Survey of Likely General Election Voters Oklahoma Statewide

April 11 – 12, 2024 | n=615 | $\pm 3.83\%$

Insights & Analysis

- Most Oklahomans believe the state is going in the right direction.
- **Trump leads Biden 2:1 head-to-head** in Oklahoma (61% – 30%), a lead which **expands** on the full ballot where Biden only receives 24% ballot share.
- **Trump** is the elected official **viewed most favorably in the state** followed by Senator Lankford (45% fav / 36% unfav), Governor Stitt (45% fav / 46% unfav), and Senator Mullin (40% fav / 35% unfav). Women over 55 in Oklahoma are **25 points more positive** on Trump than at the **national level**.
- Oklahomans want their **state government** to focus on **inflation and the economy** (37%) and **education** (26%). Border security and illegal immigration was third at 22%.
 - **Republicans say inflation and border security** while Democrats and Independents are more concerned with inflation and education.
- Oklahomans **overwhelmingly support aligning graduation requirements to career pathways**. Over **70% of Republicans and Democrats** support the proposal.
- A plurality (47% yes) of Oklahomans initially support an **increase to the minimum wage** when hearing about the potential ballot initiative in its simplest form (44% no).
 - But **opposition rises** (32% support – **57% oppose**) when voters are informed of the potential **loss of jobs** to automation and **increased costs** to consumers.
 - **Support** for the minimum wage increase proposal **decreases the most** after being informed about **potential job losses and increased cost to consumers** with women <55, rural voters, Independents, and those in the eastern part of the state.
- Voters are **in the middle** when it comes to the issue of free trade.

Insights & Analysis

- 62% support **Governor Stitt's** decision to send Oklahoma National Guard troops to the **southern border** (47% *strongly* support).
- Even more favor a **harder line** taken by the federal government on the issue of immigration. **Half** of voters overall want to see the U.S. enforce current immigration law and **deport those here illegally** while **another quarter** want to bring a **halt to all immigration** into the country until the border is secure.
 - **Democrats** (42%) and Biden 2020 supporters (36%) are the only groups in **opposition** of stricter enforcement.
- When it comes to social issues, two-thirds of voters **support Oklahoma's law requiring students to use the bathroom of their gender assigned at birth** and a **plurality** (43%) **support the repeal of DEI programs** from Oklahoma's public schools and universities. On the issue of abortion, half of voters **oppose** (40% support) the state **law which banned abortion in all cases** except to save the life of the mother. In contrast, **Republicans support the abortion ban** (59%).
- Voters 2:1 **oppose businesses speaking out publicly** on political and social **issues**, including 55% of Independents.
 - Nearly half say it would impact their decision **a lot** to support a business if they took a public stance on a social or political issue different than their own. **Trump Republicans** (60% a lot of impact) feel most strongly about this issue. Interestingly, men are more likely to say it'll have an impact on their decision than are women.
 - A **majority** of voters **across the spectrum** from Trump to Biden supporters, urban to rural voters, and whites/non-whites would all **boycott a business** for taking a stand on a social or political issue different than their own.


Insights & Analysis

- Machine-learning generated four segmentation analysis groups:
 - **Solid Republicans** (39%) are **least supportive** of **minimum wage hikes** and businesses taking stands on social/political issues. As you would expect, they are the **most ideologically conservative** and take the most conservative stands on virtually every issue. However, more favor protections for American workers over unfettered free trade. They are also the most likely to support a **business boycott**. They are **older** – 64% are over the age of 55, and 59% are **male**. *Solid Republicans* are **less educated** than their *Solid Democrats* counterparts, but they report **higher levels of income** and are the **highest propensity** voters. Half live in a rural community and they are **nearly unanimous** (95%) in support of a hardline position on immigration.
 - **Lean Republican** (24%) voters are **less focused on immigration and more focused on inflation and economic issues**. However, 94% support the hardline stance on immigration. *Lean Republican* voters are more moderate and female but **more socially conservative** than *Solid Republicans* on the issue of **abortion** and **pornography** which makes sense since they're also the **most Evangelical** and **most Catholic** of all segments. They are **initially supportive of an increase to the minimum wage** but move against after learning of the implications to Oklahoma businesses and economy. They're supportive of Trump but **less Trumpy**.

Insights & Analysis

- Machine-learning generated four segmentation analysis groups:
 - **Solid Democrats** (28%) look the **opposite** of *Solid Republicans*. 57% of them are **female** and 58% are **younger than 55**. ***Solid Democrats*** are the most suburban and most urban segment. They are also the **most educated** and have mostly liberal views on business and economics though they are **less skeptical of free trade** than *Solid Republicans*. They are **most supportive** of the **minimum wage increase** and remain largely supportive after hearing of potential impacts of it could have on Oklahoma businesses and economy.
 - **Lean Democrat** (9%) voters have a **higher opinion** of Donald Trump (36% favorable) than Joe Biden (30% favorable) however they still have a **slight preference** for Biden on the ballot and prefer a Democratic candidate 3:1 on the generic ballot. *Lean Democrat* voters are the **most supportive of RFK**. They are **hyper-focused on inflation and the economy** as nearly 6 in 10 claim it as their top issue. They are initially +40 in support of the minimum wage increase but move to -6 after learning it could lead to potential job losses and higher costs for consumers. **More than half** identify as **Moderate**. *Lean Democrat* voters are the **lowest propensity, least educated, and lowest income** of all the segments.







Generic Ballot










Image Tests Heatmap – Favorable (Overall)




Image Tests Heatmap – Unfavorable (Overall)








Image Tests Heatmap - Favorable (Trump GOP)














