# Survey of Likely General Election Voters **National**

October 30 – November 1, 2023 | n=2000 |  $\pm 2.16\%$

## Insights & Analysis

- Joe **Biden's image noticeably improved** since last month - from upside down by 8 to upside down by 3 – likely due to the war in Israel. (Biden was as 45% fav / 53% unfav [-8 net fav]; now he is 47% fav / 50% unfav [-3 net fav]).
  - Donald **Trump** (-10 net fav) is 6 points more favorable with independents than Biden.
- The **Biden-Trump rematch now has Biden with a +2 lead** (47% Biden / Trump 45%), reverting back to where it stood in September after being tied in October.
  - 44% of **Independents** would vote for **Trump**, 38% for Biden, and 18% are **Undecided**.
- **Biden** leads by +4 against a **generic Republican** who isn't Trump (Biden +1 in October).
  - In this scenario, **Independent's** support for **Biden** drops to 31% while their support for **Republicans** is relatively steady at 42%. **Undecided Independents** jump up to 27%.
- With **Robert F. Kennedy, Jr. in the race**, **Trump** falls to 39%, 40% for **Biden**, and 12% for **Kennedy** (Biden+1).
  - 17% of **Independents** support **Kennedy**, 30% for **Biden**, 36% for **Trump**.
- The **generic ballot remains tied from October** after being R+2 in September. Republicans have made up the lost ground with independents from last month (+4%).
  - More voters now consider the **Republican** Party to be more **extreme** than the **Democrat** Party (45% Rep / 43% Dem), counting 41% of **Democrats** thinking that of their own party. In a marked shift from the last poll, 41% of Republicans believe that of theirs as well (only 30% last round).
- The **top priority** for voters remains **inflation and the economy** (31%), followed now by **illegal immigration** (15%) which continues to surpass gun control (9%) and abortion (4%).

## Insights & Analysis (cont.)

- 78% of voters **care at least “some” about who the Speaker of the House is** with 31% saying they care significantly. Just 23% said they only cared a little, not at all, or were unsure.
  - Interestingly, Democrats express higher interest in who is Speaker than Republicans (63% Dems – 58% Republicans). **Non-college voters and Independents tend to care the least.**
- On **mass shootings**, 66% of voters say they are caused by **mental health issues**, 47% said easy access to firearms, and 34% said radicalization or extremism.
  - Republicans and Independents are much more likely to point to mental health, while two-thirds of Democrats cite easy access to firearms.
- **80%** of likely voters, including supermajorities of both Republicans and Democrats, **are concerned about the U.S. national debt**, which now exceeds \$33 trillion.
  - 50% of voters said a potential solution would be to **reduce regulations on the economy** and to **simplify the tax structure**.
  - 36% supported **significantly cutting the federal workforce**, and another 20% said **cuts to welfare programs**.
- On **foreign affairs**, a plurality of voters (31%) believe the U.S. should **actively engage** with the global community and work with the international community to address challenges.
  - 20% said the U.S. should **focus on U.S. economic interests, even if it compromises American values** by allying with nations that may not share our values.
  - 24% said the U.S. should **minimize involvement** in foreign affairs and conflicts.
  - The **U.S. Military** (+67 net fav) is extremely popular with both Republicans and Democrats. **Pentagon Leadership** (+27 net fav) sees a **more mixed**, but still favorable, perception among Republicans and Independents while being favorable with nearly two-thirds of Democrats.

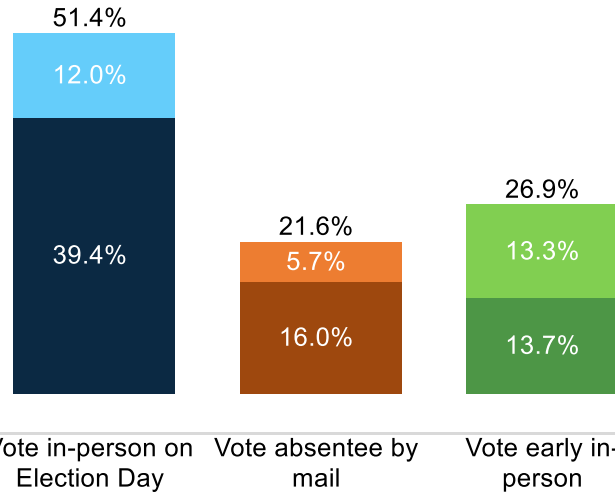
## Insights & Analysis (cont.)

