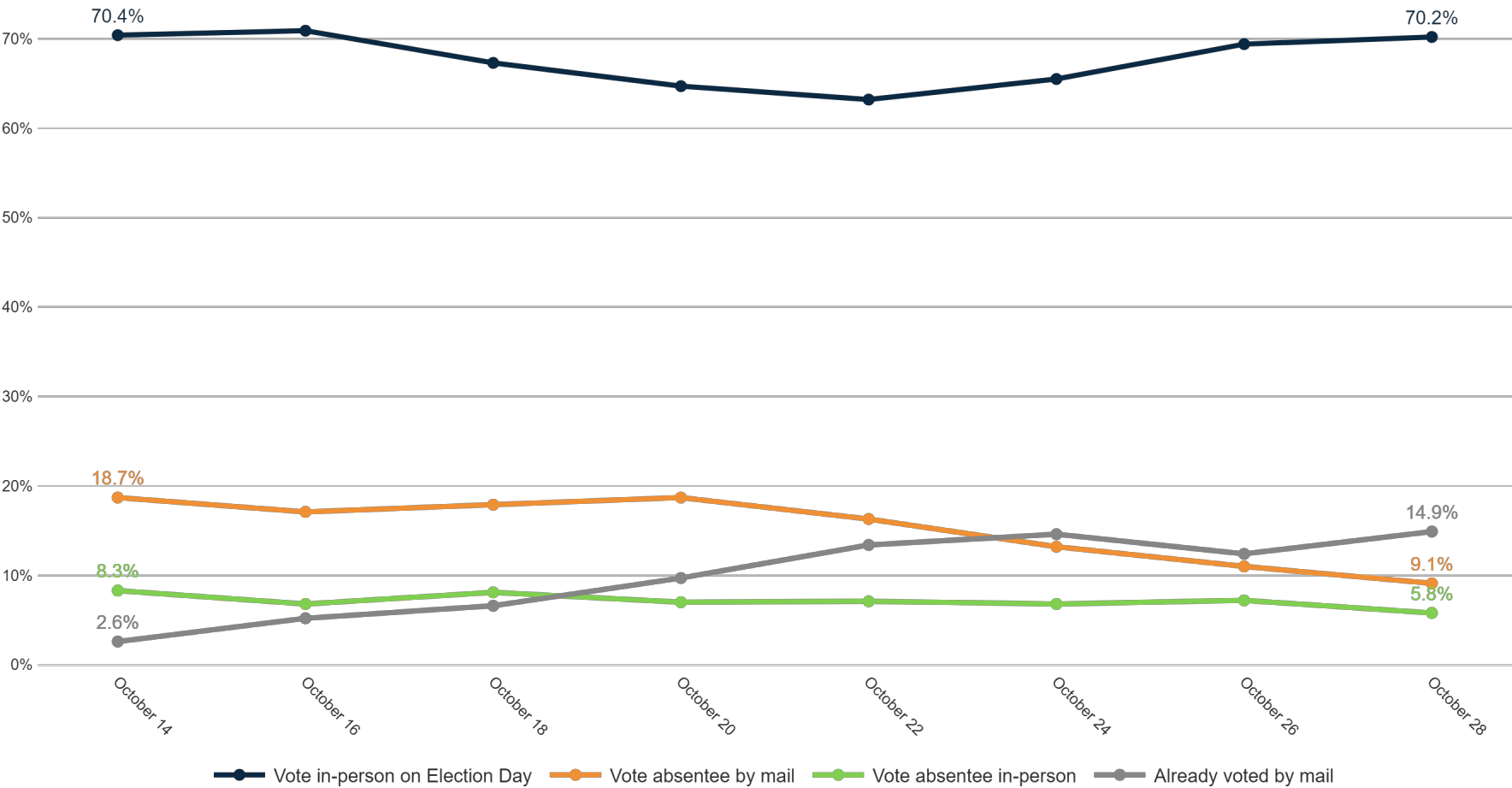

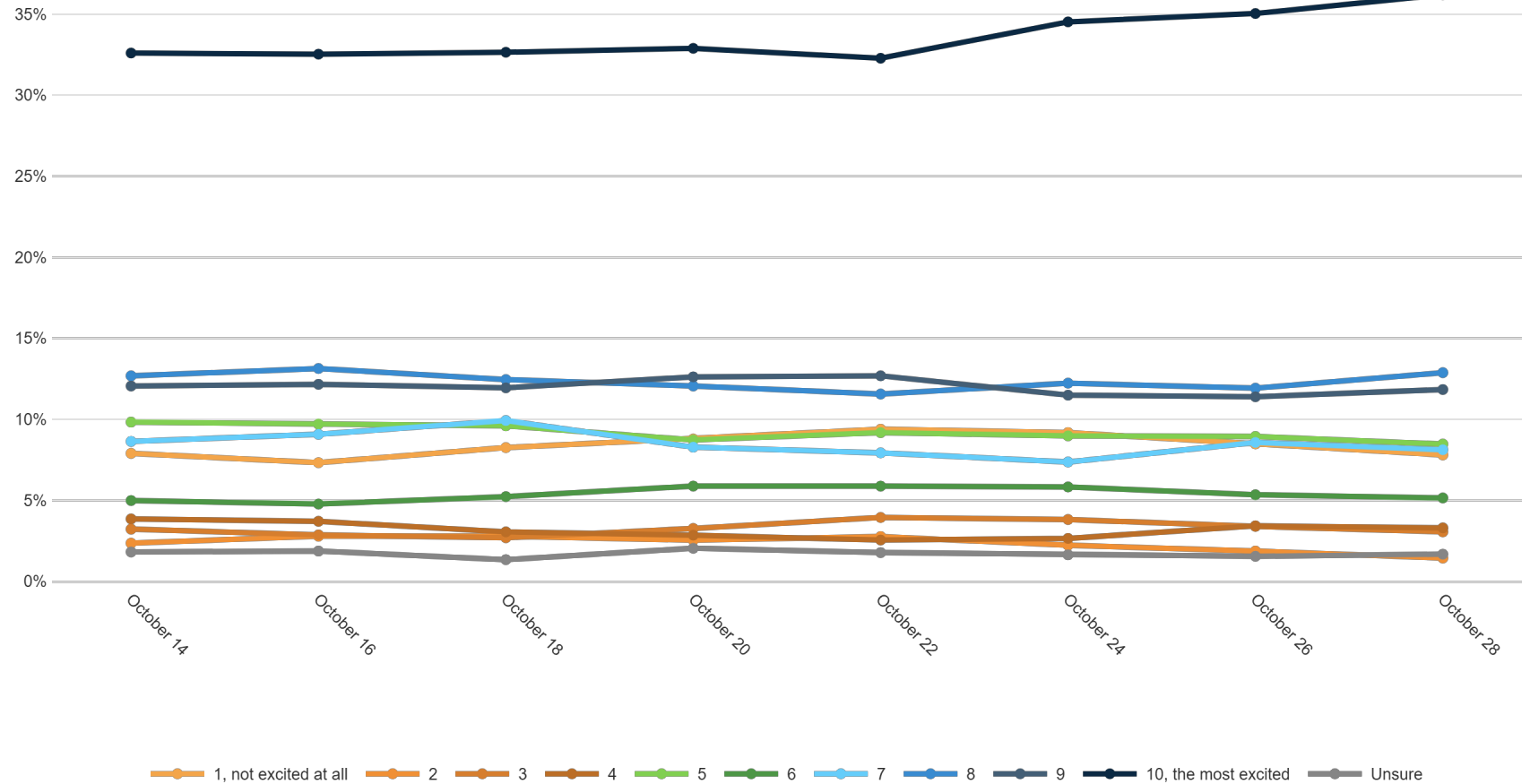


