

Survey of Likely 2026 General Election Voters National

November 5 – 6, 2025 | n=1500 | ±2.51%

- Inflation and the economy surged as the top concern, jumping six points since last month (17 → 23), while threats to democracy fell sharply (-7 points, 21 → 14). Healthcare rose to the second highest issue at 14% a near doubling since September.
 - The change is driven by men under 55, non-college women, independents, and Democrats.
 - As a sign of the times, voters by a 7-point margin say they'll spend less on Thanksgiving dinner this year, though 43% expect to spend about the same.
- The national mood has soured. Net sentiment has dropped 19 points since June, as voters say America's best days are behind it by an 8-point margin.
 - The decline in the country's direction is driven by **men** (-10 net), **urban voters** (-16 net), and **non-college women** (-23 net). These are also the main groups who shifted away from Republicans in this poll.
 - Republicans (+14 net best days ahead) and Trump voters (48%) remain optimistic, but key Trump coalition groups men under 55 (-11 net), non-college voters (-9 net), and working-class voters (<\$75k, -8 net) are less hopeful.
- Democrats now lead by six points (D+6) on the generic congressional ballot, marking the
 largest single-month shift toward Democrats since Biden dropped out of the presidential race
 and away from Republicans in our data. This poll is a warning sign for Republicans heading
 into 2026 and demands a recalibration of messaging.
 - For the first time in two years, voters whose top priority is **inflation and the economy** now prefer a generic Democrat for Congress (D+13) over a Republican.
 - Urban voters (-21 net) and mid-frequency voters (-20 net) are key drivers of the shift.



- Additional movement against the GOP comes from key groups: college-educated men (-9 net), men over 55 (-6 net), non-college women (-10 net), and parents (-14 net).
- Bright spot: college-educated women have trended slightly toward Republicans (+7 net), with 46% saying the Democratic Party is on the wrong track.
- **Hispanic voters** participating in the midterm who voted in 2024 gave Trump 40% of their vote (D+13 overall). Today, they are **D+18 on the generic ballot**, signaling a drop for the GOP but not a complete bottoming out.
- Only 79% of Trump 2024 voters who screened in say they plan to vote in 2026, signaling turnout erosion with critical base GOP voters.
 - Nearly 12% will only vote for strong Trump-endorsed candidates, and the remainder feel less motivated without Trump running, or don't plan to vote because Trump is "the only one fighting for them."
- Since May, Trump's favorability has dropped 10 points (from -4 net to -14 net), and Republicans in Congress are down 13 net points.
 - The dip is driven by the same groups mentioned earlier: men, urban voters, and non-college women. Messaging that resonates with these voters on economic and cultural issues is essential.
- Democrats in Congress remain relatively stable in their image (-1 net since May), while
 Mamdani is known by 75% of voters but underwater nationally (-5 net).
 - When Mamdani's policies are presented to voters, 55% of voters believe Democrats are becoming more radical. This presents an opening for Republicans so long as they explain his beliefs and do not just attack him personally.



- Non-college women are least likely to know who he is and one of the most important groups for Republicans to bring back on the team.
- His image is still malleable only 5% somewhat unfavorable vs. 15% somewhat favorable. Republicans have room to define him through his policies.
- Americans don't see socialism in a super negative light. 39% define socialism as universal access to services, while only 37% see it as overbearing government control. 16% say it's a system where the means of production are publicly controlled for the social welfare and equal distribution. Combining the two left-leaning definitions puts it at 55%.
 - However, swing voters lean toward the conservative definition (+4 net) and over-index in saying America needs less socialism (+8 net). Mamdani's election amplifies this narrative (+6 net more radical among swing voters than the topline) and he is 13 points underwater with this group.
 - At the same time, 45% of Americans believe the country needs to embrace socialism less.
 The 38% who believe it should be embraced more are women under the age of 55 (45% more), Democrats (58% more), liberals (70% more), and Black voters (41% more).
 - This is a prime messaging lane for Republicans to frame Democrats as out-of-touch with mainstream American values.
- Despite Republicans holding the high ground with voters on their stance on key political issues over Democrats, 42% of voters believe Republicans are focusing on the right things compared to 45% believing Democrats are focused on the right things.
 - R+12 association on preserving traditional American values and culture
 - R+25 association on upholding law, order, and strong national borders
 - R+6 association on promoting civic responsibility and national pride