- On the **War in Ukraine**, 33% of voters **support providing weapons and financial support**. Another 10% say only financial support, and another 10% say only weapons (53% either weapons, money, or both).
  - 15% say the U.S. should **focus on brokering peace** that allows Russia to keep Ukrainian territory it currently occupies. 18% say the U.S. **should do nothing more**.
- On the **War in Israel**, just 27% **support providing weapons and financial support**. Another 10% say only financial support, and another 10% say only weapons (47% either weapons, money, or both).
  - 28% say the U.S. should **focus on brokering peace** between Israel and Hamas. 12% say the U.S. **should do nothing more**.
  - **69% of voters say the Israeli incursion into Gaza is justified**, including 65% of Democrats and 74% of Republicans, while only 18% overall believe it is not.
- The **differences in perceptions** of the Ukraine and Israel conflicts is **starkest among Democratic voters**. 43% of Democrats support giving money and weapons to Ukraine but only 26% say the same for Israel. **1-in-5 Democrats believe the Israeli incursion into Gaza is not justified**.

## Insights & Analysis – Segmentation Analysis

- **Segmentation Analysis** identified three groups via machine-learning: ***GOP Base*** (45%), ***Democrat Base*** (44%), and ***Moderates*** (11%).
  - The ***Moderates*** segment is pessimistic overall about the direction of the country, but not quite to the same degree as the *GOP Base* segment. **These voters lean solidly Republican on the generic ballot** but have mixed opinions on both Trump and Biden. Like the *GOP Base*, these voters are more skeptical of Pentagon Leadership. Overwhelmingly, this segment **views the Republican Party as more extreme.**
  - **National security** is the secondary concern among these voters, following **inflation/economy**, making this segment unique from the social-issues-focused *Democrat Base* and the immigration-focused *GOP Base*. The party that can move the quickest in owning the national security lane will have an advantage with the *Moderates* segment.
  - In a **Trump v. Biden rematch**, the *Moderates* segment leans slightly in favor of Trump, but much less so than their Republican tilt on the generic ballot. Notably, a non-Trump Republican is only tied with Biden among this group. **Kennedy takes away more of these Moderates from Biden than he does Trump** in a 3-way matchup.
  - These voters are **much less informed on foreign affairs** than the other two segments and are largely unsure about the role the U.S. should play on the global stage, including in the conflicts in Ukraine and Gaza.
  - These voters tend to be **center-right, suburban voters who are earning under \$50k annually**, which is less than the partisan segments. Most voted for Trump in the 2020 election. Of the three segments, these voters are the **least likely to have a college degree.**

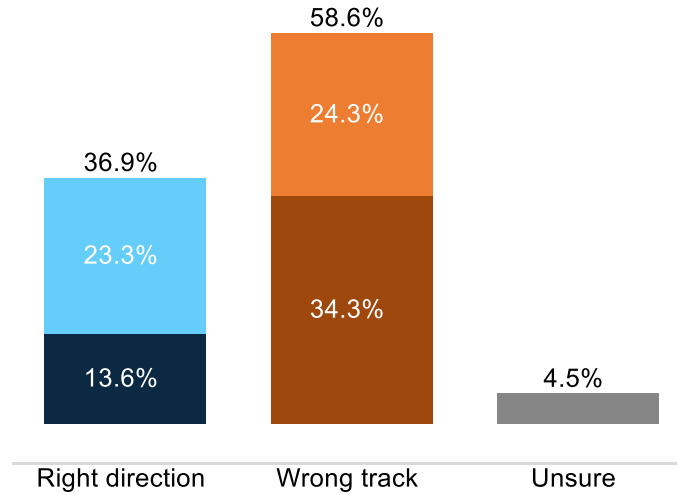

How do you plan to vote in the November 2024 general election for President, U.S. Congress, and state offices?