How excited are you to vote in the November general election for Governor, Congress, and state legislature on a scale of 1 to 10, with 1 being not excited at all and 10 being very excited?



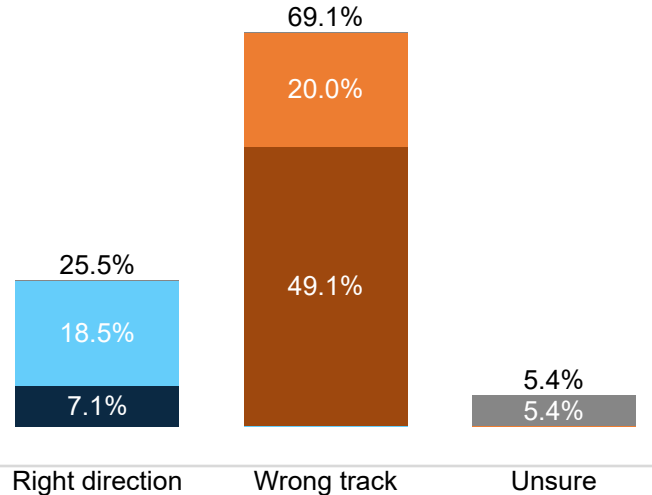

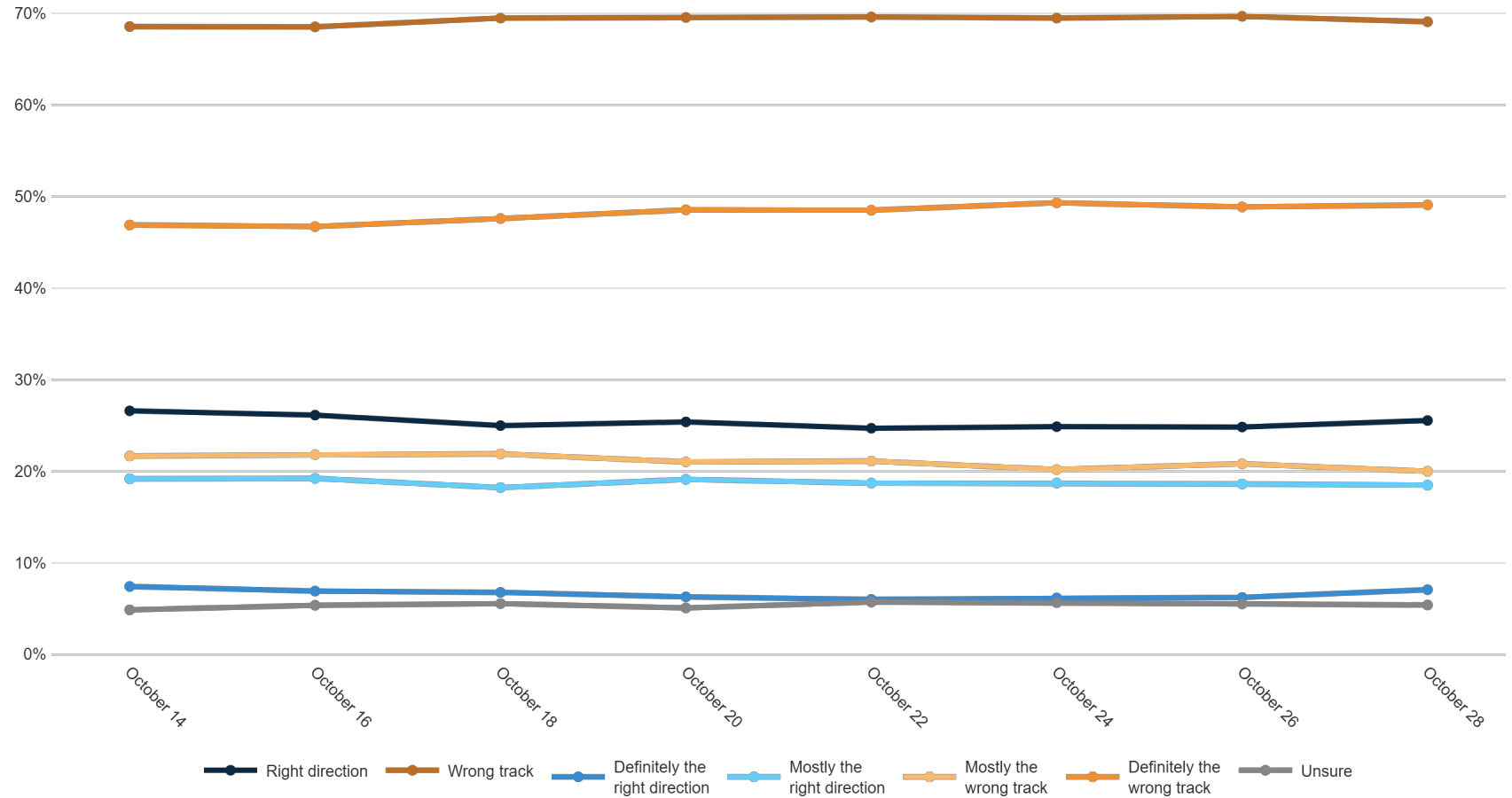

