


Insights & Analysis

- The **presidential** race stands at 69% **Donald Trump**, 27% **Kamala Harris**, with 2% of voters choosing a third-party candidate and another 2% undecided (**R+42**).
 - **Donald Trump** is performing near his **2016** share (68.2%) and his **2020** share (69.9%).
 - In contrast, Kamala Harris is running closer to Biden's ballot share in 2020 (26.6%) than Clinton's ballot share in 2016 (21.9%).
 - **Trump** is supported 2-to-1 by **Hispanic voters**. Exit polling data for Hispanic voters in the state is limited, but some estimates suggest this is as much as double the vote-share he had in 2020.
 - Harris's net image is -42 (28% fav / 70% unfav), the weakest of any figure tested.
- The U.S. Senate race stands at 67% John Barrasso, 23% Scott Morrow, and 10% undecided (R+44). Barrasso's lead is about on par with his margin of victory in 2018 when he defeated Gary Trauner (67–28).
 - **Trump's image** is **more favorable** with **undecided and third-party U.S. Senate voters** (58%) than **Harris**' (30%), which should help improve down-ballot races for Republicans.
- Environmentally, the generic **congressional** ballot is **R+46**.
- Governor Mark **Gordon's image** stands at 50% favorable, 36% unfavorable.
- Machine-learning **Segmentation Analysis** identified three key voter segments: *High Propensity GOP* (44%), *Low Propensity GOP* (28%), and *Dem Base* (29%).
 - The Low Propensity GOP segment is younger (<45) than both the GOP Base and Dem Base.
 - They tend to be less informed about the candidates but lean heavily towards Republicans on the generic ballot and Trump on the presidential. *Low Propensity GOPs* overlap a lot with the *GOP Base* demographically, but the key will be making sure they actually turn out to vote.






Vote Method






Partisanship by Registration



Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Scott Morrow?









Methodology

This probabilistic survey was conducted October 26 - 28, 2024, in English, using registrationbased sampling (RBS) techniques. A total of 600 respondents registered to vote in the State of Wyoming participated via SMS-to-web and live phone interviews. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 3.95\%$ at the 95% confidence level.

Voter contact lists were sourced from Cygnal's proprietary voter file, which is regularly updated and maintained to reflect current voter registrations. The sample was stratified by geography (DMA groupings), registered political party, gender, and age to ensure representativeness. Each potential respondent was assigned a unique URL for survey entry through Qualtrics. Data quality protocols included checks for length of interview outliers, straightlining, duplicate IP addresses, and voter demographic consistency with the voter file.

The survey data were weighted to reflect the 2024 General Election Likely Voter population. Weighted variables include geography, gender, age, registered political party, race, and education. Population estimates for geography, gender, age, and political party were derived from Cygnal's proprietary voter file. Estimates for race and education were sourced from the 2022 American Community Survey and adjusted for a likely voter audience based on historical voting patterns and stated intent to vote.

Question wording on the toplines is consistent with the survey script and delivery in Qualtrics and by live interviewers. This survey was conducted internally by Cygnal's team and was not sponsored by any third party.