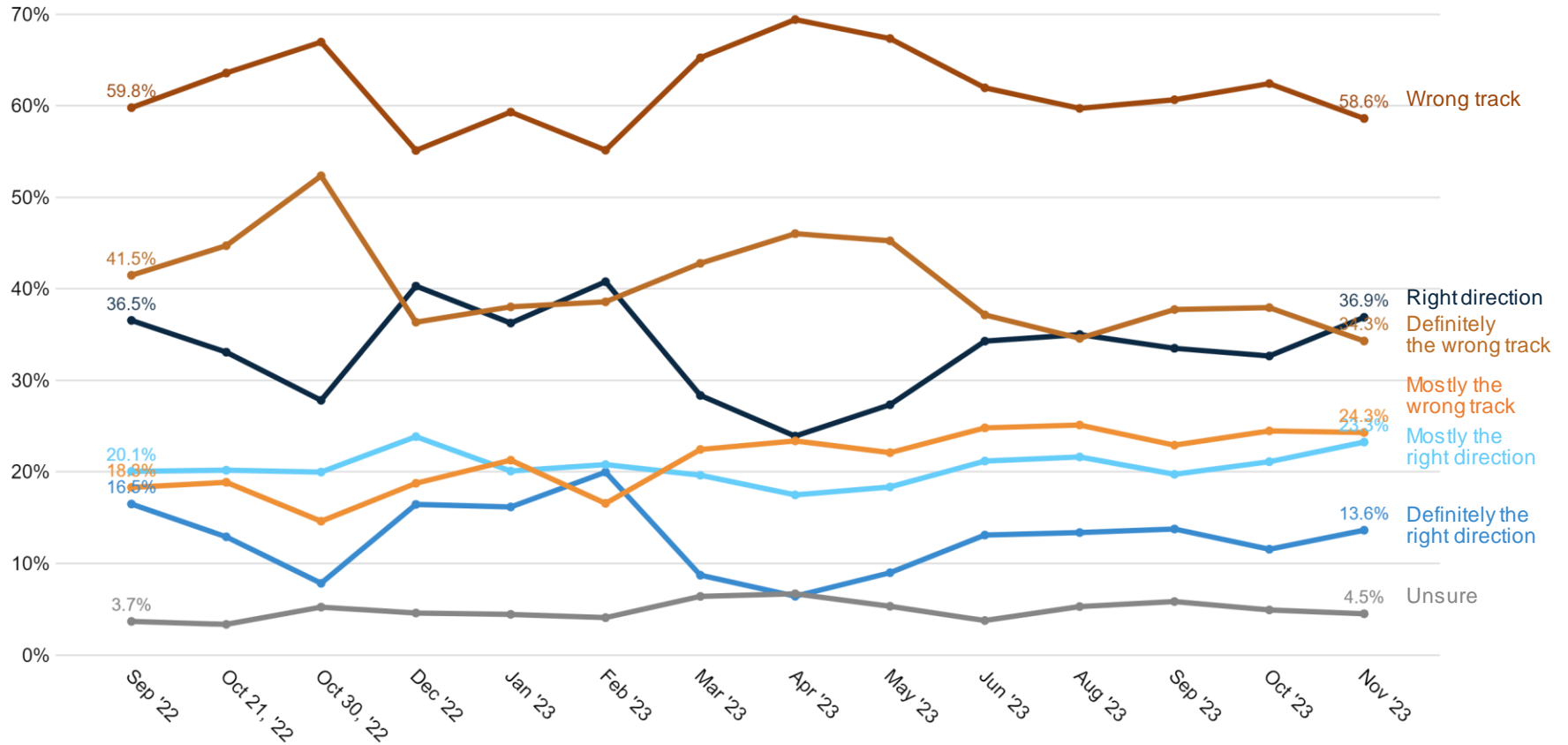

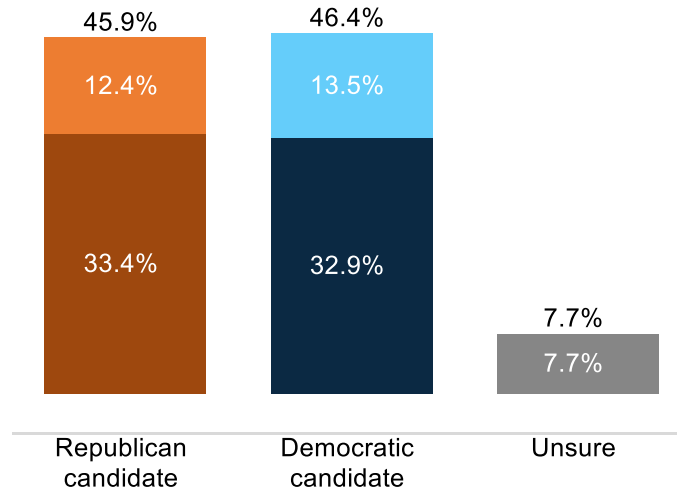

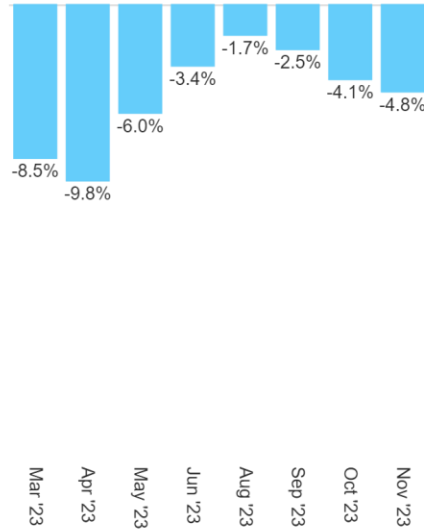
If the November 2024 general election was held today, and you had to make a