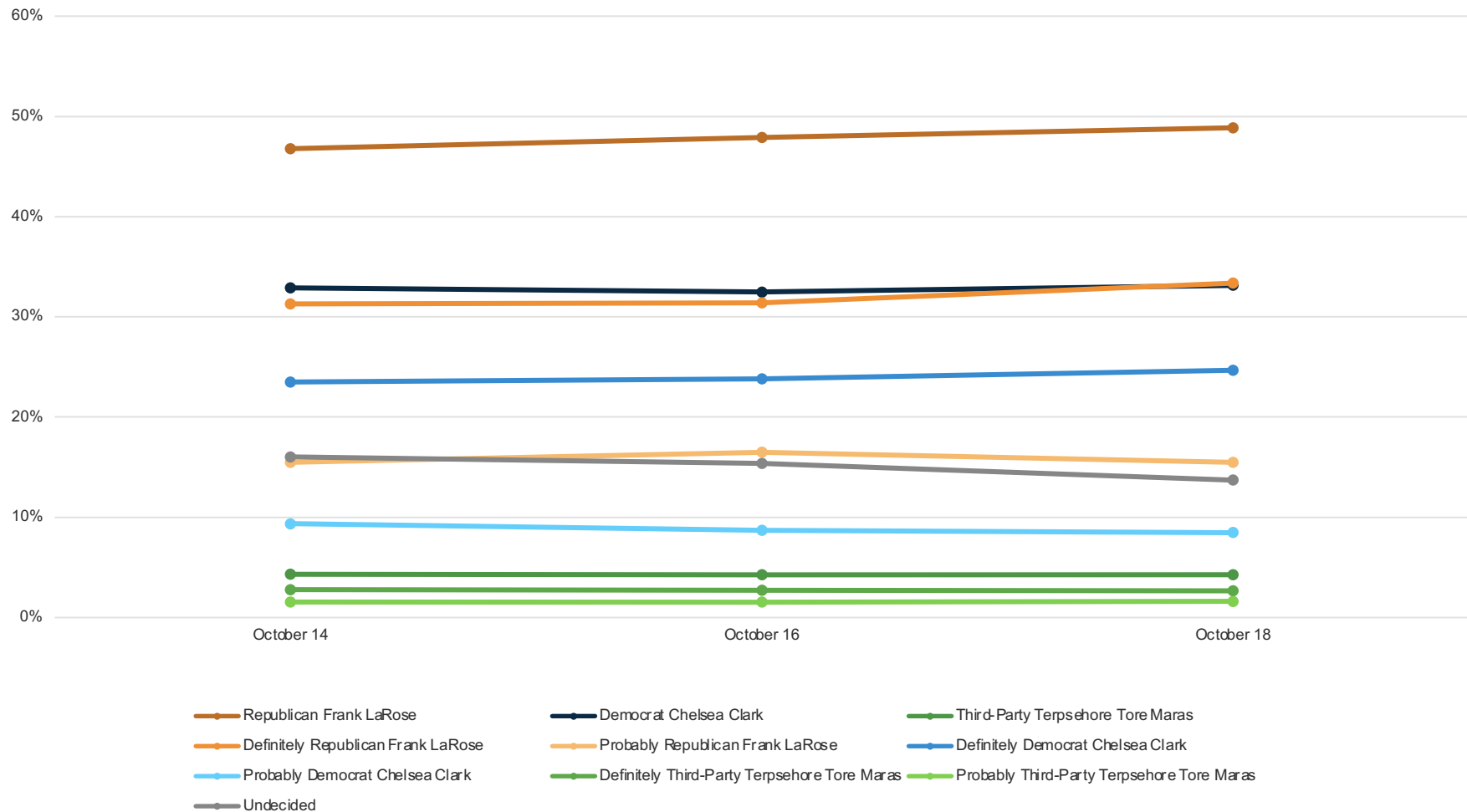

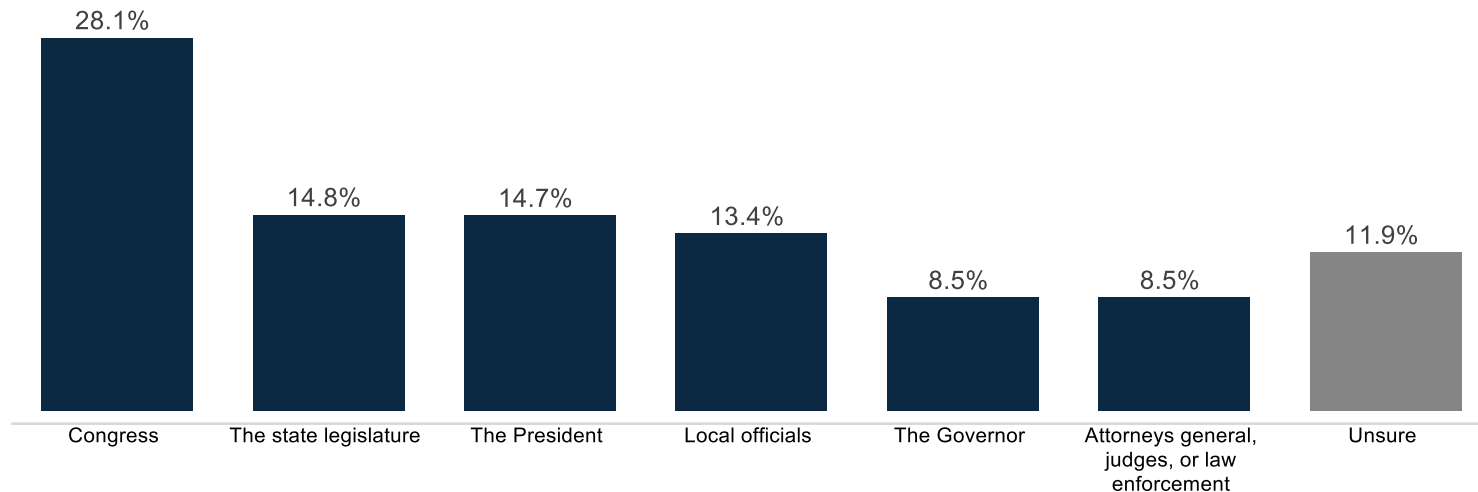
If the general election for Secretary of State was held today, and you had to make a choice, who would you vote for?

