Insights & Analysis

- **Trump and Biden are neck-and-neck** (Trump 45% - Biden 44% - Undecided 11%) across the 39 battleground Congressional districts.
- When **comparing the job approvals of the former and current President** (Trump Approve 45% v Biden Approve 37%).
 - Trump's approval advantage is most stark among **Independents** (Approve 40% - Disapprove 49%) compared to Biden's (Approve 29% – Disapprove 60%) and among **suburban voters** (Trump: Approve 43% – Disapprove 49% / Biden: Approve 29% – Disapprove 63%)
 - Trump's approval is higher than Biden with **young** and **Hispanic voters**.
- **Kennedy hurts Biden more** (Trump 41% - Biden 37% - Kennedy 11% - Undecided 11%) when added to the Presidential ballot test.
 - Trump retains his +3% advantage with **Independents** on the 2-way ballot while Kennedy siphons roughly equal shares of Independents from both candidates.
 - **Biden takes his biggest hits** among suburban, Hispanic, and young voters with Kennedy on the ballot.
- **Biden v a non-Trump Republican** leaves the ballot in a similar position but with more undecideds (Non-Trump R 40% - Biden 40% - Undecided 21%).
 - **Independents** are +12% for a Non-Trump Republican (Trump +3%) against Biden.
- **A non-Biden Democrat slips 2% further behind Trump** (Trump 43% - Biden 40% - Undecided 16%) as support erodes among college-educated women and voters age 65+.
 - However, support among increases among **young voters** and **Black voters**.

Insights & Analysis – Cont.

- On the **generic Congressional ballot**, Republicans lead by 2%; +10% with Independents (44% - 34%). **Suburban voters** are divided (46% - 45%).
 - Battleground voters are **very pessimistic about the direction of the country** (right direction 30% - wrong track 65%), including Independents, Hispanic voters, and suburban voters.
- **Plurality of voters blame Democrats for rising crime nationwide** (Democrats 37% - Republicans 18% - Both Parties 27% - Neither Party 14% - Unsure 4%).
 - Independent (3:1) and suburban (2:1) voters are much more likely to **blame Democrats** for rising crime.
 - **Voters who blame both parties for crime** are more likely to be suburban women who support Biden 50-25% over Trump.
- The **top issue** for battleground voters is **inflation** (29%), especially among Independents, while Republicans are focused on border security and Democrats on threats to democracy.
 - **Abortion** comes in last with 3%.
- Battleground voters tend to **trust Republicans more on the issues**:
 - **Border Security** (R Trust 53% - D Trust 26%)
 - Independents (R+38) - Hispanic voters (R+13) - Suburban (R+24).
 - **Crime** (R Trust 46% - D Trust 31%)
 - Independents (R+22) - Hispanic voters (R+11) - Suburban (R+16).
 - **Inflation** (R Trust 45% - D Trust 36%)
 - Independents (R+11) - Hispanic voters (R+12) - Suburban (R+6).

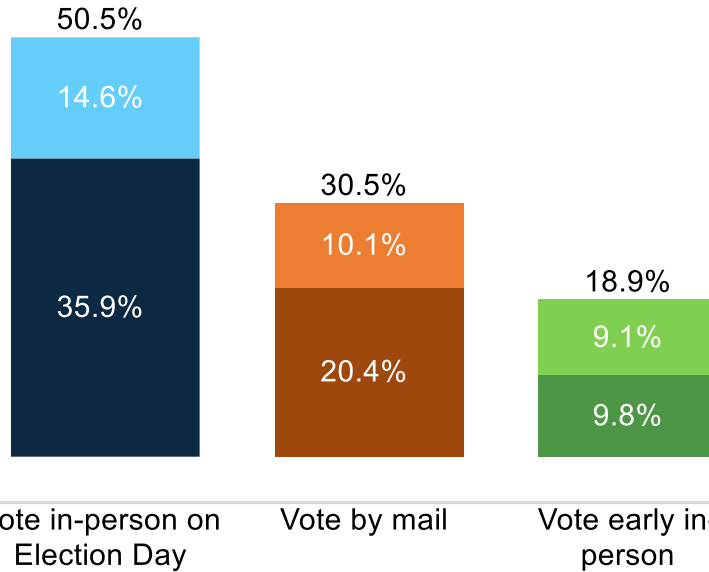
Insights & Analysis – Cont.

