# Insights & Analysis

## • The Electoral Landscape

- **Democrats lead the generic (49–45)**. This marks their best result since Nov, but shy of the 6-point lead then. The GOP also had their best month in ballot share (45%) since Oct.
  - Swing voters moved from R+12 to R+1, driven by a smaller swing electorate and increased intensity sorting; Feb swing voters chose sides and went left over the month.
    - Republicans hardened existing support. *Definitely Republican* intent rose across nearly every subgroup, while Democratic intensity showed mixed movement: gains among **college women (+5)** and voters over 55 (+5), with declines among **non-college men (-8), urban voters (-9), Blacks (-5), and Hispanics (-7)**.
  - **18-29 year olds** break (64–31) Democratic on the generic ballot, but they view Democrats net-unfavorably by a 4-point margin. They are **voting Democratic while being deeply pessimistic about the direction either party has produced**.
  - **Non-college men break** 57% GOP / 38% Dem (+5 net since Feb '26). College women are the mirror image at 60% Dem / 35% GOP (-4 net).
  - Democrats did particularly well with **suburban women**, who swung D+12 from February.
  - The biggest shifts toward Republicans are being driven by **non-college men, men under 55** and two traditionally Democratic-leaning groups: **Hispanic voters (+6 net)** and **urban voters (+7 net)**.
  - Among **Independent** voters, a group that shifted **+5 net overall toward a generic Republican**, it's mostly **men under 55** and **college-educated men**.

# Insights & Analysis

- 93% of Democrats say wrong track vs. 84% of Republicans who say right direction. **Independents are +9 net more positive on the direction of the country** than last month.
- **Issue Priorities**
  - Inflation and threats to democracy are tied as the top priority (19% each).
  - Immigration surged 3 points since January, now the third-highest priority nationally.
  - **Young voters prioritize healthcare at 18%** — tied with the economy.
    - That is a dramatically different issue profile than older voters (-7 on healthcare comparatively) and signals that healthcare, not border security, is an issue that can reach the rising generation.
- **Party Messaging & Trust**
  - **Republicans hold a clear advantage on vision.** Only 11% of voters say Democrats have a clear, compelling vision for the country, (**27% for Republicans**).
    - Independents: 6% of say Democrats have a clear vision; 17% who say Republicans do.
    - Independents who say Democrats are out-of-touch or mostly focused on opposing Trump (17% of the electorate) break Republican 48-35, despite being unfavorable of Trump (-6); a critical persuasion opportunity re: Democratic vision/leadership failures.
  - **Neither party has a strong trust advantage.** 44% of voters don't trust Republicans in Congress at all to address issues facing Americans. For Democrats, it's 41%.

# Insights & Analysis

- **Republicans (12%) edge out by a 4-point margin in “a ton” of trust among perfect voters** who have voted in 4 of the last 4 general elections vs. Democrats (8%).
- Voters view **news media outlets and journalists playing more of a gatekeeper role** (selectively choosing what information gets shared) **instead of watchdog role** (investigating and calling out misconduct) by a 26-point margin (57-31).
  - **Republicans under age 30 push that to 83%** — the highest of any subgroup.
  - Still, nearly 4-in-10 Democrats see media acting as a gatekeeper.
- **Violence Against Government – Part 2**
  - Voters continue **reject the idea** that it’s okay to **go beyond peaceful protest in response to raids conducted by ICE** by a 44-point margin.
    - **Young, liberal women** continue to be the group of violence: 60% agree it’s acceptable.
- **DOGE & Spending**
  - DOGE’s efforts to cut spending have **71% support overall** — including **Democrats** supporting it by +9 net, and +44 net among independents.
    - Even **moderates strongly support DOGE cuts by a 46-point margin.**
  - When voters learn **Democrats voted against spending cuts**, the *generic ballot narrows* to a tie (46-46) after a net 4-point boost for the Republican.
    - **Among moderates, the ballot moves +6 net points** towards the generic Republican. **+9 net shift among swing voters** – nearly negating the 11-point shift toward Dems on the generic ballot from February to March.

# Insights & Analysis

- **SAVE Act**

- **Americans broadly support the *SAVE Act*** by a 20-point margin (58 – 38).
  - Support is strong among Independents (+15). Even among Democrats, 24% support the common-sense legislation, making opposition narrower than on most issues.
  - **Hispanic voters are +9 net in support of the *SAVE Act***, cutting directly against the Democratic assumption that Hispanic voters oppose election integrity measures.

