 For most of Trump's proposed second-term agenda, the majority of voters aren't just on board – they're <u>fired up</u>, calling these priorities *extremely* or *very* important for the country's future. The table below highlights the broad support for Trump's agenda:

- Ending the wars in Ukraine and the Middle East ranks as the top Trump agenda item for Democrats (57% *extremely* or *very* important), with most Democrats believing Trump's efforts to reduce inflation, end taxes on Social Security payments, crack down on violent crime, and rebuild our cities are *extremely* or *very* important to address during his second term.
- Even a majority of independents and swing voters believe the Trump policies in the table above are extremely or very important, including 49% who feel the same about expanding domestic energy production.
- Democrat's energy policies, on the other hand, have run out of charge with voters. Almost half (46%) support proposals in Congress to expand domestic energy production, including rolling back parts of President Biden's Inflation Reduction Act.

- A near plurality (31%) *strongly* support Congress's efforts to mandate lease sales, open federal lands for drilling, and dispose of Biden's failed energy policies.
- The government's budget is bloated, and voters aren't willing to fund its debt anymore. Only 15% believe the debt ceiling should be raised without condition, while nearly three-quarters support slashing spending to address the national debt.
- Voters view Republicans in Congress (45 fav, 50 unfav) virtually the same as they did in December while Democrats (43 fav, 52 unfav) experienced a two-point drop in net favorability, mainly driven by 0 of 4 voters (-24 net fav), college-educated women (-14 net fav), women over 55 (-10 net fav), and Hispanic voters (-12 net fav).
- Union members (-16 net), voters aged 30-54 (-13 net), and minority voters (-19 net) are down from their December highs and have narrowed the generic ballot for congressional Republicans from 48 - 45 to 47 - 45.
 - While swing voters are 5 points more undecided on the generic ballot than they were in December, their image of Republicans in Congress (41 fav) is 4 points more favorable than Democrats (37 fav), a key signal of momentum for competitive races.
- Inflation and the economy are still top-of-mind for voters by an 8-point margin, but it continues a trend downward as **Democrats under age 55** (-12 inflation) have shifted their concerns since December to other priorities like healthcare (+9) and threats to democracy (+6).
- A majority of voters think the impact of inflation will get better or stay about the same in 2025, but a plurality (40%) believe it will get worse, mainly driven by liberals (75%) and moderates (43%).
 - Even a plurality of swing voters (39%) is expecting inflation to worsen, making inflation a vital messaging component for Republicans to focus on heading into 2026.


- There's a stark contrast between men and women on the future of inflation with men 8 points more likely to believe the cost of living will get better or stay about the same compared to women who are more fearful about rising prices.
- Most voters support Congress maintaining the status quo on both Trump's Tax Cuts (32% permanent, 27% extend some) and Biden's Affordable Care Act expansion (40% make permanent, 15% extend some), although allowing Biden's ACA expansion to expire (38%) is 10 points more popular than eliminating the Trump Tax Cuts (28%).
 - Nearly a third (31%) of Democrats believe at least some of Trump's Tax Cuts should be extended, compared to only 24% of Republicans who support keeping Biden's ACA expansion at least somewhat intact.
- In Republican primaries, <u>Trump is the kingmaker</u>. More than a quarter (26%) of GOP primary voters would *definitely* vote for a Trump endorsed candidate, 44% would more strongly consider voting for Trump's pick.
 - Notably, urban Republican primary voters are 14 points more likely than suburban or rural voters to *definitely* vote for a Trump endorsed candidate – a testament to major cities failing under liberal policies.
 - Among Republican primary voters who self-identify as very conservative (48% of GOP primary voters), 38% would definitely vote for Trump's endorsed candidate with another 43% ready to more strongly consider his choice.
- Traditionally less engaged with political news, **women under 55 and swing voters have shown a notable surge in interest**. Younger women are now 8 points more likely to follow political news 'a great deal', while swing voters have increased by 6 points. Although, more than a third of both groups are still only paying a moderate amount of attention.



- Segmentation analysis identified three groups via machine learning: GOP Base (37%), Dem Base (36%), and Moderates (28%).
 - The *Moderates* segment is the **youngest** with 52% under age 45. They are the most likely to live in an **urban** community, and least likely to live in a suburban community. They are both the most likely to be **parents** and most likely to be **single**. These are **working-class** voters with the highest rate of employment (61%) of any segment, while simultaneously **earning the least** with 42% earning less than \$50,000 annually and being the least likely to hold a degree. They are **uber concerned about inflation and the economy** (43%) with no other priority within 30 points. These voters are the least determined to participate in the 2026 general election and 49% would rather see a divided government than a unified congress under Trump.




Top Priority

Trend: Top Priority





How do you plan to vote in the November 2026 general election for U.S. Congress and state offices?








Partisanship by Response
















Generic Ballot Movement














Which of the following results of the November 2026 general elections would you prefer?