- **Democrats are most trusted on abortion** (R Trust 32% - D Trust 45%).
- **Republicans are perceived as more extreme** (Republicans 49% - Democrats 39%), especially among Hispanic voters (R 51% - D 34%).
- **On abortion**, battleground voters are more likely to see it as a **national issue** to be addressed by federal government (National Issue 48% - State Issue 40%).
 - **48% say government should allow more abortions** (34% fewer), including a majority of Independents (51% - 27%).
 - **63% say abortion should be legal** (34% illegal), though the vast majority believe some restrictions should exist.
- **Completely unrestricted abortion sees less support.** 42% of voters support **Statement A**, which states that abortion should have **no restrictions**, including to the moment of birth, and include taxpayer funding. 46% agree with **Statement B**, stating that abortion should **not be allowed except** in cases of rape, incest, or the life of the mother.

Insights – Segmentation Analysis

- **Segmentation Analysis** identified four voter groups:
 - ***Independents*** (13%) are very pessimistic about the direction of the country and **view both Biden and Trump very unfavorably**. Most have had their financial wellbeing worsen in the past year. They are much more likely to trust Republicans on crime, the border, and inflation. They **deviate from Republicans on abortion**. They support *more* abortions by a 2:1 ratio and generally believe abortion should be legal with exceptions.
 - ***GOP Base*** (41%) are staunch Republicans focused on border security first and foremost. 9-in-10 voters in this group views Trump favorably. This is the only segment who supports *fewer* abortions, highlighting how challenging the issue is for Republicans.
 - ***Inflation Democrats*** (22%) tend to be **<\$75k earners** focused primarily on inflation who lean heavily Democrat on the generic ballot.
 - ***Threats to Democracy Democrats*** (23%) tend to be **higher-income earning** and to have improved their financial wellbeing than the *Inflation Democrats* segment.

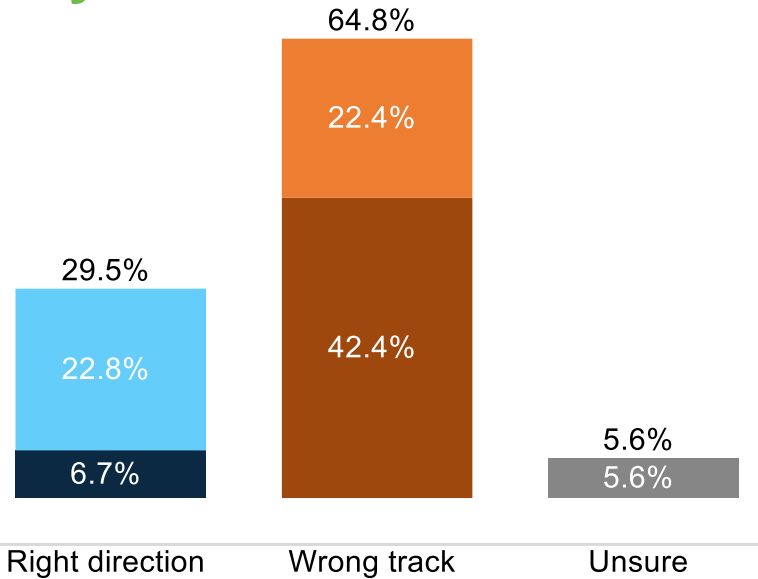

How do you plan to vote in the November 2024 general election for President, U.S. Congress, and state offices?