- **The Bipartisan Populist Surge Against Corporate America**

- **Only 20% of voters have some trust in corporations to act in the best interest of Americans.**
  - **Republicans are the “most” trusting group** in the survey at 31%.
  - **Rural voters**, despite their Republican lean, trust corporations at just 15%.
  - The “not at all” **intensity is most concentrated among younger voters**: 18–29-year-olds at 63. Older voters are nearly as distrustful in total (78%).
  - **51% of high-income voters (\$200k+) have no trust in corporations**, which should unsettle any company who assumes affluence correlates with goodwill.
- **Corporate profit-motive skepticism** has no meaningful floor anywhere in the electorate. **86% say corporations are looking out for their own profits** while just 10% say because it’s good for the country.
  - The range across all subgroups is roughly 79% to 94%.
  - 80% of Republicans say that corporations look out for their own profits.

## Insights & Analysis

- These are the voters, and legislators, corporations typically count as allies, and even they don't trust corporate stated motives.
- 89% believe **health insurers deny legitimate medical claims** to boost profits.
  - **Younger college-educated voters** are the most intense subgroup on this question: 94% yes. The **wealthiest voters** are +4 more “yes” than lower-income voters.
- 81% say **pharmaceutical companies price drugs to maximize shareholder returns**, not fund research. Just 14% think high prices are used to fund research or develop new medicine.
  - Affluent voters have a **harsher verdict on pharma than lower-income voters**.
  - Companies pitching pharma on "our customers trust us" have the wrong theory of who their customers are and what they believe.
- Voters **support federal caps on credit card interest rates** by a 69-point margin. This is the single **most broadly popular policy** in the entire survey.
  - **Women are the core of this coalition**.
  - **Married women support credit card rate caps at 86%** — the highest of any gender-marital subgroup, and 7 points above married men (79%). Married women are also **among the most contested voters in the electorate** (R+4 on the generic ballot).
- 82% of voters are **uncomfortable with tech companies collecting their personal data**.
- **College women are 7 points more uncomfortable with tech data collection** than college men (87% vs. 80%) and **6 points more likely to distrust corporations** generally.

## Insights & Analysis

- **57% say regulations are necessary to protect consumers and workers**; 34% say they create unnecessary burdens that raise prices and slow the economy.
  - The business community has spent decades **arguing regulations hurt growth**.
- **68% say energy companies are taking advantage of consumers** to increase profits.
  - Republicans say gouging at 62% vs. Democrats at 73%.
- But on health insurance denials (93% women vs. 90% men) and pharma prices (tied 83%), the gap disappears. It is **concentrated in tech, finance, and energy, not healthcare**.
  - For companies in those sectors, college-educated women are the demographic most actively driving the trust deficit.
- **Rural voters distrust corporations at 83%**, 9 points higher than urban voters, despite being the most Republican-leaning geographic segment. Rural voters are simultaneously the most likely to back GOP candidates, support DOGE, and distrust large corporations.
  - Companies representing industries with rural footprints need to understand that their **political friendliness in rural areas has not translated into consumer trust**.
- **Middle-income voters** (\$50k-\$125k) – the broadest income band, representing the **core of the consumer economy** – register 87% on corporate profit motives, 89% on health insurer denials, 81% on pharma, 84% on credit card rate cap support, and 83% on tech data discomfort.
- **The American Dream**
  - Voters now say the **American Dream** is still alive by a 6-point margin **51–45. That's a +14 net positive swing** since August, driven by Republicans, Hispanics, and women 55+.

# Insights & Analysis

- **Independents** who consider themselves **moderate or conservative** are **+23 net points** more likely to view the Dream as alive vs. +1 among liberal Independents.
- **Hispanic voters overall shifted +29 net more** likely to view the American Dream as alive than they were in August 2025.
- Voters who heard Trump's 2026 State of the Union Address believe the Dream is alive by a 12-point margin – 2x the topline margin.
- **Financial Struggles**
  - 36% of voters say they are **just getting by or struggling to make ends meet** + a 40% plurality who say they're doing okay but **having to be careful**. Just a quarter of voters say they are living comfortably.
    - **Non-college women are the most financially distressed** gender-education group: Nearly half (46%) are just getting by or struggling to make ends meet.
    - This is a group that also shifted -4 net against the GOP on the generic ballot — making them a genuine persuasion target on economic messaging.
    - 48% of those who do not believe the American Dream is alive are just getting by or struggling to make ends meet.
  - **Voters say if they got an extra \$1,000, they'd use it to cover something they were already planning**, proving psychology that people take much more action to protect against loss than seek out potential future gain.
- **AI & Technology**
  - Voters are pessimistic about what AI's impact on society but believe the U.S. must lead.

