



Survey of Likely General Election Voters National

June 4 – 6, 2024 | n=1500 | ±2.53%



- Voters are less pessimistic about the nation's direction compared to May 8% net-positive shift in the direction of the country, but two-thirds of voters continues to have a grim outlook.
 - Despite this poll happening after the verdict, unfavorable opinions of Donald Trump (42% fav, 54% unfav; 4% NO/NHO) are less intense than last month—there was a 1% decrease in those viewing him *very* unfavorably.
 - Joe Biden's image (38% fav, 58% unfav; 4% NO/NHO) continues to be 20 points underwater with voters, and Democrats' view of him has net shifted 6 points since May.
- The **generic ballot** (tied at 45%) has **tightened** to a dead heat heading into the summer as both parties set their sights on the 10-15% of persuadable voters who will decide this election.
- In a head-to-head showdown, Trump's lead over Biden moved from a 1-point lead to a 2-point lead.
 - Women without degrees—a key voting group—have flipped to Biden (+2). However, Trump is breaking through to traditional Democrat strongholds: college-educated men (+10 since May), where the ballot is now tied; college-educated women (+3 since May), where Biden's support has decreased by 5%; and black voters (+6 since May).
- On the full presidential ballot, voters continue to consolidate around partisan options as ballot share for both Trump and Biden improved equally overall while third-party candidates saw further decline.



- Since last month, Trump's support among swing voters has increased by 5%, but Independents have flipped, with Biden now holding a 2% lead.
- Abortion (4%) falls to the least important priority for voters five months out from the election, a bad omen for Democrats hoping the issue will be their golden ticket to the White House.
 - Inflation and the economy are on the top of voters' minds again, followed by illegal immigration as the impact of Biden's failed policies is felt.
- Voters believe Trump's policies are better for their lives than Biden's by a 5-point margin, including a plurality of independents (38%) and Hispanics (44%).
- For the first time since February, the Republican Party is *not* seen as more extreme than the Democrat Party. As the label of extremism has eased for Republicans by 2 points, it has grown more applicable to Democrats by the same amount.
 - In May, black voters viewed the Republican Party as more extreme by a 31-point margin.
 Republicans closed that gap by 25 points in the last month alone.
 - College-educated women are 7% more sour on the Democrat Party compared to May, as are college-educated men (+).
 - By a 10-point margin, voters, including a plurality (37%) of college-educated voters, are apt to believe the convictions will help Trump's chances of re-election this November.

- Nearly one-out-of-every-four voters does not know who controls the U.S. Senate or the U.S. House.
- Amid the escalating strength and assertiveness of America's foreign adversaries, 85% of voters want lawmakers to take action on national security. A plurality (41%) endorsed greater investment in cybersecurity and intelligence capabilities as the best strategy.
 - Half of voters with unfavorable opinions of both Trump/Biden a/k/a "Double Haters" prefer international cooperation over other options, although cybersecurity is a close runner-up.
- A near majority of voters (49%) would support some form of mandatory national service for 18-year-olds in the United States.
 - Among those who stand to be the most immediately impacted, a plurality (33%) of parents do not support mandatory national service and are 10% more likely to oppose it than voters without children.
- More than one-out-of-every-three voters expected Trump to be guilty on all counts in the hushmoney trial; however, after the convictions, voters are less likely to view the cases against Trump as legitimate legal proceedings compared to May (-4 *definitely* legitimate, +4 *definitely* witch hunt).
- Ironically, Democrat's efforts to convict Trump for his "threats to democracy" have jeopardized trust in the legal system and the strength of democracy – a plurality (42%) have decreased trust in the system (33% significantly decreased trust).

- Biden, whose credibility with voters on illegal immigration policy is next to nil, fails to change public opinion following the announcement of his latest executive action on the border.
 - Voters are 2% less likely to support Biden overall, and nearly half of the country says his action makes no difference to them.
 - Nearly two-thirds of Americans view Biden's 2,500-person limit on daily border crossings as ineffective or unable to make a difference, including independent and Hispanic voters by a 2:1 margin.
- Kendrick Lamar won the recent viral rap feud with Drake by a nearly 4:1 margin.
 - Hispanic voters (15%) and women under 30 (15%) are the most likely to believe that Drake won the rap battle.
- Apple dominates the smartphone market. Two-thirds of American voters primarily use iPhones, more than double the number of all other phones.
 - Overall, women are more likely than men to use iPhones. However, women under 30 (85%) use iPhones at an 11% higher rate than their male counterparts and 12% higher than the next highest age group for women.


Segmentation analysis identified four groups via machine learning: Dem Base (26%), Lean Dem Supporter (24%), GOP Base (35%), and Lean GOP Supporters (15%).



- Lean Dem Supporters skew female (63%) and tend to be the youngest, with more than a third under 30. They are the most likely to live in the Midwest (26%). They tend to be the most employed group (90%). A majority (51%) are single, but this segment is also the most likely to be parents (35%). This segment is the most likely to support RFK on the full presidential ballot (19%).
- Lean GOP Supporters skew female (63%) and tend to be the least likely to hold a college degree.
 They are the lowest propensity segment of any group and tend to be more moderate than the GOP Base. This group is the most concentrated on inflation and the economy as their top issue.



Vote Method





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How do you plan to vote in the November 5th general election for President, U.S. Congress, and state offices?





Generally speaking, do you think of yourself as a Democrat, Republican, or Independent?





Generally speaking, would you say things in the United States are headed in the right direction or off on the wrong track?




If the November 5th general election was held today, and you had to make a choice, would you vote for the Republican or Democratic candidate for U.S. Congress?







Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the New York City legal system?












Full Presidential



If the 2024 general election for President was held today, and you had to make a choice based on these options, who would you vote for?




Trump v. Biden Policy Contrast



As you think about the 2024 general election for President, which candidate's policies are better for you and your life?






Which political party in the United States do you consider to be more extreme?






National Service



The British Prime Minister recently proposed the idea of requiring 18-year-olds to take part in mandatory national service. The plan would give young people a choice between a full-time placement in the armed forces for one year or spending one weekend a month for one year serving in their community. 









Do you believe that the legal cases against former President Trump are legitimate legal proceedings, or do you view them as politically motivated "witch hunts" aimed at discrediting him?




Trend: Trump Cases Legit or Witch Hunt