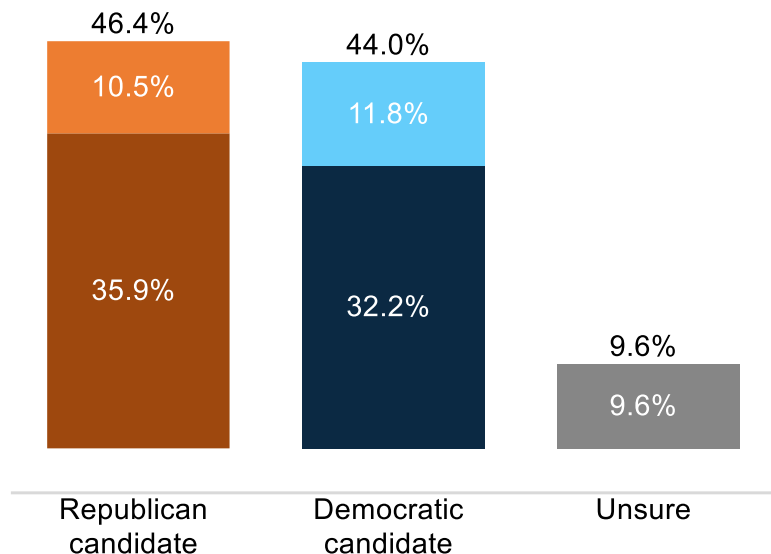

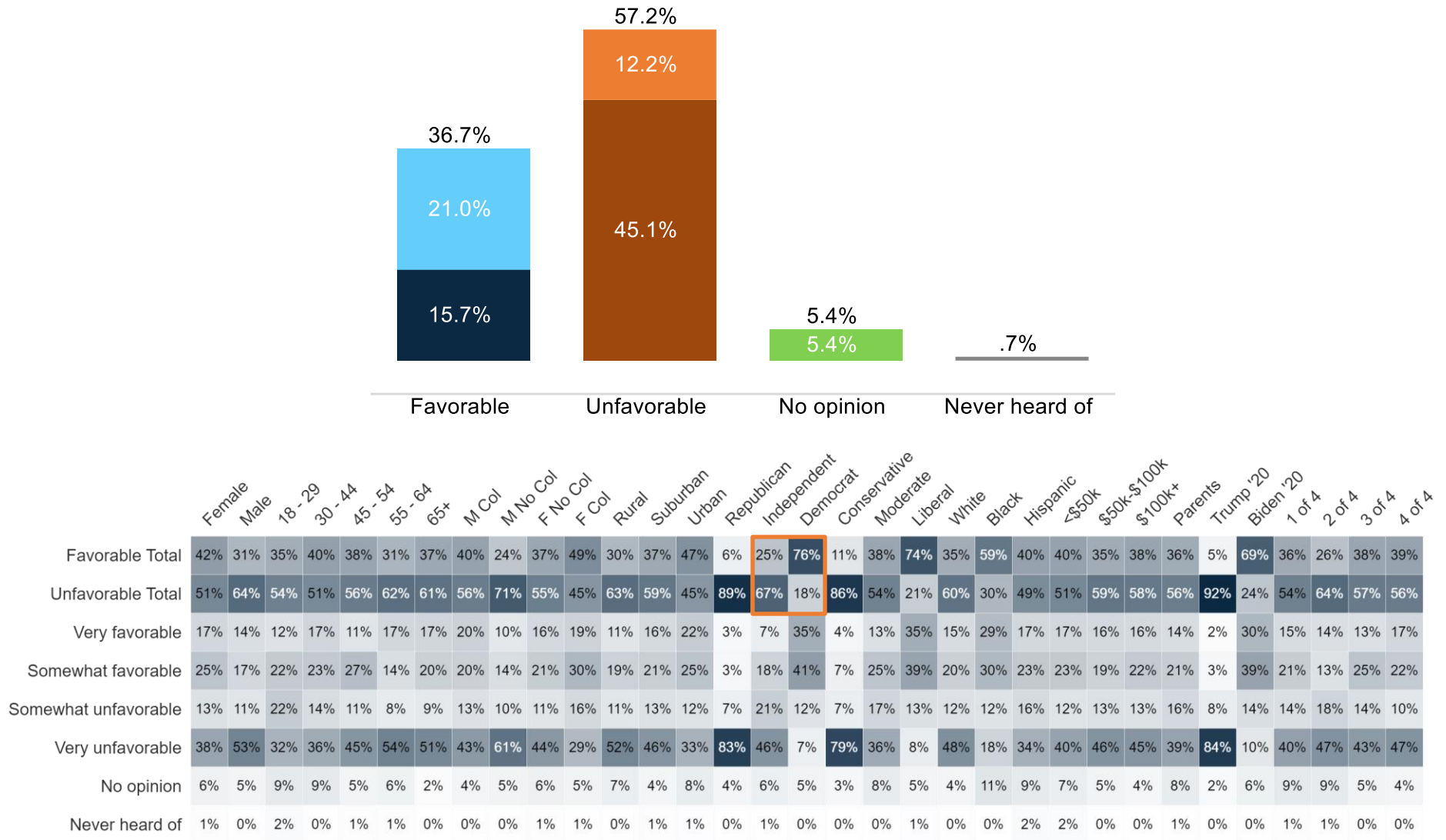
Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Joe Biden?