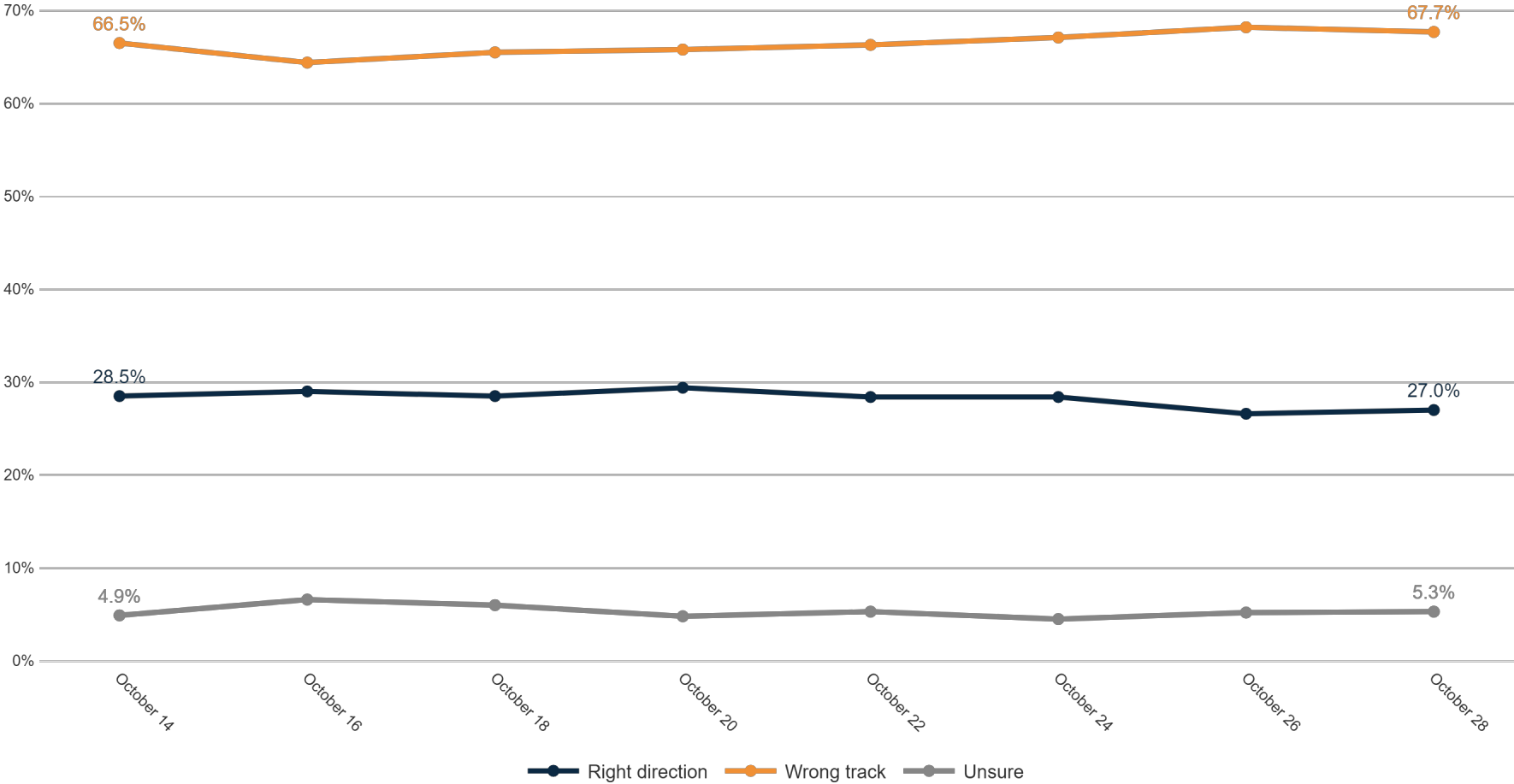
Trend: US Right Direction/ Wrong Track

