


2. Generally speaking, would you say things in Michigan are headed in the right direction or off on the wrong track?






Generic Congressional Ballot







# **METHODOLOGY**

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Statewide training data collection was conducted October 27 - 31, 2022, with 1584 likely general election voters. Known registered voters were interviewed via online panel, IVR, and SMS. These estimates were created by applying multilevel regression with poststratification for modeling.