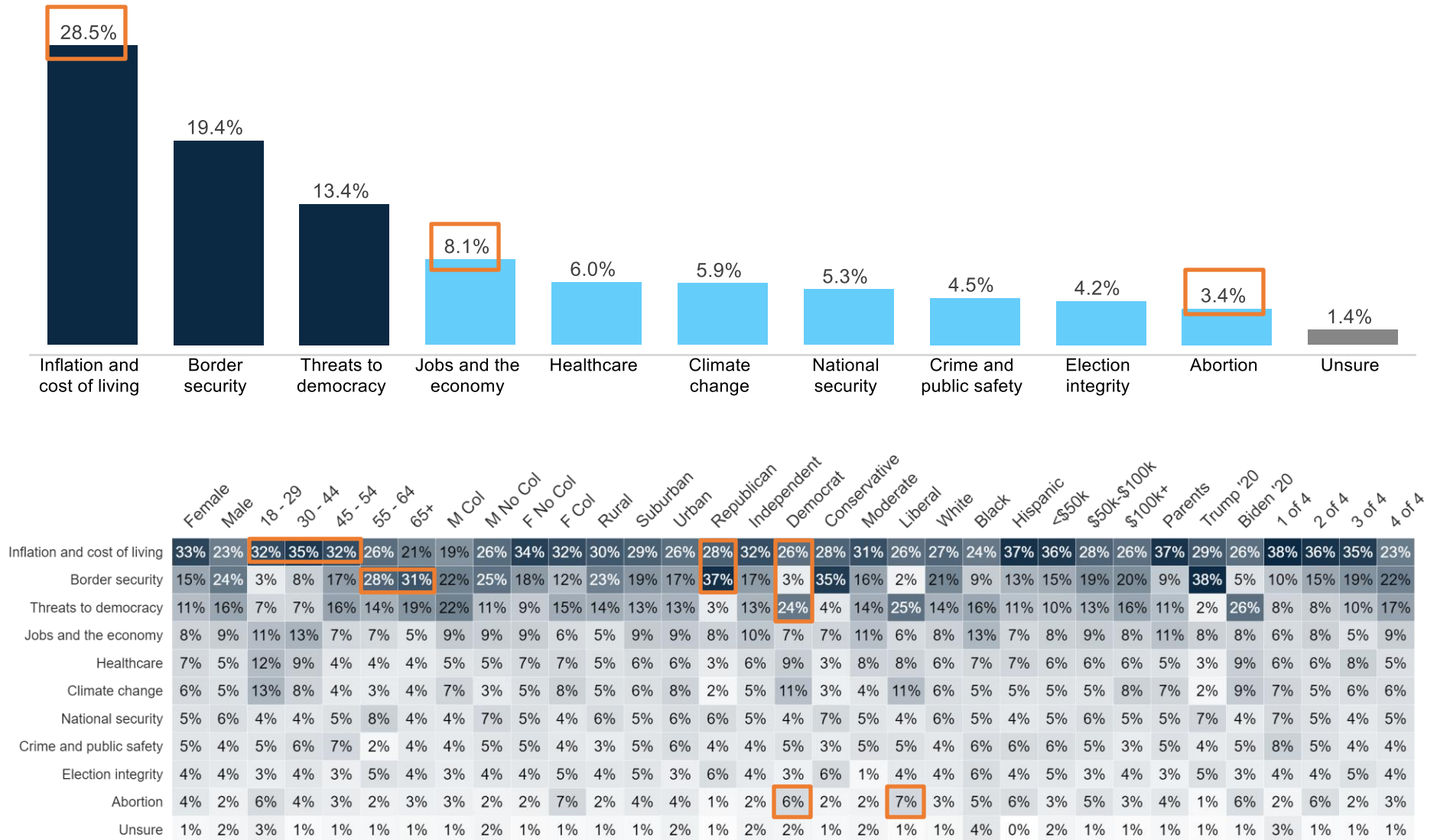
Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Donald Trump?

