


1. How do you plan to vote in the November election for Congress, Governor, and local offices?

2. Generally speaking, would you say things in Michigan are headed in the right direction or off on the wrong track?




Generic Congressional Ballot

3. If the elections were held today, and you had to make a choice, would you vote for the Republican or Democratic candidate for U.S. Congress?

















12. Proposal 3 would amend the state constitution to establish a new individual right to reproductive freedom, including right to make all decisions about pregnancy and abortion, allow state to regulate abortion in some cases, and forbid prosecution of individual exercising established right. This amendment would establish a new individual right to reproductive freedom, including right to make and carry out all decisions about pregnancy, such as prenatal care, childbirth, postpartum care, contraception, sterilization, abortion, miscarriage management and infertility. Allow state to regulate abortion after fetal viability, but not prohibit if medically needed to protect a patient's life or physical or mental health. Forbid state discrimination in enforcement of this right, prohibit prosecution of an individual or a personal helping a pregnant individual for exercising rights established by this amendment. Invalidate state laws conflicting with this amendment.

METHODOLOGY



Statewide training data collection was conducted October 31 – November 2, 2022, with 1754 likely general election voters. Known registered voters were interviewed via online panel, IVR, and SMS. These estimates were created by applying multilevel regression with poststratification for modeling.