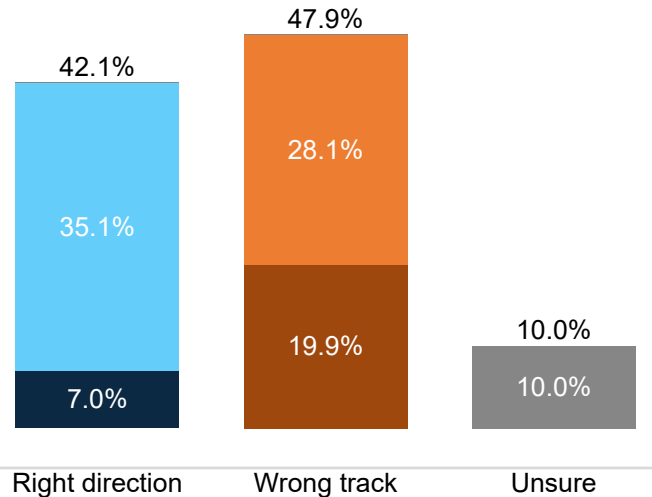

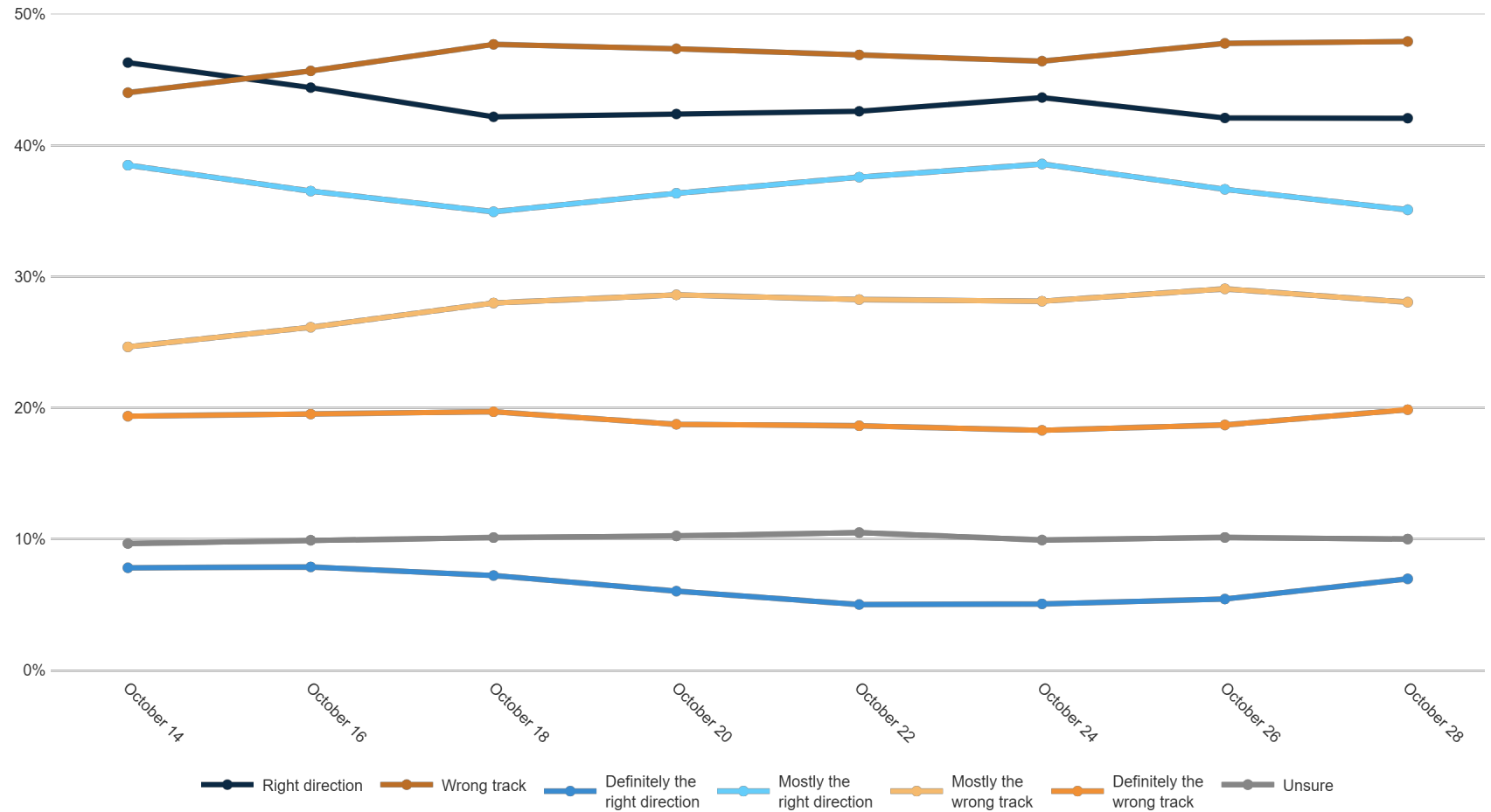

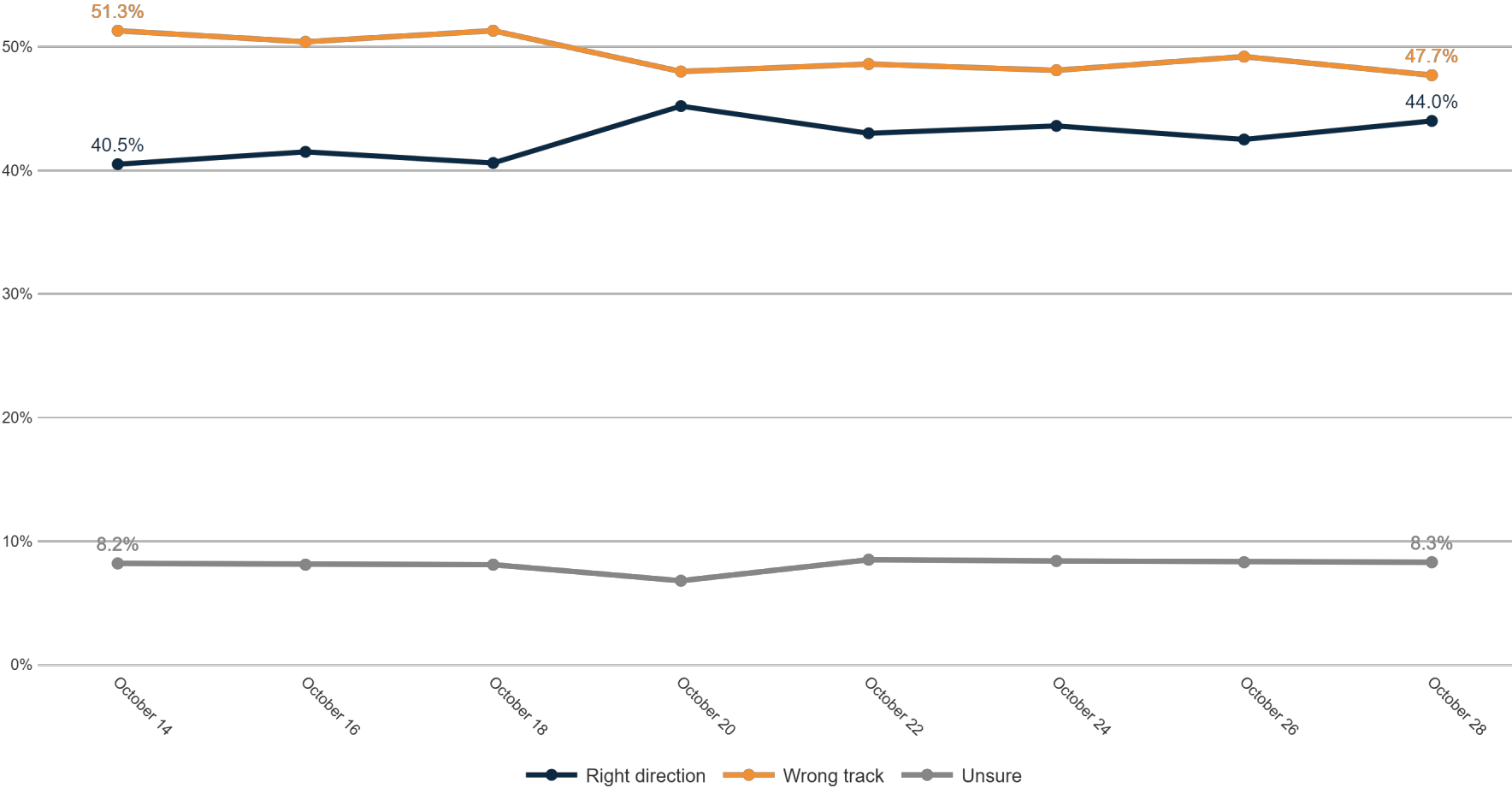