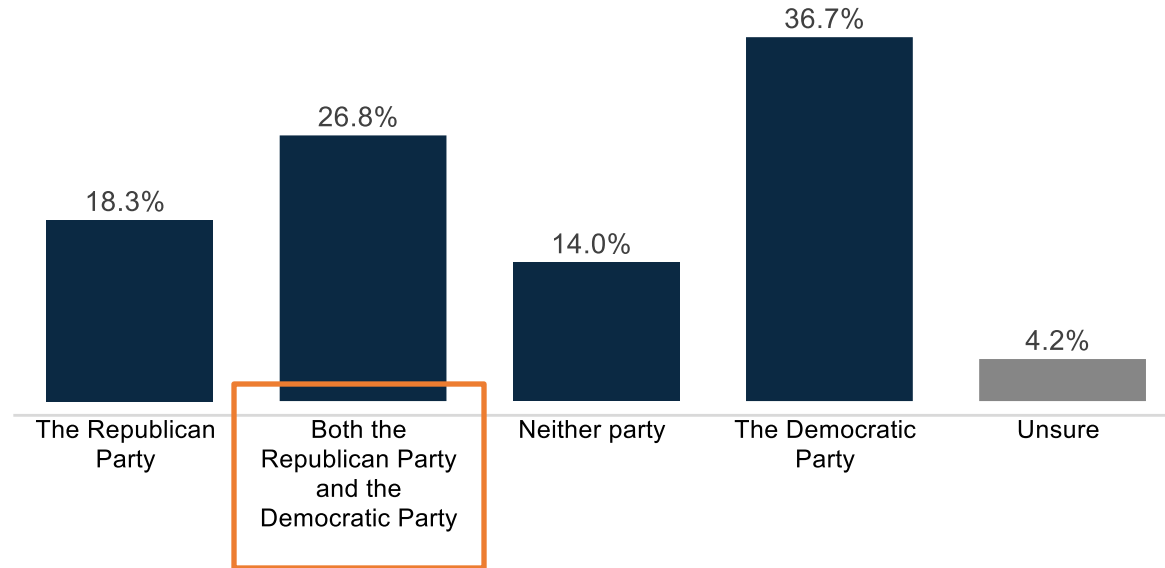

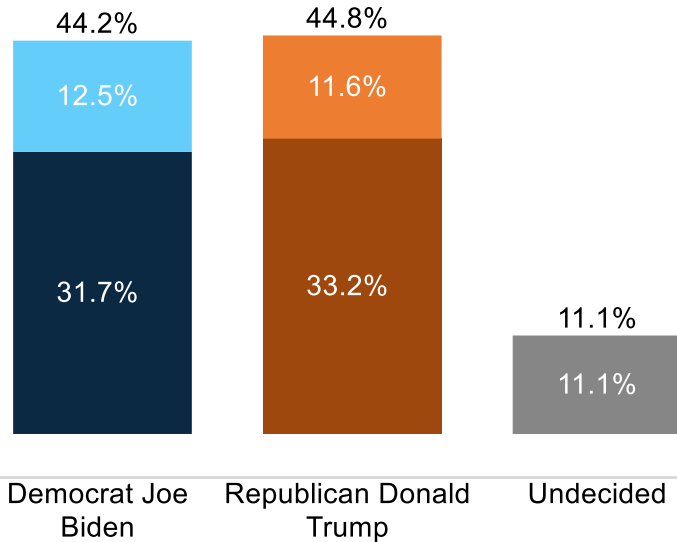

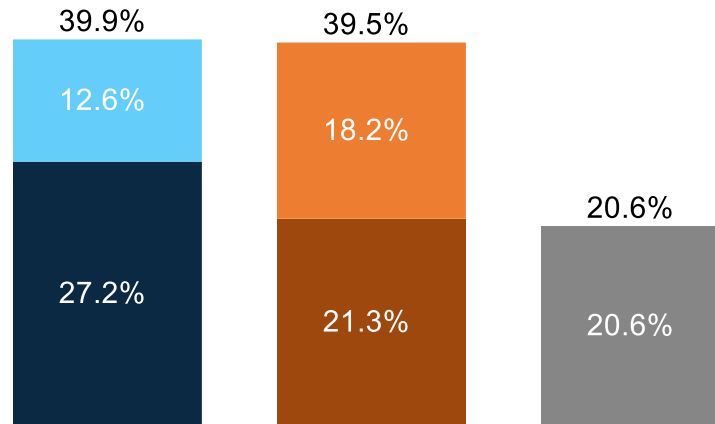

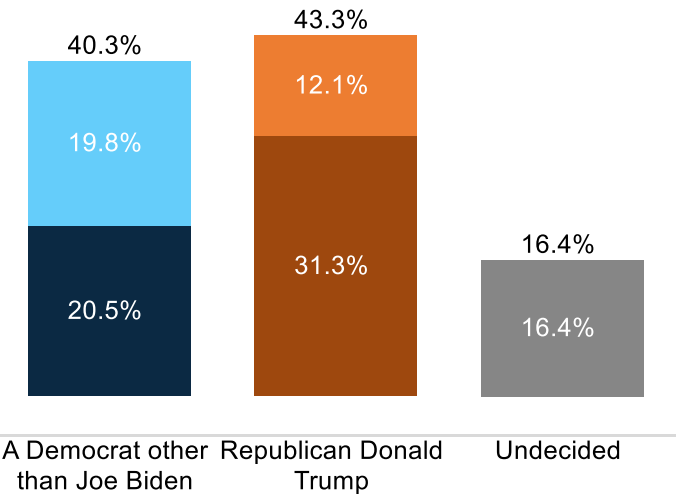

