 As of October 26th, 34% of Americans have voted, including 29% of Republicans, 40% of Democrats, and 33% of Independents.

- Our poll currently projects 36% to vote on EDay, 36% early, and 28% by mail.
- In 2020 according to MIT, 28% voted on EDay, 25% early, and 46% by mail.
- In 2022 according to MIT, 43% voted on EDay, 21% early, and 36% by mail.
- The overall political environment has tightened from R+2 on the generic ballot to tied at 48%.
 - Swing voters have shifted 7 points away from Republicans but aren't moving to a generic Democrat - they're just more unsure.
- On the full ballot Harris' lead over Trump has narrowed from +2 in early-October to +1 now (46 45). The two-way presidential ballot remains unchanged, with Harris leading by 3 (50 47) nationally.
 - Harris's ballot share among men has been stagnant since September. Trump added 3
 points with male voters while holding steady with women.

- Harris only leads by +4 over Trump among union members and those with a union member in the household.
- Voters under 30 have become more disenchanted with the major candidates, shifting 8 points towards third-party options and becoming slightly more undecided.
- The most movement occurred in the 55 64 and 45 54 age ranges:
 - Among older Gen Xers and younger Boomers (55 64), Harris picked up some ground since the beginning of the month, moving the full ballot from Trump +8 to Harris+1.
 - But it's middle-aged voters (45 54) where Trump's been able to shake things up and gain some serious ground – from Harris +3 to Trump +14.
- Harris picked up a net 3 points of support among voters in urban areas, but that's dwarfed by
 Trump's net 12-point gain in rural areas. Oddly, suburban voters shifted 3 points away
 from Trump towards third-party options, which has muted some of Trump's rural rise.
- From early-October to now, Walz' net image has dropped from +4 to net even (45 fav, 45 unfav) driven in part by the rural voters (-14 net fav decrease) Walz was recruited to help with.
 - Walz is even hurting with Dem-leaning demographics too college-educated women (-13 net fav decrease) and younger women (-17 net fav decrease).
- In the last month, voters' views about who they believe will win the election has changed a
 good amount from Harris +3 to Trump +3.
- 64% of voters view Harris' ideology as liberal, but there's been a sharp uptick in urban voters (+13), Independents (+9), and black voters (+10) believing she's more of a moderate.



- While voters had viewed Harris's policies as better for their lives at the beginning of the month, it's now a toss-up – with a slim edge for Trump (+0.6)
 - Groups Democrats are relying on to show up for Harris young women (+8 net shift in Trump's favor) and college educated women (+11 net shift in Trump's favor) – continue to view Trump's policies more favorable.
 - Parents are losing faith in Harris's ability to advocate for them and their families they net shifted 12 points in Trump's favor regarding whose policies are better for their lives (+5 Trump's; -7 Harris').
- A plurality of voters (47%) believe Harris has run the better campaign. There's a very clear gender gap where more than 50% of women think Harris' campaign has been better; 47% of men think Trump's campaign has been better. Older men are more likely to say neither has run the better campaign.
- A fifth of the electorate feels their vote won't make a difference in their communities –
 unsurprisingly driven by young voters, Independents, and Double Haters.
- Voters express an even more negative sentiment about how politicians address their needs a third of voters don't think candidates care about the needs or concerns of their peers – including the most consistent voters (3/4 and 4/4).
 - Notably, Independents are split at 47-46 this is the root of why they are independent. At
 the most basic level, they don't believe any candidate or lawmaker is looking out for
 them or others.
 - Black voters, who are notoriously distrustful of the political system, are more likely to agree that candidates care about their concerns than White or Hispanic voters by 11 points.




- When it comes to **voting style**, voters are **focused on the practical impact of their choices and the potential for reform**. With 54% of respondents prioritizing strategic thinking (30%) or reform/change (24%), voters are evaluating candidates based on how they can influence the landscape, either by fitting into broader objectives or by bringing fresh perspectives.
- Voters are more willing to trust local elections (72% confidence) in their state compared to less tangible national elections (59% confidence).
 - While most Republicans trust their state elections (61% confident), their confidence flips when it comes to the national election framework (62% not confident).
 - Independent voters are 8 points less confident in national elections emphasizing that
 electing Republicans nationally will protect and support the values and processes these
 voters trust at the state level could help bridge the confidence gap.
- A majority of voters are recalling ads about the border/immigration (63%), abortion (55%) and the cost of living (52%).
 - Social Security/Medicare ads are reaching older women the most (21%). In urban localities, crime (21%) ads are being recalled more than elsewhere. Black voters are recalling the most varied array of ads, but with healthcare (27%) and housing affordability (22%) popping the most outside of the top three issues.
- 55% of voters consider themselves pro-choice, 37% pro-life, only 8% unsure.
 - Among those who are pro-life or pro-choice, there's a 24-point enthusiasm gap in how "extremely important" the issue of abortion is when deciding who to vote for – only 35% of pro-life voters view it as extremely important compared to 59% of pro-choice voters.
 - 63% of independent voters consider themselves pro-choice, and abortion is an extremely important issue for 48% of them.

- Pro-life voters are 82-12 for Trump. Pro-choice voters are 72-19 for Harris. Voters unsure on whether they're pro-choice or pro-life are 49-30 for Trump.
- Machine-learning Segmentation Analysis found five groups of voters based on common characteristics and response options GOP Base (33%), Lean GOP (13%), Undecided/Ind (6%), Lean Dem (14%), and Dem Base (33%).
 - The Bases are older and wealthier, while the Leans are much younger and lower income.
 Undecided/Ind leans younger but isn't as young as the Lean segments.
 - Lean GOP are much more focused on economic issues than the GOP Base.
 - Lean Dem are much more focused on economic issues than the Dem Base.
 - Economic issues also drive a plurality of the Undecided/Ind segment.
 - Undecided/Ind are all over the place on the full presidential ballot, but when pushed, they
 are 70-30 for Harris. Interestingly a plurality thinks Trump will win, and they find both parties
 extreme. They are the least likely to think their vote matters, as evidenced by their thinner
 voter history. This group is more concentrated in the Northeast and West.






Trend: Vote Method






Percent Change: Vote Method (Oct 3 to Oct 26, '24)










Generic Ballot Movement









Generic Ballot by Key Voter Groups






Full Presidential Heatmap





Percent Change: Generic Ballot to Harris v Trump










Percent Change: Election Integrity - State to Country