choice, would you vote for the Republican or Democratic candidate for U.S. Congress?

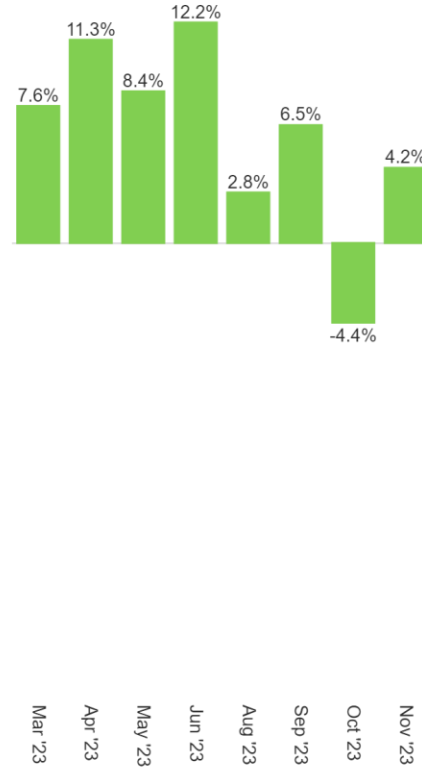
Overall (%Rep-%Dem)



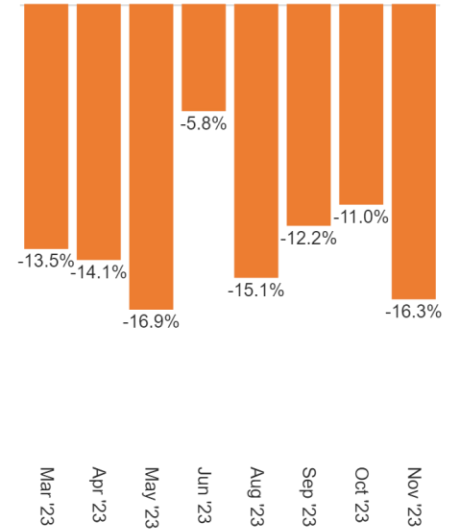
Females (%Rep-%Dem)