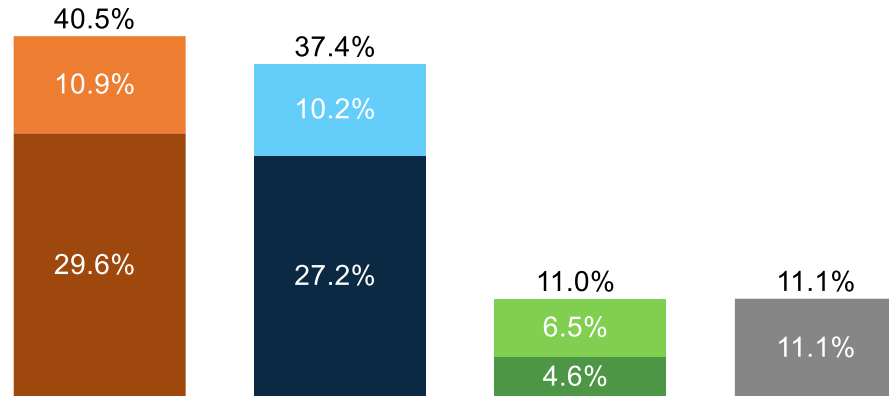

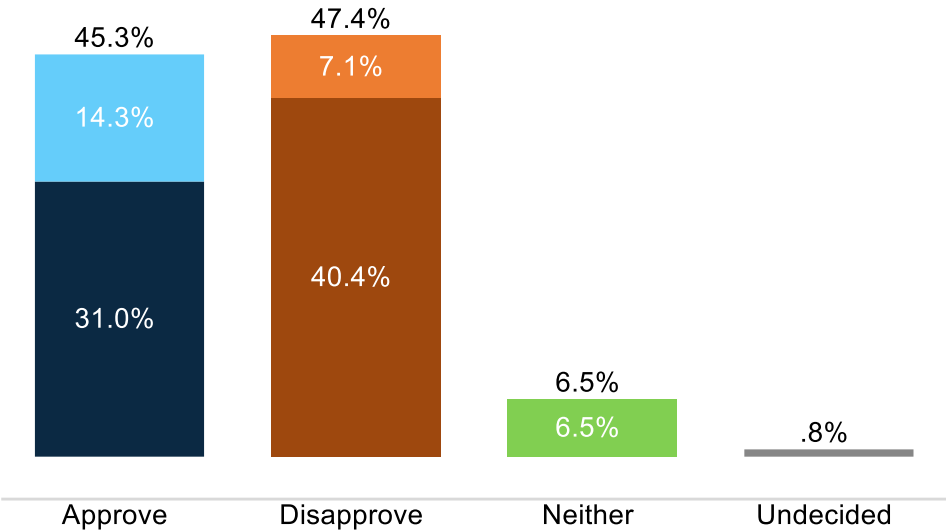

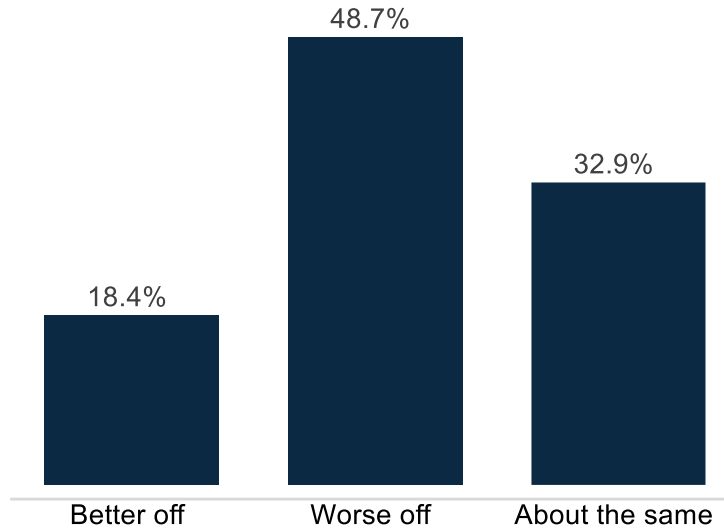