Trend: OH Right Direction/ Wrong Track

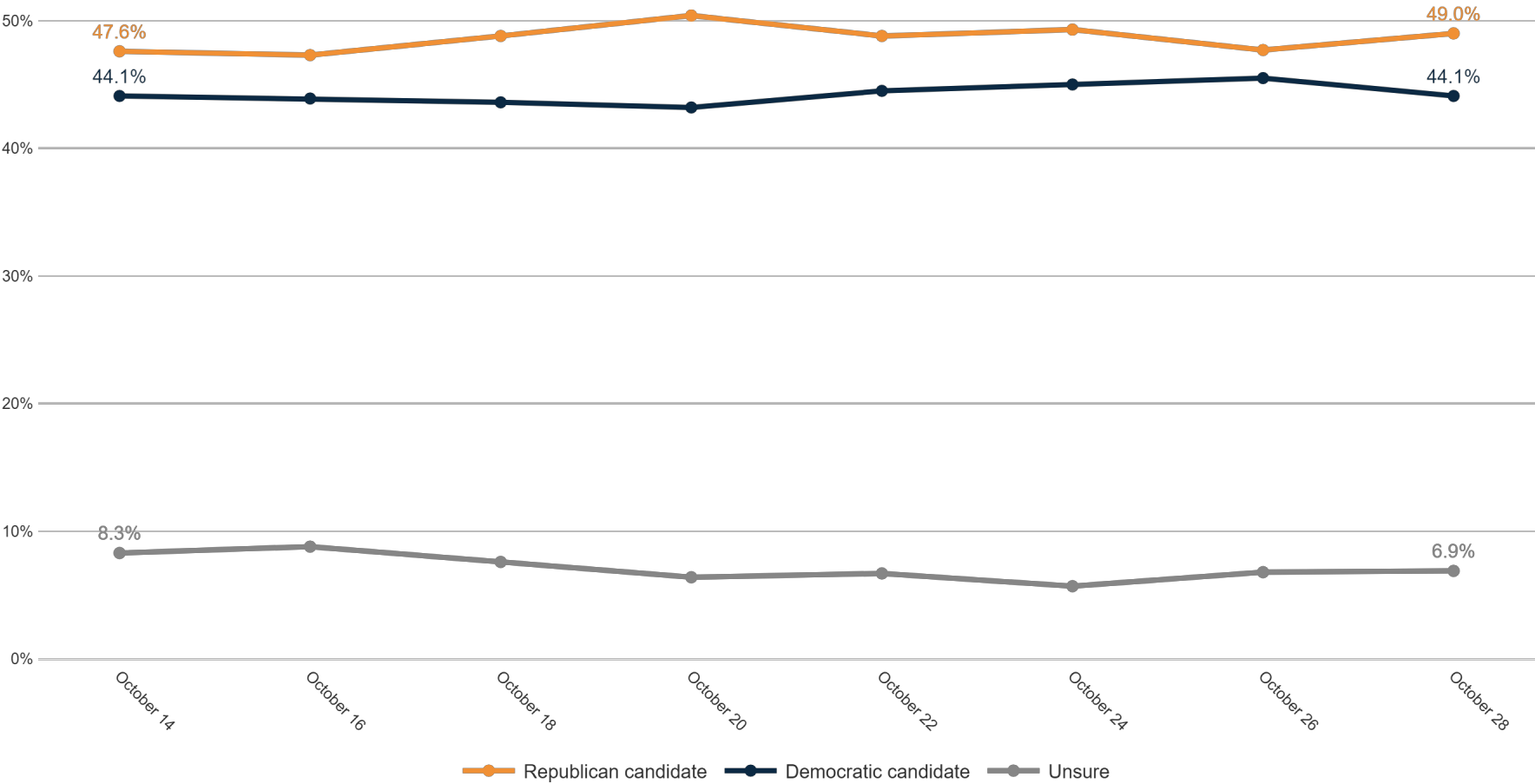

