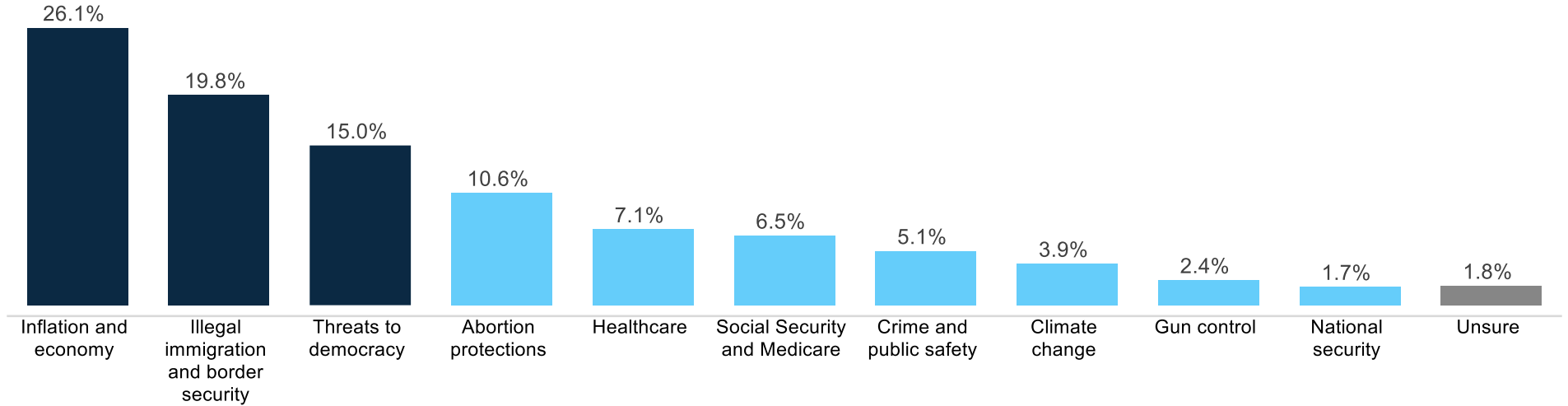
Survey of Likely General Election Voters **New Jersey Statewide**

October 23 – 24, 2024 | n=600 | $\pm 3.95\%$

Insights & Analysis

- The **Presidential** race stands at 40% **Donald Trump**, 52% **Kamala Harris** with 4% of voters choosing a third-party candidate and only 4% saying they are undecided.
 - **Donald Trump** is performing near his **2016** share (41.4%) and his **2020** share (41.4%).
 - Meanwhile, **Kamala Harris** is underperforming **Clinton's** ballot share in **2016** (55.5%) and **Biden's** share in **2020** (57.3%).
 - In 2024, Donald **Trump** is capturing more of the **Hispanic vote** (35%) than in **2016** (23%).
 - Harris over performs the generic Congressional ballot with **Republicans** (+3) and **Independents** (+4).
 - Despite Harris' over performance with these groups, **it will not be enough to close the gap of her underperformance from past Presidential elections.**
- The **Senate Ballot** stands at 51% **Andy Kim**, 32% **Curtis Bashaw** with 14% of voters saying they are undecided. Due to the low name recognition of Bashaw and a higher proportion of undecided voters in the U.S. Senate race, we incorporated generic ballot responses from these undecided voters to project the combined ballot results at 55% **Kim**, 38% **Bashaw**.
 - Donald **Trump's** image is **more favorable** with **undecided Senate voters** (48%) than Kamala **Harris'** (27%), which can help improve down ballot races and Bashaw's ballot share.
- **Segmentation analysis** identified three key voter segments: *Hard GOP* (40%), *Persuadable* (18%), and *Hard Dems* (42%).
 - The ***Persuadable*** segment is more **female, middle-income, non-college educated**, and **diverse** than the **Hard Dems** segment. Comparatively, they are also not as strong on having no abortion limitations. Their opinion on **Harris** is 60% **favorable**, 40% **unfavorable** while the **Hard Dems** segment has near universal favorability.