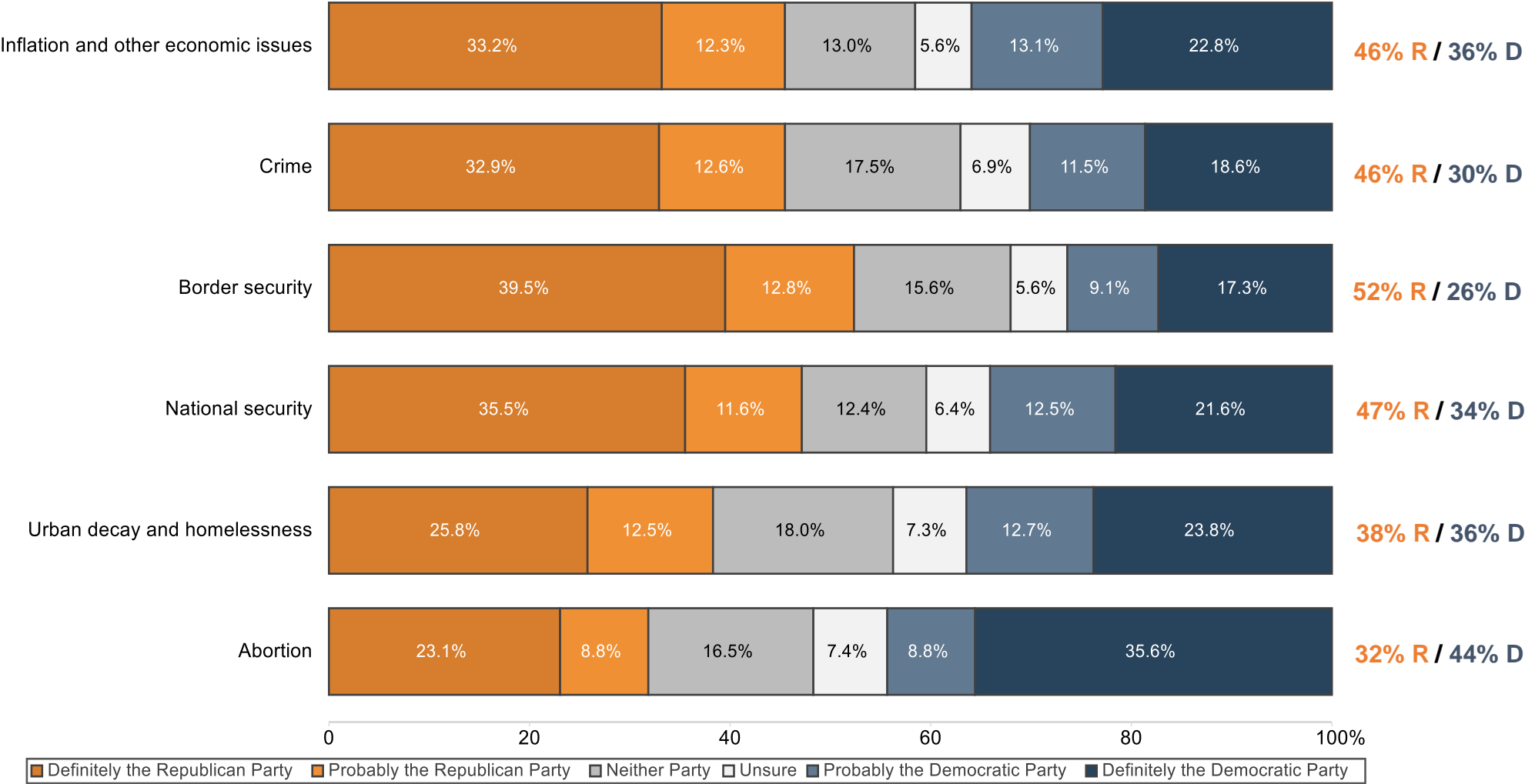

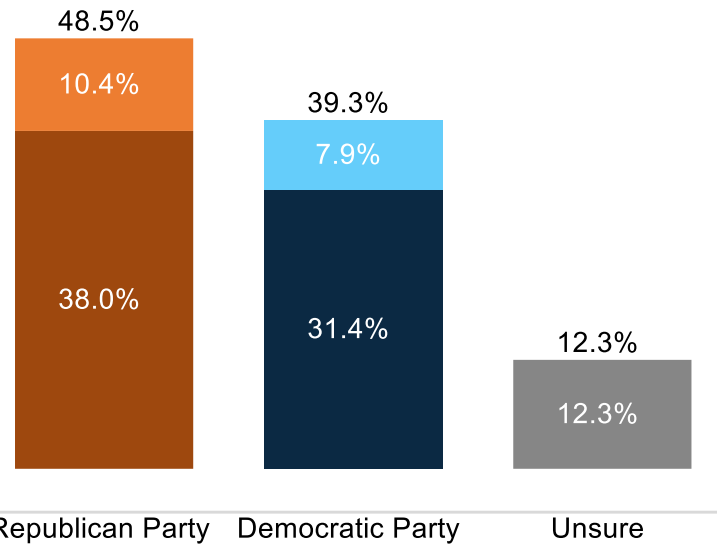

Which political party in the United States do you consider to be more extreme?