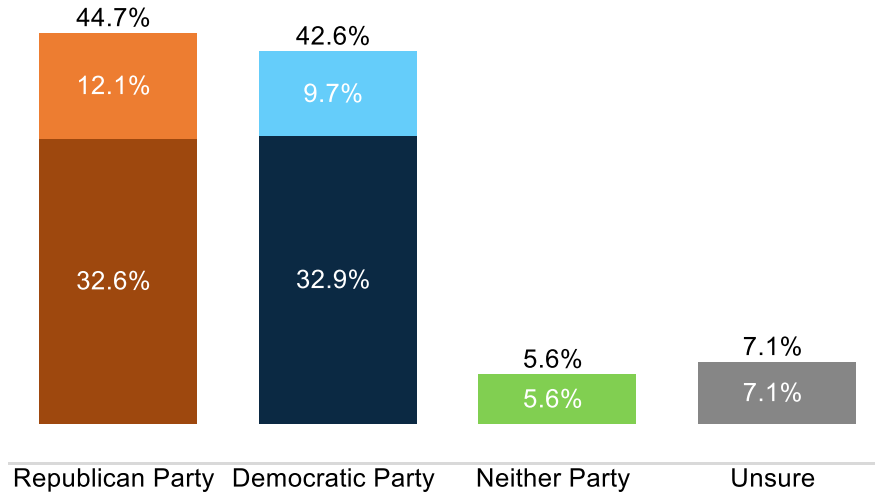

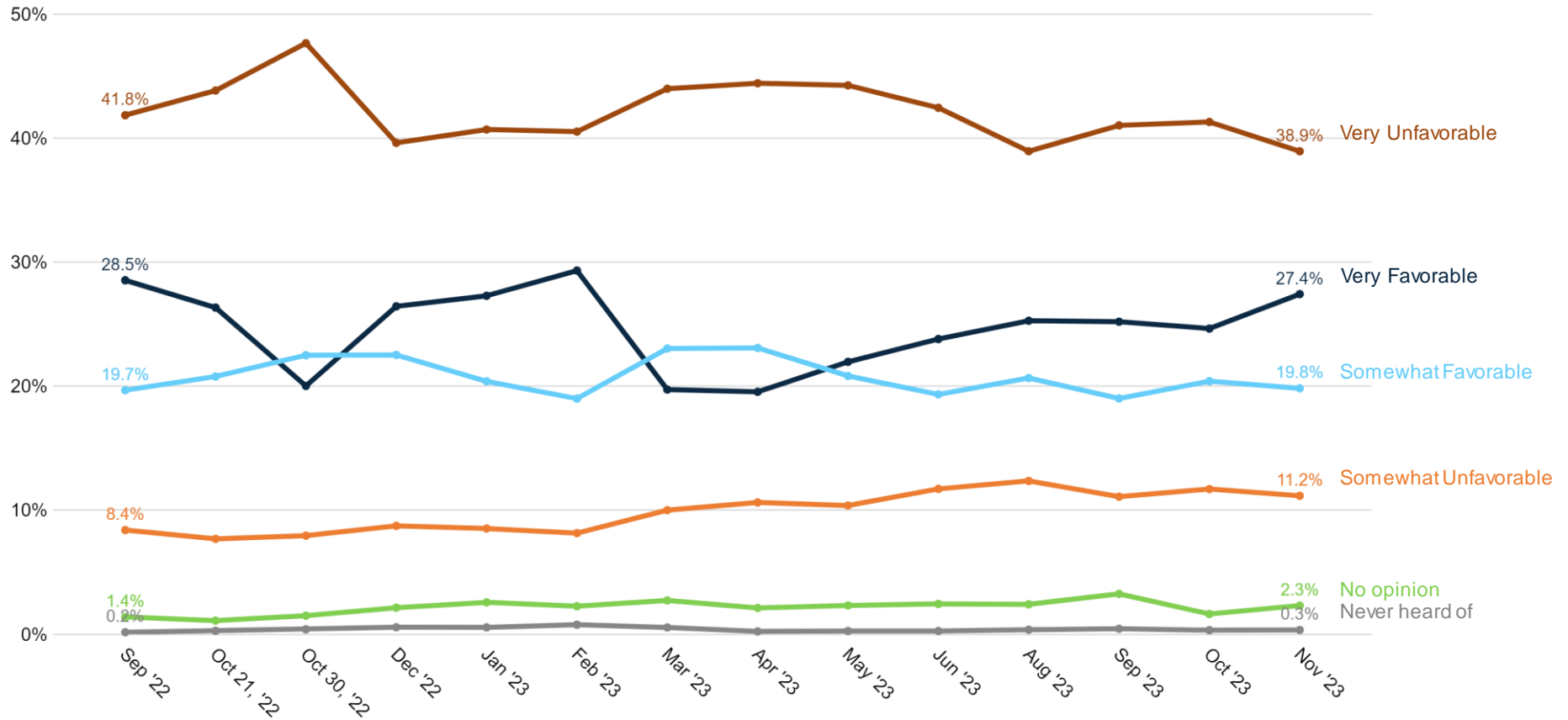

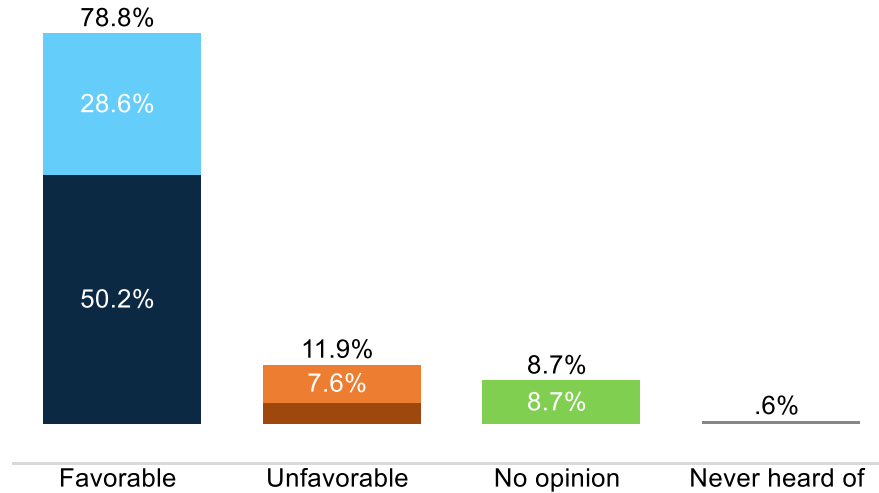
Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Donald Trump?

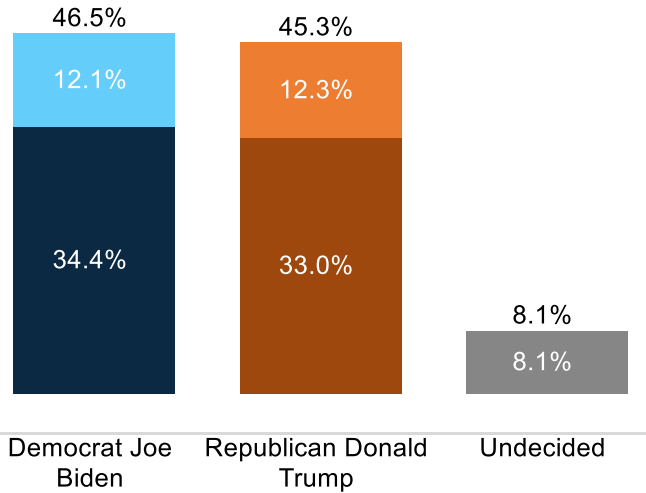