- D+6 association on defending free speech and open debate
- D+9 association on ensuring fairness and equal treatment under the law
- D+66 association on supporting government social and welfare programs
- And the one Republicans needs to work on the most: D+10 on fighting for the working class
- Half of voters cite federal income and property taxes as their biggest burden double any other tax.
 - Voters over 55, who are more likely to own property or be retired, prioritize property taxes (+9), while younger voters focus on federal income taxes (+12).
- Trump's recent IVF actions are popular: 60% say they were meaningful steps or that more can be done; only 24% oppose government involvement.
 - Harris '24 voters are 11 points more likely than Trump voters to say the government shouldn't be promoting IVF – reaffirming that Republicans are the party of families.
- Republicans have more internal confidence than Democrats. 89% of GOP voters say the Republican Party is headed in the right direction vs. 78% of Democrats who say the same about their own party an 11-point gap.
 - Swing voters are 8 points more likely to say Democrats focus on the wrong issues and view Democrats as on the wrong track by 39 net points over Republicans.
- 55% say illegal immigration still needs significant attention; two-thirds of GOP and swing voters agree.
 - 57% of liberals believe illegal immigration and border security were not major concerns.




- 26% of Republicans believe the issue has been resolved, while 65% of swing voters believe the issue still needs significant attention and improvement.
- Republicans should continue emphasizing border security and enforcement, especially as it relates to driving down costs and increasing affordability as fewer people compete for housing, groceries, and other everyday expenses.
- 50% credit Trump for progress made, reinforcing his leadership on this issue.
- Support for deportation remains strong (+24 margin), especially among swing voters (+11 net over topline).
- However, aggressive ICE raids split voters (48–49).
- Voters are divided on Trump's status as a peacemaker: 47% say Trump has done more than any other President or earned the "Peace President" title vs. 48% who disagree—driven mostly by liberals.
 - This also drives the narrative from voters that they want to see more domestic focus.
 - Voters who spend 5+ hours each day online or on TV watching videos are 12 net points more likely to say he is not a peaceful president than those spending <5 hours.
- By a 30-point margin, voters do not trust political campaigns that use Al tools in ads or strategy (60% no trust at all), and 54% see it as a serious threat to elections.
 - Voters fear manipulation and loss of authenticity—two factors that can erode confidence in candidates and organizations. This is a major credibility risk if campaigns lean too heavily or obviously on AI.
- 44% of voters spend 3+ hours daily watching videos; YouTube needs to be a staple
 platform for Republican outreach in 2026.

- **Men** (26%) and **non-college voters** (25%) rely more heavily on YouTube for news than their cohorts.
- 62% of YouTube news consumers watch 3+ hours daily, with 31% exceeding five hours.
- Advanced segmentation analysis identified four groups via machine learning: Old GOP (34%), Lean Dem (19%), Young GOP (16%) and Democratic Base (31%).
 - The **Young GOP** segment tends to lean **female** (53%) and is the **youngest** group with 55% under 45. They are more likely than *Democratic Base* to live in **urban** communities. They are more likely than the *GOP Base* or *Democratic Base* to be **employed** and are **less educated** than both groups. They are the **lowest propensity** voters and the most likely to **consume 3 or more hours** of videos every day. A plurality say **YouTube** (33%) is a primary source of news.








Trend: Top Priority





Trend: Top Priority (At Least 10%)






Percent Change: Top Priority (Oct '25 to Nov '25)






Trend: Vote Method







Percent Change: Vote Method (Oct '25 to Nov '25)










Trend: Country Direction






Percent Change: Country Direction (Oct '25 to Nov '25)










Trend: Generic Ballot






Generic Ballot Movement






Percent Change: Generic Ballot (Oct '25 to Nov '25)







Generic Ballot by Key Voter Groups

Percent Change: Generic Ballot to Contrast Ballot






Trend: Deportation Opinion






Percent Change: Deportation Opinion (Oct '25 to Nov '25)










Percent Change: News Attention (Oct '25 to Nov '25)




