# **Insights & Analysis**

- The nation's mood remains a steady bleak as 64% of voters say the U.S. is on the wrong track. Joe Biden's image (-18 net favorable; same as March) is holding steadily underwater, with 47% of voters continuing to have a very unfavorable opinion.
  - Donald Trump (-14 net fav; 3% worse since March) dropped in favorability, particularly among voters over 55. He is 3 points more favorable with Independents than Biden.
- The Biden-Trump rematch shows **Trump increasing his lead to +2** (Trump 47% Biden 45%), a slight increase from the +1 lead that he has held since January.
  - Since last month, Independents have flipped back to Trump (41% Biden 38% -Undecided 21%), with Trump having a +6 lead among those definitely voting for either candidate.
- Trump leads +7 against a Democrat other than Biden (+2 since March; Trump 45% Non-Biden Dem 38%), but Independents are now with a non-Biden Democrat (Trump 38% - Non-Biden 40% - Undecided 23%) despite being split last month.
- On the **full presidential ballot**, **Trump** remains steady at **+3** (Trump 42%, Biden 39%, Kennedy 9%). Stein and West each get less than 2%, and 8% are undecided.
  - 18% of Independents support Kennedy, but Trump now leads among Independents on the full ballot: 31% for Trump, 29% for Biden.
  - With Kennedy presented as a **Libertarian** candidate, the ballot doesn't move, and he loses 1% support overall and remains at 18% support among Independents.
- **Hispanics** have driven further into **illegal immigration** as it's now **nearly tied** as their **top issue** (25%; was 17% in Mar.) with inflation / economy (27%). The latter dropped from 42% in March.
- We identified a segment knowns as the Ticked-Off, Diverse, Young Working-Class that is 18% of voters, and they hold the keys to the White House and Congress.

## Insights & Analysis – Cont.

- Republicans continue to lead R+2 on the generic Congressional ballot. Hispanic voters have swung 2 points more towards Republicans.
  - 43% of voters continue to say Republicans are more extreme, including 34% of Independent voters, while 38% say the same for Democrats, including 30% of Independents. The parties had been tied since the beginning of the year.
- Half of voters have a favorable opinion of Ukraine's leadership (30% unfav), with most support coming from Democrats (73% fav) and opposition coming from Republicans (47% unfav).
  - A third of Republicans find Ukraine's leadership favorable, while Independents are most split (41% fav 37% unfav).
- Inflation and the economy (27%) remains the top priority for voters while illegal immigration (25%) still rides as a close second.
  - Republicans drive the illegal immigration concern while Independents drive the economic concerns. Democrats are much more dispersed in their issue set.
- 91% of voters are at least somewhat concerned with inflation's impact on their household, with most of the concerns coming from younger women, Republicans, and parents.
  - Voters are split on their expectations for household finances in the next few years with 34% expecting things to get better, 31% worse, and 26% stay the same.
- Regarding the **best indicator for a good economy**, 28% say when **things are cheaper to buy**, 22% say when they aren't struggling financially, 15% say low employment. If voters had to deal with an unexpected expense, the most common ways to deal with it would be to pay for it with a **non-retirement savings and still have some left over** (31%) or put it on a **credit card** (22%).




### Insights & Analysis – Segmentation Analysis

- Segmentation analysis identified three groups via machine-learning:
  - <u>Democratic Base</u> (40%) includes a higher share of voters <45 than the GOP Base and skews much more female. Ideologically, they are more center-left than the all-in conservatism seen in the GOP Base segment, but they naturally support the generic Democrat overwhelmingly. Unlike the other groups, these voters tend to think the U.S. is heading in the right direction and view Biden favorably. Threats to democracy – an issue barely registers among *Ticked-Off, Diverse, Young Working-Class* – is their top issue.
  - <u>Ticked-Off, Diverse, Young Working-Class</u> (18%) lean heavily Republican on the generic ballot but are more ideologically moderate than the *GOP Base*. They skew more female, tend to be younger than 45, and a majority voted for Trump in 2020. Both Trump and Biden's images are deep underwater, Trump more so. The main difference from the *GOP Base* is that this group is much more inflation-focused, while illegal immigration and healthcare are distant secondary and tertiary priorities. Despite aligning well with the *GOP Base* group, these moderate voters are slightly more likely to view the Republican Party as more extreme.
  - <u>GOP Base</u> (43%) includes a higher share of voters 45+ than the *Democratic Base* segment and is much older than the *Ticked-Off, Diverse, Young Working-Class* group (which tends to be <45). They skew male and are staunchly conservative ideologically. They are much more likely to turn out on Election Day than to vote early compared to the other groups. Illegal immigration is their top issue, but inflation and the economy are top-of-mind for these voters.</li>






# **US Direction**



Generally speaking, would you say things in the United States are headed in the right direction or off on the wrong track?




If the November 5th general election was held today, and you had to make a choice, would you vote for the Republican or Democratic candidate for U.S. Congress?









How often do you vote in general elections held in November of each even-numbered year?