# Insights & Analysis

- They want to win the race even if they're worried about the destination. A majority of Americans (55%) believe **AI** will have a net *negative impact* on society, while 67% say U.S. leadership in AI development is important.
- **AI pessimism is greatest among younger voters and college women.**
  - The **most pessimistic age group on AI is those aged 18-29** (-42 net) – the generation most exposed to the technology and skeptical of its consequences.
- **America's History & Place in the World**
  - Voters overall view the **U.S. as a force for good by a 17-point margin.**
    - Only 33% of Black voters and 37% of 18–29-year-olds say the U.S. is a force for good in the world, compared to 61% of White voters and 60% of older voters.
  - However, voters believe there is **much for Americans to celebrate**, after 250 years as a nation, by a nearly 2:1 margin (63 – 35).
    - Americans who believe the nation has much to celebrate are bullish about the future. Among the 35% who say America does *not* have much to celebrate, **94% say the country is on the wrong track.**
    - Voters who are grinding in the workforce are **14 points less likely to see something to celebrate vs. those who don't work** (but reap the benefits of those who do).
- **Iran & Foreign Policy**
  - **50% support U.S. military strikes against Iran** (44% opposed) and are **uncertain but open about its future.**
    - Republicans overwhelmingly support strikes (87%). Even 15% of Democrats support the strikes, a higher number than the 9% of Republicans who oppose.


## Insights & Analysis

- 89% of Democratic **women under 45** oppose the strikes, but Independent women of the same age support them by a 9-point margin, with swing voters over-indexing by +7 net.
- Only 49% are **extremely or very concerned about Iran developing a nuclear weapon**, with 22% not concerned at all.
- 42% say **Iran's best days are ahead of it**, but it's a softly held opinion with 31% uncertain.
- 57% of American voters are extremely or very confident in the readiness and strength of the U.S. military.
- Voters are **confused on Cuba**; only 37% see it as an enemy and 9% as an ally.
  - **Hispanic voters view it more as an enemy by a mere 24 points.**
- **State of the Union Viewership & Impact**
  - **How voters encountered the speech drove reactions.** Those who **encountered it directly**, watching live (40%), viewed it **net-positively by a 14-point margin**.
    - By contrast, voters who saw, read, or heard (SRH'd) about the speech *secondhand*—through news coverage or commentary (35% news, 22% discussion, 22% print/online)—were much more *negative* (55% negative vs. just 23% positive).
    - The lopsided negative reaction is both a **reflection of how the media filters Trump and of how viewers chose to engage the SOTU**: Republicans were more likely to engage directly with the speech, while Democrats were more likely to consume commentary – reinforcing pre-existing partisan beliefs rather than changing minds .

## Insights & Analysis

- Among those who **SRH'd the SOTU at all**, the generic ballot sits at 48-48 tie with 5% undecided. Those who weren't exposed are D+34, proving self-selection.
- Just **34% of voters under 55 say they watched it live** and another 12% say they didn't watch it at all, while **half of older voters** say they watched it live.
- Voters who get their political news mainly on broadcast TV viewed the speech net-negatively by a 32-point margin, but **cable TV viewers were split** (39 – 39).
  - Voters relying on **Facebook, podcasts, talk radio, or YouTube** – mediums Trump owned during the 2024 presidential campaign – viewed the speech **net-negatively by a 5-point margin**. These voters **self-identify 11 points more Republican than Democrat**, suggesting these mediums **need more direct engagement from the President**. It's time for Trump to get back on the podcast circuit.





# Trend: Top Priority




# Trend: Top Priority (At Least 10%)



How do you plan to vote in the November general election for U.S. Congress and state offices?


















Which of the following best describes the Republican Party's message today?



# Percent Change: Democratic to Republican Party Message






































# Religious Service Attendance