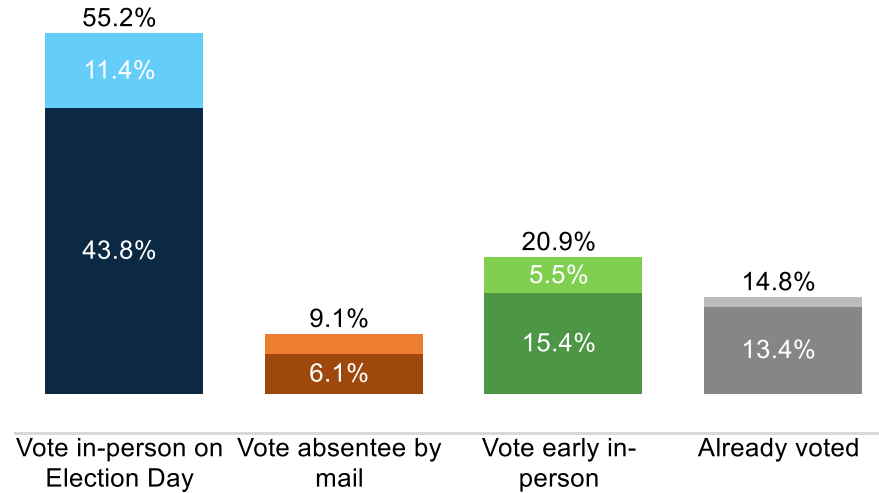

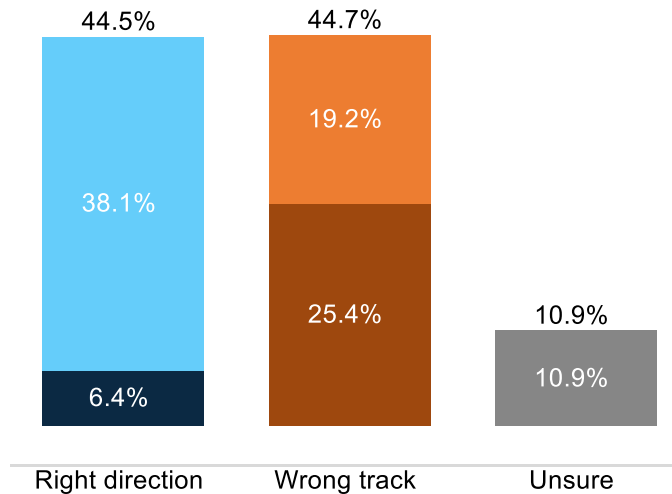

How do you plan to vote in the November 5th general election for President and U.S. Congress?

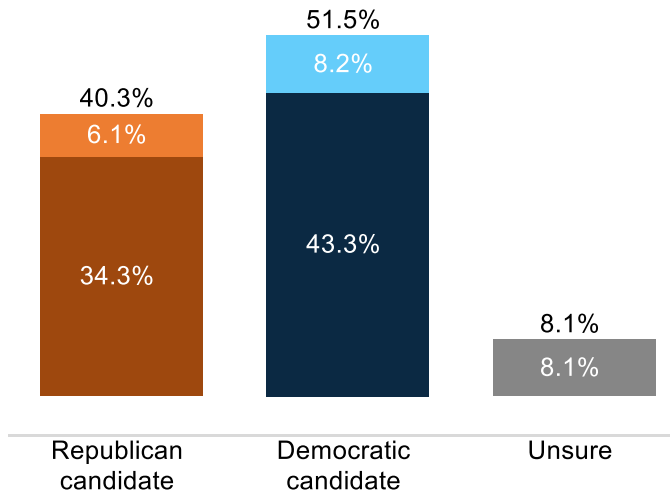

Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Kamala Harris?