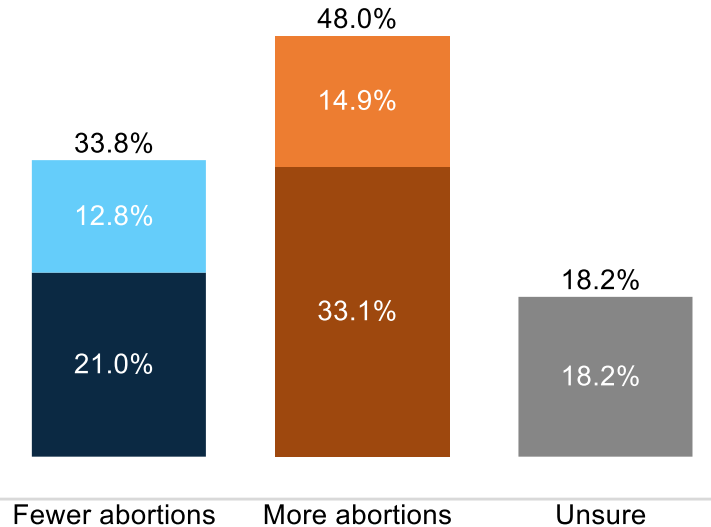


Abortion: State or National?



Would you say the issue of abortion is more of a national issue that should be addressed by the federal government, or a local issue that should be addressed by individual states?

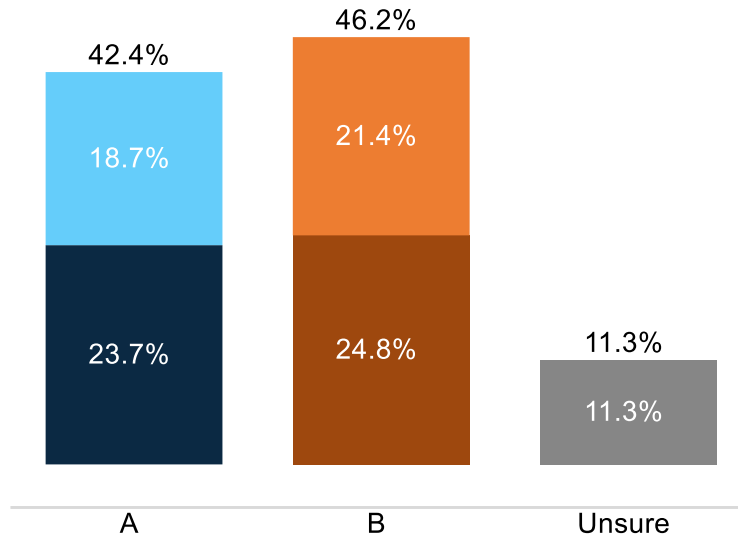

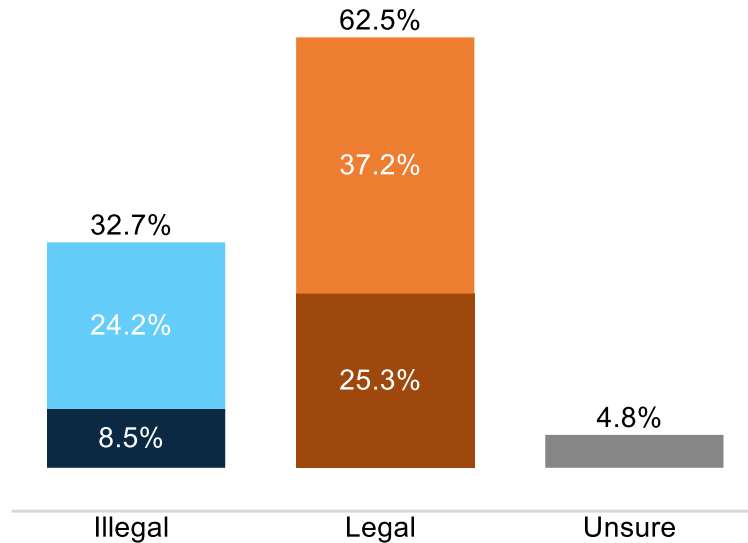