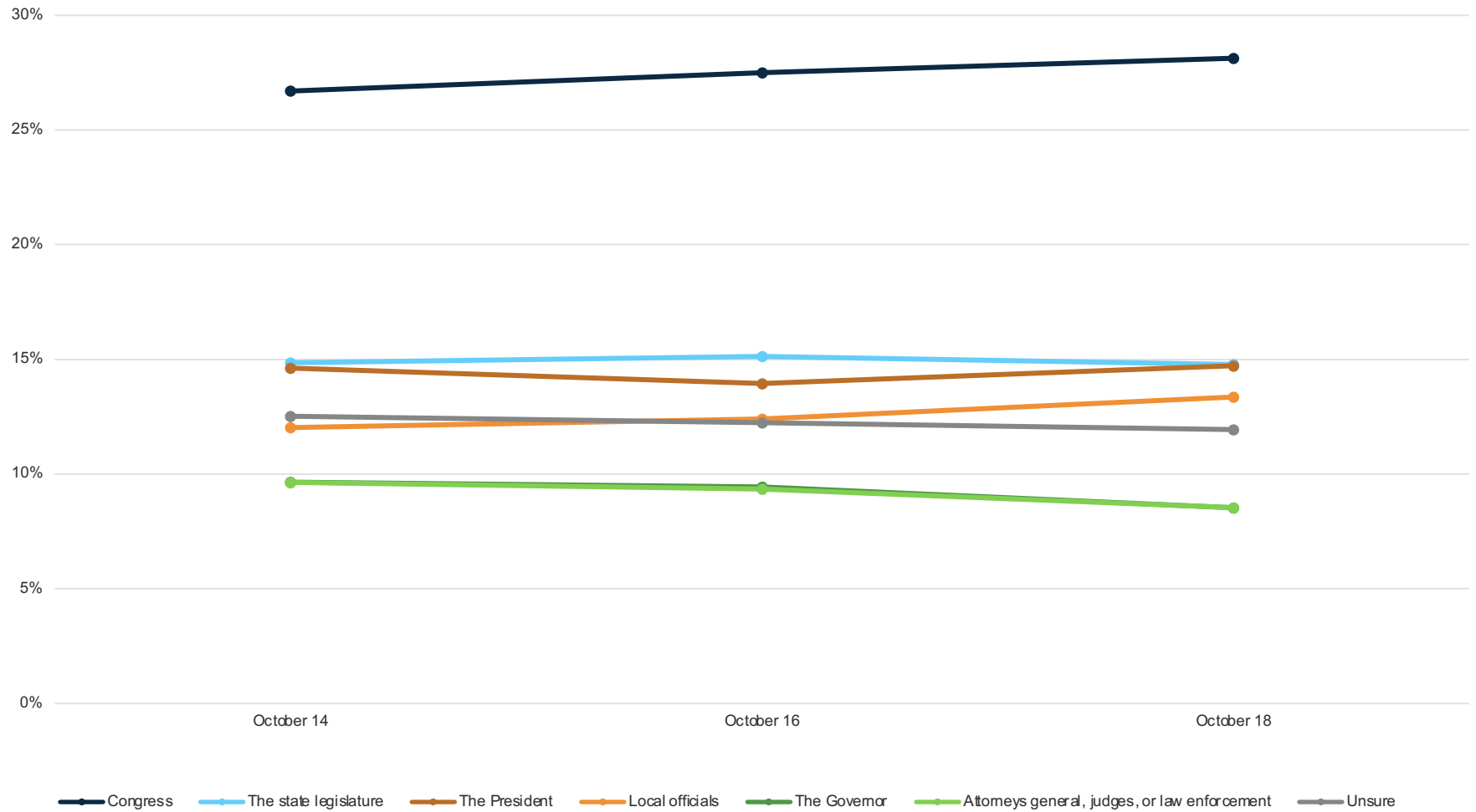

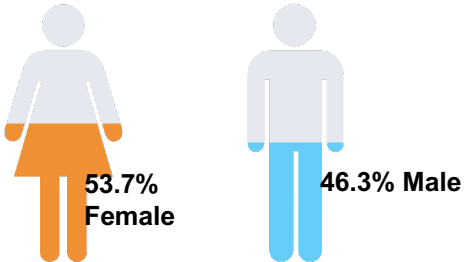
