Survey of Likely 2026 General Election Voters National

October 7 – 8, 2025 | n=1500 | ±2.51%

- The story of this month's National Voter Trend story is that voters are fed up with 'politics as usual'. They are desperate to return to simpler, less controversial times, regardless of party.
 - +10 net increase in "wrong track" sentiment on the direction of the country mostly driven by voters over 55 (-6 net RD/WT) and center-left non-college men (-19 net among moderates, -12 among liberals).
- The generic ballot held steady at D+3. However, there was a lot of movement under the hood. College-educated voters moved toward Republicans as non-college voters went the Democrats' way.
- All major figures from both sides saw their images dip slightly: Trump (-4 net fav since last month; +1 net fav since May '24), Mike Johnson (-1 net fav since May '24), Jefferies (-9 net fav since May '24).
- 71% of voters think public discourse in the U.S. is worse off than it was several years ago.
 - Despite the recent attacks on conservatives across the country, Republican voters are 3x more likely than Independents and 8x more likely than Democrats to say discourse is better off than several years ago.
- 76% say politics has gotten more confrontational and they wish it would return to being more civil, including more than two-thirds of Republicans, Independents, and Democrats.
 - Voters under 30 (34%), who have only known the current political environment, are nearly 3x as likely as older voters (12%) to accept the current tone and style of politics today as necessary or preferable.
- Voters across the political spectrum say they would rather time travel to the past (52%) than the future (30%).

- Even voters who view the country as headed in the **right direction over-index in preference for past time travel** (+36 net past) with 39% saying *definitely* the past.
- Black voters are the only major demographic group to prefer time traveling to the future, although only by a 9-point margin.
- Voters don't see an off-ramp from the conflict and violence either. They (57%) believe political violence will continue to escalate
 - Democrats, who as a political party have been embroiled by political violence scandals in the second half of 2025, are the least likely to see a peaceful path forward. Only 29% of Democrats see an off-ramp compared to Republicans who, for once, are more idealistic (40% off-ramp).
 - It's interesting, because 42% of liberals responded that it's acceptable to "go beyond peaceful protests" in response to ICE raids... "even if those actions break the law."
- Less than a quarter of all Americans say that it would be acceptable to break the law in response to ICE raids. But looking at the breakdown among Democratic responses explains so much about the current dynamics in the party:
 - Young Democrats 18-44 are +15 on breaking the law to oppose ICE, while Democrats older than 45 are -42, again showing how extremely frustrated young Democrats are with their party leadership.
- We asked who voters thought made it easier, harder, or had no impact on people's ability to freely express their views. Two-thirds blame political leaders and elected officials. The news media and journalists get blamed by 57% of voters for making freedom of expression harder.




- An astonishing 41% of voters think college and universities are teaching students that violence is a justifiable response to political disagreements.
- "Threats to democracy" is now the top priority in voters' minds and, by a nearly 2:1 margin, voters say the current government shutdown is being used as a strategic tool, further signaling broader trust issues.
 - This is the first time this decade the top issue has not been "inflation and the economy" or "immigration and the border"
- 74% of voters support banning synthetic food dyes, increasing transparency around vaccine safety, removing untested chemicals from food products, etc, a major component of the MAHA agenda.
- 87% of voters have some level of concern about the availability of good jobs for Americans in the next 5 years as a result of the rise in AI.
 - Nearly half are extremely or very concerned.
 - Strong partisan divide here with Democrats nearly twice as extremely concerned as Republicans – independents evenly distributed and swing voters looking more like Republicans – concern is not very intense.
- A plurality of voters (44%) think companies are exploiting the H-1B visa program
 - Wealthy elites (\$200K+) are the most likely to say H-1B visas are essential for competitiveness (52%; +20 net essential), while working-class Americans (<\$75K) believe companies are exploiting the H-1B visa program (45%; +9 net exploit)
- Voters support Trump's executive order increasing the fee for H-1B visas by a slim 3-point margin, but swing voters over-index the topline in their support by +9 net.

- Working class voters support Trump's order by +5 net over the topline, while elites oppose by a +7-point margin.
- When presented with a tradeoff on the impact of tariffs to protect jobs but higher prices vs. free trade to lower prices but cost some jobs, lower prices are preferred (34%) even if some jobs are affected among those who think about trade policy frequently (34%). The plurality (44%) say both are equally important.
- NFL viewership breaks down evenly into a third of voters following the season this year closely, a third casually, and a third not at all.
 - Voters who pay the most attention to political news (a great deal or a lot), over-index the topline by 5-points in closely following the NFL season this year.
- The plurality (44%) of voters selecting the **Republican** on the congressional generic question get their news from **cable**. Voters for the generic **Democrat** plurality (45%) get their news from **national TV**. Those **undecided** on the generic ballots are **split** in news consumption across cable (30%), national TV (30%), local TV (29%), and YouTube (26%).
 - For most voters under the age of 30, YouTube is the dominant news source (52% for GOP <30, 51% for Independents <30, but only 35% for Democrats <30).





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




Trend: Top Priority (At Least 10%)






Percent Change: Top Priority (Sep '25 to Oct '25)







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

Trend: Vote Method











Generic Ballot Movement

Generic Ballot by Key Voter Groups



The H-1B visa is a type of work visa that allows U.S. companies to hire highly skilled foreign workers for jobs that typically require specialized knowledge — especially in fields like technology, engineering, finance, and healthcare. Some say the H-1B visa program is often used by companies to replace American workers with lower-paid employees from overseas.