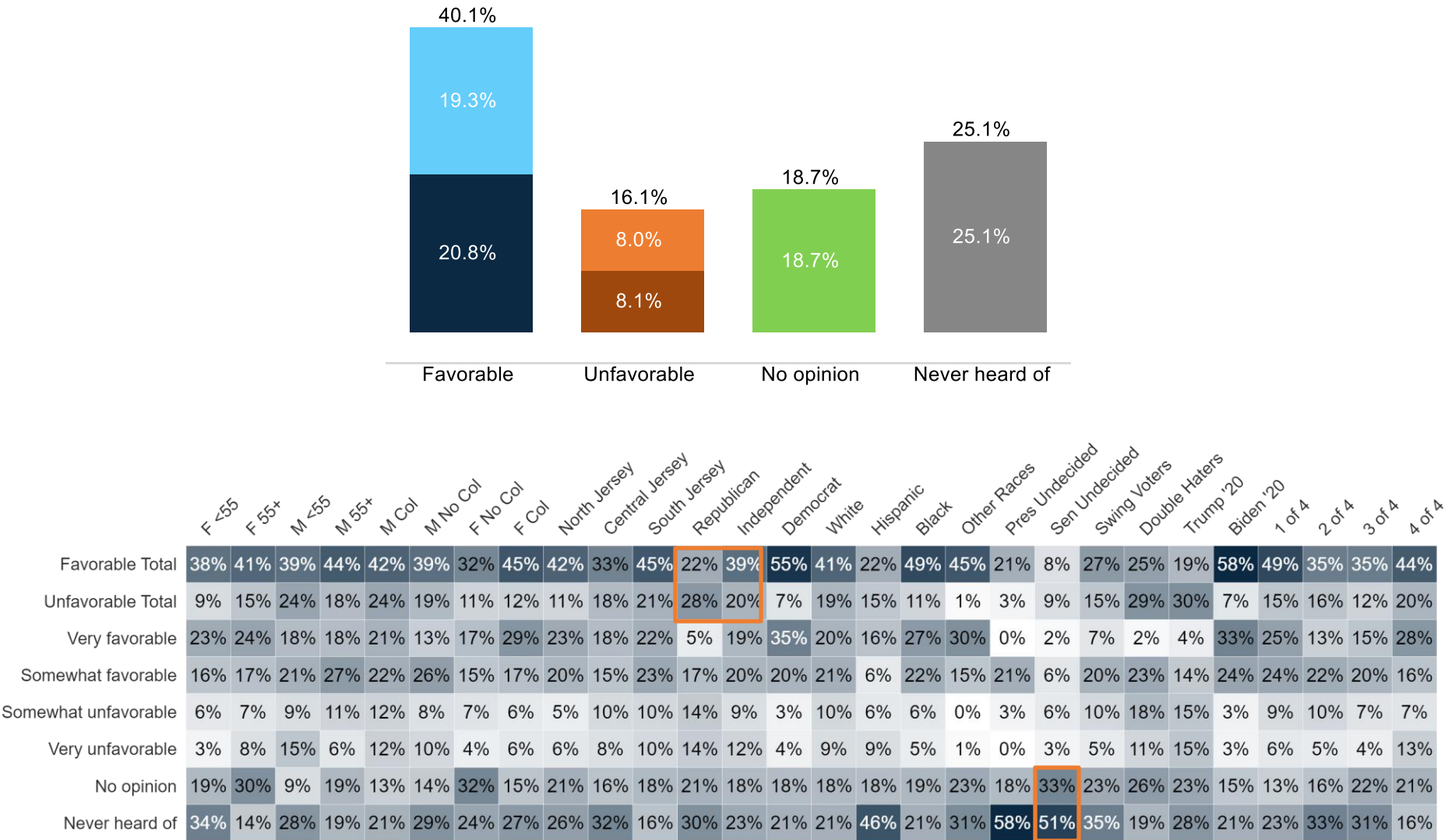

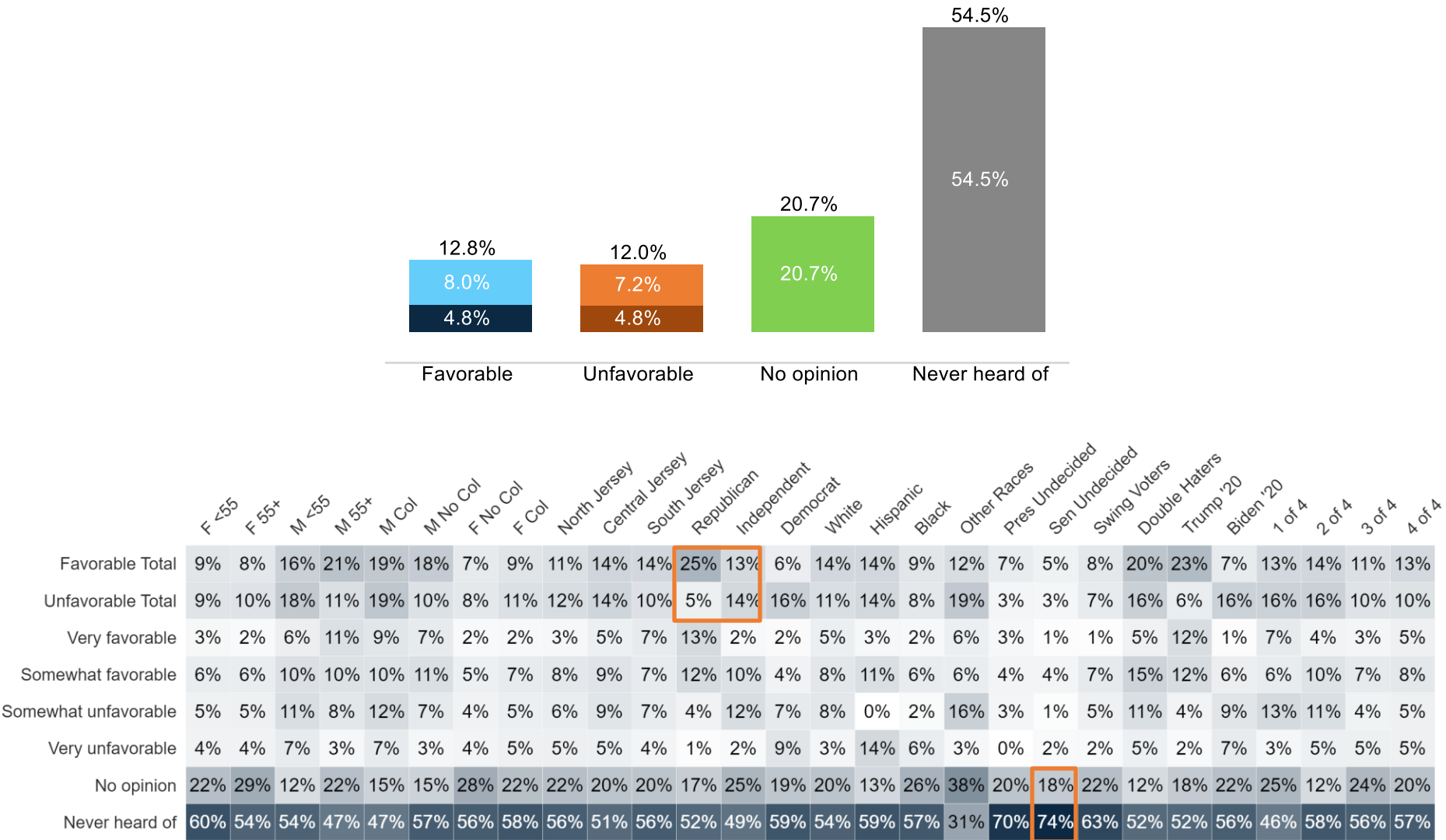
Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Donald Trump?

