Insights & Analysis

- Based on Cygnal's award-winning Non-Response-Bias-Adjusted-Turnout (NRBAT) methodology that looks at who screens out of surveys and how that changes over time by voter group, we have adjusted the turnout environment for the upcoming election.
 - Since Joe Biden dropped out and was replaced by Kamala Harris, we have seen
 Democrats erase the Republican turnout gap. And among new voters and those with
 a lower history of voting in elections, lower-propensity Democrats are now much more
 likely to vote than lower-propensity Republicans. Because of this, we have adjusted
 our electorate slightly to the left so that the recalled ballot matches closer to the 2020
 presidential election results. We also increased the share in our poll of those that did not
 vote in the 2020 general election along with expecting more younger voters.
- The general election environment remains tight. Republicans maintain an R+1 advantage, and despite the glowing mainstream media coverage and advertising advantage for Harris, she remains statistically tied with Trump on both the full (Trump 44 – Harris 46) and head-to-head ballots (Trump 47 – Harris 49).
 - Harris' slightly increased margins are driven mostly by college-educated men and Independents moving further in her direction since last month.
- RFK, Jr. dropping out and endorsing Trump provides Trump a small topline net benefit. 47% says it doesn't make a difference in their decision.
 - Digging deeper, RFK, Jr. dropping out and endorsing Trump made 49% of Trump 2020 voters more likely to support Trump and 45% of Biden 2020 voters more likely to support Harris.
 - Importantly, when we look at those who did not vote in 2020 (9% of voters), Trump gets a bigger bump among voters who did not vote in 2020. With RFK, Jr.'s exit from the race and subsequent endorsement of Trump, they're 32% more likely to support Trump compared to only being 25% more likely to vote for Harris.



Insights & Analysis


- Harris continues to be viewed more positively than Trump, and there was little change in either of their images from last month.
 - Notably, under the hood, Harris' image among Independents net shifted 12 points, going from a -6 net favorability to +6.
- Now that Walz has been in the national media spotlight, his name ID has increased significantly, and he's still viewed net positively overall (+5). Vance's image remained mostly stable during the same period but did drop marginally (-2).
 - It's worth highlighting that for two vice presidential candidates picked in part for their ability to appeal to rural voters, only one is viewed net favorably by 15 points in the rural parts of the country, and the other is Tim Walz who is 20 points underwater with the same group of voters. Yikes.
- Half of voters consider Walz' statement that he "carried weapons in war" though he's never served in a combat zone as an act of stolen valor. That sentiment is largely driven by men, rural voters, Republicans, swing voters, parents, and married voters.
- With inflation and economy growing its top spot in the issue matrix, we delved deeper to see how rising prices are impacting voters and who they blame for them.
 - The top four **most intensely felt impacts of inflation** among voters are on groceries/food, utilities, transportation, and discretionary spending.
 - Nearly half of voters (46%) blame the Democratic party's policies for the rising costs of inflation which isn't great for Harris considering over two-thirds of voters hold her at least somewhat responsible for the Biden-Harris administration's policies.
 - 24% of men say Harris is fully responsible for the Biden-Harris administration's policies compared to only 18% of women.



Insights & Analysis

- Half of voters trust the security of voting by mail completely (32%) or at least somewhat (19%) compared to 46% of voters who have some concerns (18%) or don't trust it at all (28%).
 - There is **notable partisan, racial, and community type divides** with Republicans, white voters, and rural voters being less likely to trust the security of voting by mail and Democrats, minority voters, and voters living in urban and suburban areas showing more trust.
- There's a lot less trust overall in the media's coverage of the presidential campaign and candidates. Most voters (62%) don't trust it at all or only trust it "a little."
- Segmentation analysis via machine learning identified four electoral groups: Low-Propensity GOP (12%), High-Propensity GOP (38%), Low-Propensity Dem (23%), and High-Propensity Dem (27%).
- The Low-Propensity GOP segment is more moderate, younger, racially diverse, lower income, likely to be single, and less religious than the *High-Propensity GOP* segment. These voters are also more likely to trust the media's coverage of the presidential campaigns compared to the *High-Propensity GOP* segment. Another notable difference between the two GOP segments is that these voters trust the security of voting by mail, whereas the *High-Propensity GOP* segment does not—at all.
- The Low-Propensity GOP segment is laser focused on inflation and the economy while the Hight Propensity GOP segment divides its attention between inflation and the economy and illegal immigration. This is the segment that RFK, Jr. dropping out and endorsing Trump makes the most significant difference – it makes them 69% more likely to support Trump.
- The Low-Propensity Dem segment is more female, younger, conservative, religious, lower income, racially diverse, likely to be single, and less educated than the High-Propensity Dem segment. A distinct difference between the Low-Propensity Dem segment and the High-Propensity Dem segment is what they prioritize in the issue matrix. The Low-Propensity Dem segment is focused on inflation and the economy, whereas the High Propensity Orgonation CYGNAL Dem segment's top issue is threats to democracy.


Vote Method



How do you plan to vote in the November 5th general election for President, U.S. Congress, and state offices?




Trend: Vote Method




US Direction



Generally speaking, would you say things in the United States are headed in the right direction or off on the wrong track?




If the November 5th general election was held today, and you had to make a choice, would you vote for the Republican or Democratic candidate for U.S. Congress?






Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Tim Walz?






How would you describe Kamala Harris' political ideology and beliefs?

Trend: Harris Ideology






Trump Ideology



How would you describe Donald Trump's political ideology and beliefs?










Trump v Harris Policy Contrast

Trend: Trump v Harris (Biden) Policy Contrast










Trump v. Harris Debate Projected Winner



Who do you think will win the upcoming September 10th debate between Donald Trump and Kamala Harris?










