# Survey of Likely 2026 General Election Voters National

December 9 – 11, 2024 | n=1500 | ±2.52%

- Trump's presence as President-elect is having a positive impact on down-ballot Republicans for 2026.
- On the 2026 generic ballot (48 45), the overall electorate compared to 2024 has net shifted in favor of a Republican for Congress by 3 points mostly driven by men (+8 net) and minority voters (+14 net).
- Compared to the 2024 generic ballot (47 46), a generic Republican has also improved with women under 55, women without college degrees, minority voters, and first-time voters.
- **First-time voters** from 2024 are the most **optimistic** of the direction of the country (+10 net right direction).
  - Democrats shifted 43% toward the country being headed in the wrong direction while Republicans shifted 33% toward the country being on the right track.
- Trump's image (48 fav, 51 unfav) is trending in a positive direction while the images of the Democratic Party's leaders, Harris (46 fav, 52 unfav) and Biden (41 fav, 57 unfav), continue to decline.
  - Trump: +3 net fav, Harris: -6 net fav, Biden: -4 net fav
  - Among young men (<55), Trump's image is 14 points more net favorable than it was at the
    end of October. Trump's image has also improved among Black voters (+13 net fav)
    and Hispanics (+18 net fav).</li>
- A plurality (46%) of voters believe Trump will be a better president than he was during his first term, with important voter groups like non-college women (48%)over indexing the topline.



- Women are more likely to believe he'll be worse, while men believe he'll be better.
- Voters didn't choose Harris because they liked her, but they did pick Trump because they like him.
  - 39% voted Trump to support Trump compared to 8% who voted for Trump to oppose
    Harris, while a massive 20% of Harris' voters only picked her because they didn't like
    Trump. Harris clearly failed to inspire voters.
  - This is especially true of independents (14% support Harris, 33% oppose Trump) who were
    more than twice as likely to vote for Harris to oppose Trump than to support her,
    suggesting these voters could be more persuadable in favor of Republicans without Trump
    on the ballot in 2026.
- When deciding who to vote for in the presidential election, 39% of voters rated economic issues and cultural issues as equally important, but among those who prioritized one or the other, economic issues were considered more important by 35% of voters compared to only 20% saying the same about cultural issues.
- The table below shows how key voter groups broke down:

- There's a clear partisan divide with voters who support a generic Democrat placing cultural issues (31%) over pocketbook issues (20%) and those supporting a generic Republican much more consolidated around economic concerns (50 – 11).
- Inflation & the economy (32%) is still the most important issue to voters which is even more
  obvious when looking at which issues they believe Trump should address first.
  - 40% say he needs to stop inflation and the rising cost of living
    - Another 15% say he should focus on cutting waste, fraud and abuse within the federal government.
  - Pluralities of the key voting groups believe Trump needs to tackle rising prices as the top priority in 2025: young men (43%), non-college women (43%), rural voters (36%), Black (43%), Hispanics (52%), and off-year voters (46%).
  - Dealing with inflation and the economy has grown in importance for younger voters while Social Security and Medicare has grown in even more importance for older voters.
- The Democrat Party's stances on a few issues like abortion, Social Security & Medicare, and threats to democracy made voters more likely to vote for their candidate in concept, but in practice voters aren't prioritizing these issues and it isn't moving them. However, the Republican Party leads on issues voters actually care about, especially persuadable swing voters: the economy (R+6), rising cost of living (R+13), and border security (R+24).
- Despite the Republican Party being viewed as the more extreme party now (45-41) compared to the end of October (41-44), nearly half (48%) of voters believe the Republican Party does a better job of representing their individual values, including a plurality of first-time voters (47%) and swing voters (43%).


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- While Independents are deadlocked at 38% on which party represents their values, they
  are 5 points more likely to say the Republican Party definitely better represents their values
  compared to the Democratic Party.
- Among voters who follow political news the most, 52% believe the Republican Party is more representative of their values.
- Almost half (49%) of voters would prefer the 2026 midterms to result in a divided government with at least one chamber of Congress controlled by Democrats. However, when we dive deeper and look at only mid-propensity voters (2 of 4 and 3 of 4), a plurality (48%) wants to see a unified Congress to support Trump's agenda.
- Trump's newly established Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) led by Elon Musk and Vivek Ramaswamy received overwhelming support from voters (60-29) with 41% saying they strongly support the creation of this new department and its goals.
  - Men of all stripes over index in support for DOGE and women overall are more nuanced but mostly supportive. Non-college women, the largest group at 30% of voters, are the most supportive among women at 61%.
  - Both those who are paying the most (61%) and least (64%) attention to political news are the most likely to be supportive, with those in the middle still supportive overall but less so.
- By a more than 2:1 margin, voters believe Elon Musk (47%) was the most effective surrogate for Trump, followed by Joe Rogan and RFK tied at 22%, while Harris's surrogates were substantially less effective with only Taylor Swift breaking 20%.
  - Younger men were the most likely to say Joe Rogan was the most effective surrogate.
- Most voters (56%) support efforts to carry out mass deportations 39% strongly support mass deportations, just shy of the total number that oppose them.

- Half of black voters, a large plurality (47%) of Hispanics, and a strong majority of union households (57%) – previously Democrat strongholds – support mass deportation efforts being proposed by Republicans.
- Only college-educated women and Democrats are more likely to oppose than support mass deportations—shocker.
- Voters who vote less often pay much less attention to the news, and women pay less attention to the news than men.
- Segmentation analysis identified three groups via machine learning: Moderates (17%),
   Democrat Base (39%), and GOP Base (44%).
  - The *Moderates* segment is the **youngest** group with two-thirds under 45, and nearly half (47%) are **parents**. They are the most likely to be **single** and the most likely to be currently **employed**. They are the most likely (32%) to be part of a **union household** and are the most likely to live in an **urban** community. They are the **least likely to hold a college degree** and this segment had the **largest share of first-time voters** (29%). This is the lowest-earning group with 42% earning less than \$50,000 annually and they are the **most racially diverse**. These voters are the most concentrated in the Midwest.