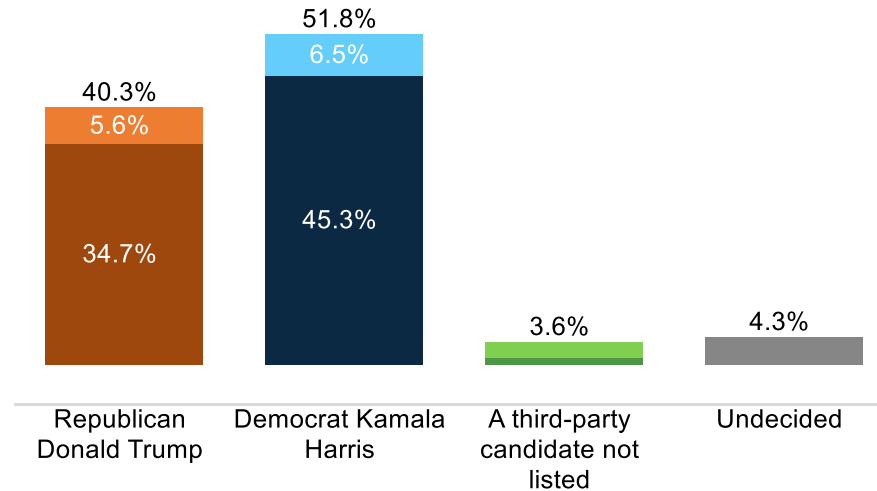
Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Andy Kim?

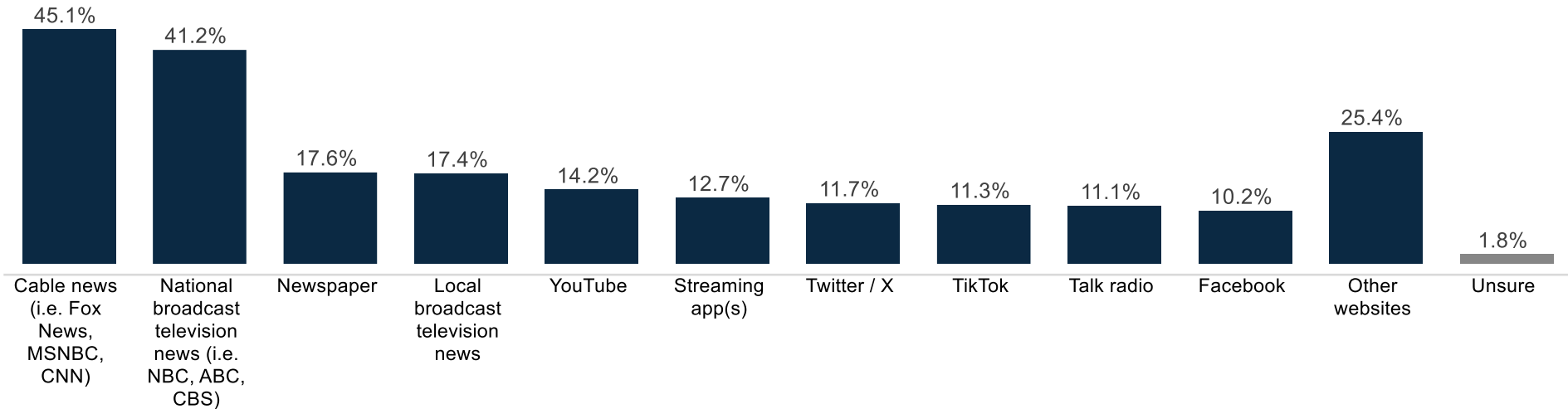