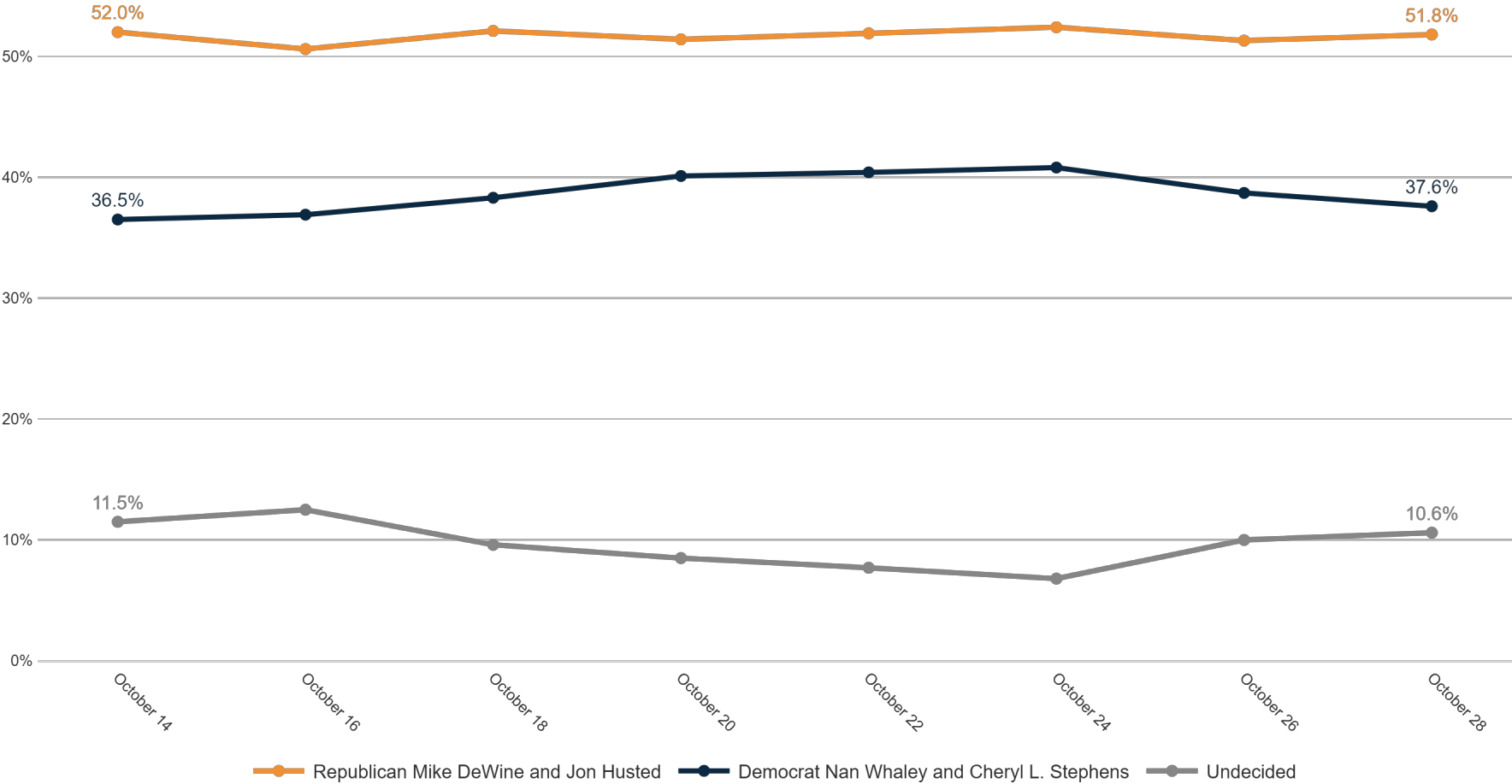

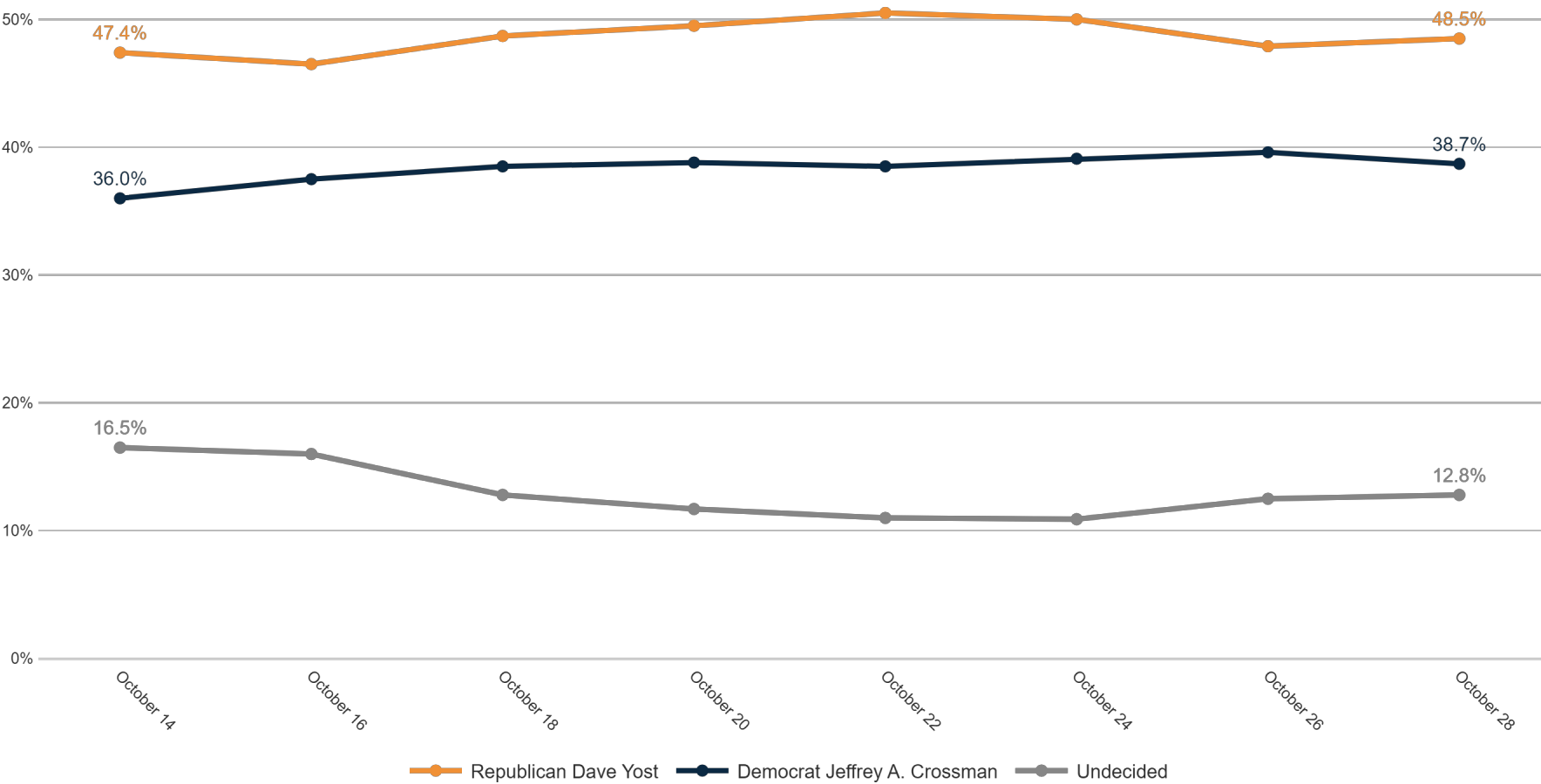
